# **Sacrificing Naveen**

The truth seems to be finally out. On the fag-end of the ongoing elections, Prime Minister Narendra Modi obliquely admitted that his camaraderie with Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik didn't fructify into an alliance between the BJP and BJD due to electoral compulsions. He however, sought to mask it by saying it was a 'sacrifice' aimed at the 'welfare of Odisha'. He was quick to add that in politics, relations between leaders should be good. Needless to say 'everything is fair in love and war', and politics is no exception

New Delhi, May 28: Prime Minister Narendra Modi Tuesday said he decided to 'sacrifice' his good relations with Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik for 'the welfare of Odisha'.

He said this during an interview with news agency ANI while responding to a question over the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) decision to not ally with the Biju Janata Dal (BJD) - despite him sharing a good relationship with Patnaik - for the simultaneous Lok Sabha and



As the Lok Sabha elections enter its final phase, the PM is confident of his party returning to power at the Centre, and forming a government in Odisha. He however, said in politics, relations between leaders should be good. "We have good relations with

the leaders of all the political parties of India, and in a democracy, we do not have enmity. Now the question is whether I should maintain my relations or worry about the fate of Odisha. I chose to devote myself to the bright future of Odisha and if I have to sacrifice my relations for that, I will sacrifice them and after the elections, I will convince everyone that I have no enmity with anyone," he said. The PM went on to add that

after the elections, he will convince everyone that he harbours no enmity with anyone.

Modi also sought to launch a scathing attack on the Naveenled state government by saying that a coterie has taken over the entire system in Odisha which has come on the way of

the state's growth. Modi also invoked the Odia Ashmita (self pride) issue and said, "It is a question of the authenticity of Odisha. Odisha has so many natural resources. It is sad to see the poor people of such a prosperous state. Odisha is among the prosperous states of India. It is bestowed with such natural resources, but it is also in the list of states with many poor people. The government is responsible for this. That is why the people of Odisha should get their rights. Odisha should get its identity," he added.

Patnaik, who has been in power as the chief minister since 2000, is seeking a record sixth term in simultaneous state elections. He claimed that a BJP Chief

Minister will take oath in Odisha June 10.

"Naveen babu has failed to usher in change in the state, and he is responsible for the prevailing poverty here," Shah said, adding, the last 25 years of BJD rule were "lost years" for Odisha.

The Home Minister said the BJP will ensure that the next CM is fluent in Odia, and understands the state's language, culture and tradition.

"Should a 'Tamil babu' run the government from behind the scene... By casting your vote in favour of the lotus symbol, bring a 'jan sevak' to rule the state in place of an officer," he said, in an apparent reference to Patnaik's close aide and BJD leader VK Pandian.

Stating that lakhs of youths were migrating to other states in search of work, Shah said, "Once the BJP forms government in Odisha, we will set up industries so that youths don't have to look for jobs elsewhere." He also hailed Prime Minister Narendra Modi for providing free 5kg of rice to the people of Odisha, and criticised Patnaik for distributing the rice in jute bags with his photographs.

They said the same in Himachal Pradesh and also failed."

"I am certain that their same reputation will continue in this elections in Odisha," Patnaik, a five-time chief minister of Odisha said.

Earlier. Shah at three back-to-back election rallies had claimed that Patnaik would become a former Chief Minister after counting of votes, June 4, and the BJP is all set to form the government in Odisha by securing more than 75 of the 147 seats in the state. Shah also claimed that the saffron party candidates will win in 17 of the state's 21 Lok Sabha seats.

Stating that senior BJP leaders such as chief ministers and cabinet ministers are visiting Odisha as guests, Patnaik said, "We expect them not to use poor language and make false allegations. This is not appreciated by the people of our state."

Patnaik also said that he prays to Lord Jagannath that better sense prevails with BJP leaders.

It is worth mentioning that the exchange of barbs between top leaders of BJD and BJP has become more caustic with the elections coming to a close. Earlier this month, PM Modi had dared Naveen to name Odisha's districts and their respective 'capitals' without reading them from papers.

Naveen took no time to respond with equal vigour by saying that the PM had 'actually forgotten' Odisha over the years.

#### **Defamation: Spat over** summons to Atishi

New Delhi: A war of words erupted between AAP and BJP Tuesday after a city court summoned Delhi minister Atishi in a defamation case May 29 over her poaching charge against the saffron party. with Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Keiriwal alleging there was a plan to arrest her. The BJP hit back at Kejriwal and Atishi, claiming their "lies" will be exposed in the court. A defiant Atishi said in a press conference that "Operation Lotus' was a well-known tactic of the BJP and questioned how the party managed to form governments in many states without having a majority. The Rouse Avenue court earlier in the day summoned Atishi Wednesday in connection with the criminal defamation case filed by Delhi BJP leader Praveen Shankar Kapoor, However, it refused to summon the Delhi chief minister in the matter.

# Mexico's famed mummy's arm comes off

Mexico City, May 28: Mexico's federal archaeology agency has accused the conservative-governed city of Guanajuato of mistreating one of the country's famous mummified 19th century bodies. The National Institute of Anthropology and History (INAH) said that during recent renovations at the museum where the mummified bodies are on permanent display, the arm of one of the mummies, well, came off. One might think the complaint

is all about the dignified treatment of corpses buried around the early 1800s and dug up start-

ing in the 1860s, because their families could no longer pay burial fees

But in fact, the mummies have been on a somewhat grisly display in glass cases in a museum in Guanajuato, the capital of the state of the same name, and toted around to tourism fairs for decades. Some were exhibited in the United States in 2009.

What appears to be at the root of the latest dispute is a turf battle between the INAH, which believes it has jurisdiction over the mummies because it says they are "national patrimony," and Guanajuato, which considers them a tourist attraction. The state and



city are governed by the conservative National Action Party, which the Morena party – which holds power at the federal level – considers its arch enemy. On Monday, the institute said it would demand an accounting of what permits and procedures were followed during the museum renovations.

'These events confirm that the way the museum's collection was moved is not the correct one, and that far from applying proper corrective and conservation strategies, the actions carried out resulted in damages, not only to this body," the institute wrote in a statement.

It did not say what, if any, other bits of mummies had fallen off.

"It appears that this situation is related to a lack of knowledge about proper protocols and the lack of training of the personnel in charge of carrying out these tasks," it continued.



# **City AIIMS lacks fire safety cert**

Bhubaneswar, May 28: Even as inadequate fire escape infra and lapsed safety compliance certificate are said to be among the reasons behind the death of seven newborns in a tragic hospital fire in Vivek Vihar area of New Delhi Saturday, Odisha's premier healthcare facility, AIIMS-Bhubaneswar is learnt to have been functioning for nearly a decade now without a fire safety compliance certificate.

A top source in the Fire Services department told Orissa POST that authorities at the 978bed super specialty hospital have been briefed about the same and asked to introduce adequate fire safety measures at the earliest so as to avoid any kind of mishap.

The disclosures assume special significance in view of the fact that the hospital is visited by thousands of patients and their relatives not only from Odisha but also from neighbouring states every day, and any kind of fire mishap would mean high number of injuries and casualties. The City has already witnessed

a devastating hospital fire in added. 2016 where around two dozen people had died and over 120 injured in what came as a wakeup call for healthcare facilities to look into the critical aspect of safety of patients, other than providing care and treatment. ful soon."

Most of the super specialty private hospitals in the City have become fire safety compliant in the aftermath of the 2016 fire, sources added. However, compliance in case

of medium and small clinical establishments in the state remain unclear, they said.

Asked about the same, Sarangi said, the Fire Services department has already identified the safety at clinical establishments as its top priority area and launched an audit of all such places a fortnight back (much before the Delhi fire, or Rajkot gaming zone fire cases).

"The audit is being conducted across Odisha and our district offices would be submitting reports to the respective CDMOs, Thursday. The CDMOs will be seeking compliance from the establishments," he said. On Friday, the DG is scheduled to make a presentation on the issue before the Chief Secretary.

Sources meanwhile said of the 4,300-odd clinical establishments that are being audited, focus is laid on O&G and neonatal as well as paediatric clinics/hospitals which are often found to have scant. or minimal fire safety measures though their patients are the most vulnerable to any mishap, fire included.

As per norms, any clinical establishment having 15 metres or above structure needs to have mandatory fire compliance certificate for its operation.

## 420 offensive social media posts removed

Bhubaneswar. May 28: Continuing its crackdown against offensive social media content ahead of Phase IV elections in the state, the social media cell of Odisha Police Tuesday claimed the removal of 420 posts from platforms like Meta, Instagram, YouTube and X.

Besides, five FIRs have been registered with the social media cell of Odisha Police

vestigated.

The Odisha Police claimed that these posts were taken down following the reports of violation of model code of conduct.

In order to tackle the inflammatory or hateful content, the social media unit of the Crime Branch in the past had sent 788 requests for content takedown to Meta.

In response, the Meta has acted upon on 154 of these requests.

The CB had earlier sent requests to Instagram for removal

of 471 posts, while requests were made to YouTube to take down 96 videos.

Likewise, search giant Google has cooperated with the requests from CB by removing nine pieces of content, which were deemed inappropriate or harmful.

Various social media cells of Odisha Police have stated that around 950 social media handles are under surveillance as they might disrupt the law and order situation with 'hateful content'.

Several other people went missing in landslides, mostly in the state capital region, which was cut off from the rest of the country for several hours during the day and bore the brunt of the natural calamities.

In a massive landslide, at least 14 people, including two minors. were killed and around eight others were missing as a stone quarry collapsed in Aizawl district, the Mizoram State Disaster Management Authority (MSDMA) said.

Four persons were also killed and 18 others injured in separate incidents in Assam on Tuesday as heavy rain accompanied by strong wind lashed the state in the aftermath of the cyclone.

In Nagaland, four deaths and damage to more than 40 houses were reported while two persons died and over 500 others were injured as downpours

wreaked havoc in Meghalaya. The stone quarry collapse incident in Mizoram happened around 6 am in an area between Melthum and Hlimen on the southern outskirts of the Aizawl town, an official said. The MSDMA stated that several houses and worker camps caved in due to the landslide, burying at least 22 people beneath the debris. So far, 14 bodies have been recovered and around eight people are still missing, it said.

## Withdraw cases against Kapadia: Tharoor to Modi

New Delhi, May 28: Congress leader Shashi Tharoor Tuesday took a swipe at Prime Minister Narendra Modi after he hailed director Payal Kapadia for winning the Grand Prix award at the Cannes Film Festival, asking if India is proud of her, shouldn't his government immediately withdraw the "cases" against her and fellow FTII students.

Last week, Kapadia became the first Indian filmmaker to win the Grand Prix award, the second highest honour at the 77th Cannes Film Festival, for her Malayalam-Hindi feature film "All We Imagine As Light". Following the win, Modi had said the country is proud of her.

Back in 2015, Kapadia was one of the protesting students who went on strike to oppose actorpolitician Gajendra Chauhan's appointment as the chairperson of the Pune-based Film and Television Institute of India (FTII). In a post on X, Tharoor said,

"Modi jī, if India is proud of her, should your government not immediately #WithdrawTheCases against her and fellow FTII students protesting against your government's arbitrary appointment of an unqualified Chairman?" Tharoor's remarks came in response to Modi's post on X on May 26 in which he wrote, "India is proud of Payal Kapadia for her historic feat of winning the Grand Prix at the 77th Cannes Film Festival for her work 'All We Imagine as

Light'. An alumnus of FTII, her remarkable talent continues to shine on the global stage, giving a glimpse of the rich creativity in India. This prestigious accolade not only honours her exceptional skills but also inspires a new generation of Indian filmmakers."

According to protesting students in 2015, Chauhan did not match the vision and stature of past chairmen of the FTII governing council, and his appointment appeared "politically coloured". During the 139-day strike, the students had also allegedly gheraoed and confined the then FTII director Prashant Pathrabe in his office over some academic issues. This had led to the police entering the campus and arresting some of the protesters.

### 'Environment-friendly food options could help cut emissions'

New Delhi, May 28: Switching food and drinks with more environment-friendly alternatives could cut down greenhouse gas emissions from groceries by 26 per cent, a new research analysing purchases of 7,000 Australian households has found.

Roughly, the same amount of emissions would be cut if over 19 lakh cars were taken off the road in the country, according to researchers.

Making bigger changes, such as swapping a frozen meat lasagne for the vegetarian option, could reduce emissions by as much as 71 per cent, they said.

To make this happen, the authors called for on-pack labelling of greenhouse gas emissions for every packaged food product so that consumers can make informed choices

"While consumers are increasingly aware of the environmental impact of the food system and willing to make more sustainable food choices, they lack reliable information to identify the more environmentally friendly options," said epidemiologist Allison Gaines, lead author of the study published in 🗦 the journal Nature Food.

For their analysis, the researchers used the FoodSwitch database, maintained by The George Institute, UK, for information on ingredients, weights and production life cycles.

# HEATWAVE SWEEPS STATE; BOUDH HOTTEST AT 45.9°C

Bhubaneswar, May 28: Odisha is reeling under intense heatwave conditions, with day temperature rising to above 40 degrees Celsius in as many as 17 locations in the state.

Boudh became the hottest place in the state with mercury rising to an unprecedented 45.9 degrees Celsius, followed by 45.3 degrees Celsius in Sonepur and 45 degrees Celsius in Titlagarh.

In most parts of Western Odisha such as Jharsuguda, Sambalpur, Bolangir and Bhawanipatna, the day temperature is hovering over 44 de-

#### grees Celsius

The twin cities of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack recorded day temperature above 39 degrees Celsius.

IMD sources said due to prevailing dry conditions in the state and strengthening of northwesterly dry winds in middle and upper level of the atmosphere, maximum temperature (day) is likely to be 40 degrees Celsius or more at many places in the districts of interior Odisha from May 28 to June 1 next.

Consequently maximum temperature (day) is likely to be above normal by 2 to 4 degrees Celsius over some districts of



interior Odisha from May 28 to June 1 and above normal by 2 to

3 degrees Celsius over few districts of coastal Odisha.

Due to absence of any major synoptic features and presence of high humidity in lower levels, hot and humid conditions are very likely over coastal Odisha during the next three-four days. the IMD said in its bulletin.

However, establishment of a north-south trough like features towards June 1 is likely to trigger thunderstorms activity from June 1 onwards over some districts of coastal Odisha

The IMD had advised the people to take precautionary measures while going outside during the peak hours of the day.

There will be gradual rise in maximum temperature (day) by 2 to 3 degrees Celsius during next two days at many places over the districts of Odisha and there will be no large change thereafter, it said.

The weatherman has issued 'yellow warning' of hot and humid weather conditions at one or two places in Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Ganjam and Gajapati districts from May 28 to 30.

The heatwave conditions are also likely to prevail in Sundargarh, Jharsuguda, Bolangir, Sambalpur and Nuapada districts May 29 and May 30, it said.

According to EOW, during the period 2020-23, Parida floated different schemes like Autopool package and boosting package among others and induced the members of the public to invest with the company through its two schemes to get hefty returns i.e. 26 per cent per month consecutively for three months on the invested amount. Besides, he also promised a bonus of two per cent for the investors for

enrolling new members. As per the norms, one can

join the scheme by depositing ₹2,500, which is non-refundable. After depositing the amount, the investor would be given a login ID under which the investor can further enroll three persons to get more commission or bonus. Once an investor joins the scheme, initially, he was given the Ayurvedic products of ₹500, the EOW said.

The EOW sources further said during the investigation, it was found that the accused, made some initial return to the investors but after collecting more than ₹50 crore from over 2,000 investors, he fled away with the collected amount, which was misappropriated by him, the EOW revealed. During the probe, the EOW

found that the company was not authorised to take any public deposit either by RBI or SEBI. The company was not issuing any money receipt rather asking the investors to deposit the invested amount in the company accounts.

The EOW, during the investigation, seized a laptop containing many incriminating materials like list of investors, the amount invested and payment sheets among others



# **Ganjam suffers due to** lack of industrialisation

Berhampur, May 28: Over five lakh residents in Ganjam district have migrated in the last couple of decades due to lack of industrial development, sources said Tuesday. They said that both the Centre and successive state governments are responsible for the migration of residents of the district. Despite the state being ruled by both Congress and non-Congress governments, this district have never benefitted, the sources who belong to a number of trade and labour unions pointed out.

Locals informed that this district is predominantly agriculture-oriented where cultivation is the mainstay of the residents. However, none of the governments in the last 50 years have taken any steps for establishment of agriculture-based industries despite presence of a

conducive atmosphere and necessarv infrastructure.

Cases in point are the Aska cooperative sugar mill built in the British era. It is in sick condition and is in urgent need of revival. A cooperative cotton mill was running in the district, but is now shut. Locals pointed out that during election campaigns, various parties blame each other for the impasse in industrialisation. They also promise to revive the sick industries. However, once the elections are over, the vows are forgotten.

The Centre-owned Indian Rare Earths Ltd (IREL) was established long back near the district headquarters of Chhatrapur. The rare black sand produced by IERL is exported to various foreign countries. However, it does not operate smoothly, sources said. There is a port at Gopalpur, but both the Centre and the state government have failed to trans-

form it into an all-weather one Hence locals are losing out on work, sources added.

During the UPA government, the Centre announced that it was planning to set up a wagon factory at Sitalapalli near this town. Funds were also sanctioned. However, it was cancelled when the NDA government came to power in 2014. With it thousands of people who had hoped for jobs at the factory vanished.

Similarly, a survey was conducted in 2009 for construction of a new rail route from Gopalpur to Rayagada district. The survey was completed in time and the Union Finance Commission also prepared a plan outlay for the project. Since then 15 years have elapsed, but the project is still stuck in the survey stage. Had the Centre taken steps for construction of the tracks, it would have ushered employment for thousands and would have connected many tribaldominated villages in both Ganjam and Rayagada districts, locals opined

Development of the railway tracks would have also enabled Nalco to send its products to Gopalpur port through wagons. This would have facilitated industrial growth, locals opined. The lack of industrial growth is having an adverse impact on the economy of the district, they added.

# **MYSTERY SHROUDS DEATH OF** FORMER SARPANCH IN ANGUL

Chhendipada, May 28: Mystery shrouds the death of a BJD leader and former sarpanch whose body was found lying near the basil plant on the ground floor of his residence at Jereng Dehuri Sahi village under Jarpada police limits in Angul district in the wee hours of Tuesday.

The deceased was identified as Bibhuti Gadnaik, who had reportedly gone to sleep on the roof top after having his dinner at house Monday night. The matter came to the fore after Jarpada police seized the mutilated body of Bibhuti lying near the basil plant during daybreak, Tuesday

Family members cried foul over his death with his son Bikash Ranjan Gadnaik alleging that his father has been murdered over past political enmity. He lodged a complaint at the Jarpada police station. Jarpada IIC Nirmala Gochhayat and SDPO Ramakant Mahallik reached the spot and conducted a probe. A scientific team was also pressed into service. However, DIG Uma Shankar Das. who is also the SP in-charge of Angul, rejected the charges at a press con-



ference held Tuesday. He said preliminary inquiry was not indicative of murder. Police registered a case of unnatural death and intensified probe into the case.

The actual reason behind the death of the BJD leader could be ascertained only after the availability of the post-mortem report, the DIG said. Moreover, the investigation will also

However, family members spotted his badly bruised body lying near the basil plant of his residence at about 4am, Tuesday.

# Shining Women

t a time when countless women in India are daily becoming victims of male chauvinism and gender discrimination, two women L of the country have made Indians proud by winning coveted prizes on the world stage with their sterling performances. Payal Kapadia and Anasuya Sengupta have brought laurels from the Mecca of cinema -Cannes. Paval became the first person from India to win the prestigious Grand Prix at the 77th Cannes Film Festival, while Anasuva won the Best Actress in the Un Certain Regard section for her role in Konstantin Bojanov's The Shameless

The spectacular success of Payal is not simply a triumph of art, but it also carries important messages for different spheres of life in India. It is a resounding slap on the face of the country's political establishment and mainstream cinema. Her film - All We Imagine As Light - is the first Indian film in three decades to compete at Cannes in the main competition.

As the director herself stated in her acceptance speech, the film is about friendship among three very different women. She underscores the unfortunate social reality that often women are pitted against each other. But for her "friendship is a very important relationship because it can lead to greater solidarity, inclusivity and empathy." That is the central point made in the film and it assumes significance in the current political context of India where intolerance and communal divide have become the main socio-political-cultural narrative. Its depiction of the romance between the main character Prabha and her Moslem boyfriend is a bold critique of the current situation of the country which has become increasingly polarised along religious lines.

The irony is many who are intolerant towards an inclusive society were among the early ones who showered praise on Payal's stellar achievement. It was the authorities in the government run film institute that was responsible for the persecution of the director when she was a final year film direction student of the Film and Television Institute of India (FTII), Pune. Her "fault" was she took a stand against a gross abuse of power by the government proposing the name of a popular, but mediocre small screen actor as the chairman of the prestigious FTII. In December 2016, Payal was among six students who had qualified for the foreign exchange programme, in addition to being one of eight students to receive a scholarship set up by private donors for students at the top of their class. However, she was unable to enjoy either of these coveted opportunities. The FTII administration disqualified her, along with several other students, for participating in a students strike in 2015 against the proposed appointment of actor-turned-politician Gajendra Chauhan as chairman of the institute.

Chauhan had become popular primarily for playing Yudhisthir in the television adaptation of Indian epic Mahabharata. This television serial, along with another based on the epic, Ramayana, had played an important role in moulding public opinion in favour of the proponents of Hindootva as preached by the BJP. The government's proposal to appoint Chauhan as the FTII chairman sparked the longest protest in the institute's history, as students said he lacked "credentials and vision" and felt that his appointment was "politically coloured." Payal was in the forefront of the 139 day-long protests. For this she was named, along with 34 other students, in a complaint registered by then-institute director Prashant Pathrabe that said a group of 50 students had forcibly detained him in his office. The case is still pending nine years later and is set to be heard in Pune on 26 June.

The congratulatory message posted by the FTII for Payal's feat sounds like the height of hypocrisy. For, the then-director Bhupendra Kainthola remarked in 2017 that the FTII believes an academically bright student must also "learn to function within the framework of institutional rules and good behaviour." Predictably, the FTII message has received an immediate backlash. Indian Oscar-winning sound designer Resul Pookutty wrote in social media wondering whether the FTII has got anything to do with this win.

The lesson that the government should learn from the singular honours won by the two Indian women is that it should not meddle in liberal pursuits of art and literature and allow unfettered freedom of speech and expression. Taking credit for achievements of individuals and hijacking their successes seems to be the only way this government and politicians try to partake in glory on international platforms



uring the pandemic, many people were able to work from home (WFH), thanks to the internet and video communication platforms such as Zoom and Microsoft Teams. This helped keep the COVID virus from spreading and was also quite effective in limiting the spread of office gossip.

# Incessant rains disrupt life in Kerala 'BRS govt snooped on

Kochi/Thiruvananthapuram, May 28: Intense downpour accompanied by gusty winds Tuesday wreaked havoc in central and south Kerala. as land slides, widespread water-logging and the destruction of houses forced several people to shift to relief camps. Tourist centres have been closed in many districts, including Kottayam and Thiruvananthapuram, and a night travel ban has been imposed in the hilly areas of Idukki district

Experts said cloudbursts could be the reason for the heavierthan-usual rainfall that pounded various parts of the port city of Kochi, especially the Kalamasserv

Killiyar and in Thiruvananthapuram steadily rose, authorities urged local people living on its banks to pay extra vigil and shift to safer places if necessary. Chief Minister

in various districts, they said. South and central districts like Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Kottayam, and Ernakulam mainly bore the brunt of the continuous downpour, which caused waterlogging, damage to houses, trees to be uprooted, and tiny water bodies to overflow, cutting across towns and villages. Earlier in the day, many narrow lanes and busy roads in Kochi city and adjacent areas were submerged due to continuous downpours. People could not venture out of their homes in many areas of the port city as roads were flooded. Vehicles were seen moving at snail's pace on highways following the rain. Normal life was hit in the Kakkanad-Infopark, one of the IT hubs of the state, and Aluva-Edappally areas due to waterlogging. An uprooted tree fell on a state-run KSRTC bus at Thoppumpady in Kochi. Luckily, passengers escaped unhurt.

Intense rains caused mudslides and disrupted traffic on Erattupetta and Vagamon roads in Kottayam district. The city and rural areas of the capital district of Thiruvananthapuram have witnessed heavy rains since Monday night.

Nedumangad, Neyyattinkara, Kattakkada, and Amboori areas. located in the high ranges of the district, received widespread rainfall

According to the local residents, a portion of a hill behind the famous Bali mandapam at Papanasam in nearby Varkala caved in because of heavy rains.

Kalamassery received 57 mm of rainfall in one-and-a-half hours, he pointed out. Rajan said steps have been taken to open 3,597 relief camps in the state, in view of the situation arising out of the rains. Preparations are underway to set up camps that can accommodate over five lakh people during emergencies, he said.

#### Students brew innovation with health-friendly green coffee Kerala govt prepares action calendar to prevent Nipah

Thiruvananthapuram, May 28: The Kerala government said Tuesday that a special action calendar is being prepared for the prevention of a Nipah outbreak, which has haunted the state on four occasions in the past.

Nipah outbreaks had been reported in Kozhikode district of Kerala in 2018, 2021, and 2023, and in Ernakulam district in 2019, and the presence of Nipah virus antibodies had been detected in bats in Kozhikode, Wayanad, Idukki, Malappuram, and Ernakulam districts.

The calendar is being prepared by including activities for the entire year, especially in the months of May to September, the period when the zoonotic virus is likely to spread, state Health Minister Veena George said. A high-level meeting of health officials was convened here to discuss preventive measures and the department's preparedness in facing any emergency with regard to Nipah, George said in a statement here. During the meeting, the min-



ister directed the officials to give priority to Nipah and bird flu prevention activities. Preparedness should be strengthened in collaboration with the Animal Husbandry and Forest and Education departments, she said.

Mock drills should be conducted to assess preparedness during emergency situations, she said, and suggested that special attention should be paid to the northern districts of

Kozhikode and Wayanad. During the meeting, George asked health officials to carry out vigorous Nipah prevention activities in these districts on a campaign basis until the month of September. The minister asked the officials to intensify awareness drives in these districts through health centres but cautioned that the natural habitat

Kochi, May 28: 'Green tea' has been a favourite drink of healthconscious people for quite some time, but what about making 'green coffee' popular? A group of Kerala students has now developed a new variety of healthfriendly green coffee powder.

Students from the Laurus Institute for Logistics in Kalamassery said, inspired by the popularity of green tea, they came out with green coffee powder, as part of a project at their institute. This new drink aims to cater to the growing demand for healthy options and capitalise on the increas-

ness, they said. Rich in antioxidants, green coffee boosts metabolism and helps reduce diabetes, cholesterol, blood pressure, and weight, the students claimed.

They also received a certificate from the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) for the product.

Despite the widespread popularity of green tea, the students admitted that developing



a new brand of green coffee powder was a significant challenge.

It was the 2020 batch of the institute that recognised the benefits of green coffee. The 30member batch split into different groups and explored various concepts before settling on green coffee.

A 10-member team was interested in making FMCG products, and they considered tea and coffee due to their global popularity.

Abhijith MV, a member of the project team, said they unexpectedly discovered green coffee beans while they were in Palakkad seeking the best suppliers

He said that although they sampled many other ready-made coffee powders, their focus remained on developing green coffee powder, which is not widely known.

The supplier mentioned that sun-dried green coffee pods were

not in high demand, but the students were keen to learn about green coffee, Ajay Sankar, chair-

man of the institute, said. They brought the overlooked green coffee beans from Coorg and Palakkad to Kalamassery. In the second phase, they experimented by grinding the beans into different sizes, Sankar said. Multiple laboratory tests were conducted to determine the shelf

life of the product, and finally, they decided to grind Arabica cof-

The students are now motivated by the fact that customers continue to buy it after experiencing the benefits from at least two packs, the chairman added. Though the project was started

by the 2020 batch, the green coffee project has been passed on to subsequent batches. Students continue to improve 'Laurus-Nature's Green Coffee' through ongoing research, he added.

didates contesting polls. "Earlier party leaders contesting elections used to visit the voters and there was a personal connection between the voter and the candidate, but now votes are sought on

phone," she said. Judhya is the oldest voter in the state, an official of the Himachal Pradesh election department told PTI. Of the total 56,45,579 electors in the state, 1,31,642 are aged above, he added.

Life has been harsh for Judhya who has remained a widow for the past three decades. She lives with her youngest daughter Thakuri Devi, 58, also a widow, and her two sons in Kot village on the border of Bilaspur and Mandi districts, about 51 km from the state capital.

"Our times were good, people had time for each other. Principles, care for voters and personal contact connected voters with their political leaders but now development and technology has replaced personal touch," said Thakuri, an Anganwadi worker, conveying her mother's sentiments.

Asked about her expectations from the party coming to power at the Centre, Thakuri said both she and her mother hoped that her sons who are now working in private companies land up government jobs so that they have a secure future

Judhya has been unwell for

quite some time but still exercised her franchise by casting her vote in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls during a home voting procedure in a nearby house where she was taken in a vehicle.

Born January 1, 1908, Judhya has been a witness to the election process starting from the time when stamps were put on ballot paper to the use of EVMs followed by VVPAT. Shyam Saran Negi, the first



New Delhi, May 28: A war of word erupted between AAP and BJP Tuesday after a city court summoned Delhi minister Atishi in a defamation case May 29 over her poaching charge against the saffron party, with Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal alleging there was a plan to arrest her. The BJP hit back at Kejriwal and Atishi, claiming their "lies" will be exposed in the court.

A defiant Atishi said in a press conference that "Operation Lotus" was a well-known tactic of the BJP and questioned how the party managed to form governments in many states without having a majority.

The Rouse Avenue court earlier in the day summoned Atishi Wednesday in connection with the criminal defamation case filed by Delhi BJP leader Praveen Shankar Kapoor. However, it refused to summon the Delhi Chief Minister in the matter. Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Tanya Bamniyal, summoned Atishi saying "prima facie" there was sufficient evidence against her

in the matter. Despite accusing the BJP of trying to poach AAP MLAs, neither Kejriwal nor Atishi had produced any evidence and also

May 28: Delhi Lt Governor VK Saxena Tuesday ordered a comprehensive Anti-Corruption Branch (ACB) probe into the registration and regulatory management of all private nursing homes in the wake of the deadly neonatal hospital fire in Vivek Vihar, even as the police summoned the health facility owner's wife and seven others

staff members for questioning. Saxena said the incident, which claimed the lives of six newborns, has brought out the "sheer mismanagement, criminal neglect and connivance of officials of the health department" in granting and renewing registrations of nursing homes.

As part of its probe, Delhi Police has summoned Jagriti, the wife of hospital owner Dr Naveen Khichi. She is a dentist and also a co-owner of the facility.

Besides, seven other staff members, including nurses, who were on duty on Saturday night when the incident occurred, have been called for questioning.

Police sources said they have also asked two dozen hospital staff members to submit their degrees to ascertain whether they are qualified to work at a neonatal facility.

They said that Naveen Khichi

and Dr Aaksh, who have been arrested in the case, showed "re-

morse" during questioning. While Khichi "accepted flouting norms", he claimed that he had to keep more beds as the number of patients arriving at the hospitals was increasing and there was no objection from authorities, the sources said.

'He (Khichi) told us said the number of admissions was not increased intentionally but he increased the beds when the demand increased over the last three years. He used to charge ₹4,000-₹6,000 for a normal bed and up to ₹8,000 for ventilators, a senior police officer said.

The police are likely to take Khichi to Jaipur Wednesday as he had fled to the city after the incident, the officer said, adding that Aaksh during interrogation said that he helped in the rescue operation but fled the spot as he was scared of the people. Investigators have already seized the mobile phones of the accused.

"We have taken their mobile phones to know about the call records and messages shared between them."

"We will also check that if any message was later deleted,' another senior police officer privy to the investigation said, adding, if need be, the mobile phones of other staff members will also be checked.

Countering the submission made on behalf of Kavitha that she, being a woman, be released on bail, the probe agencies contended she played a key role in the conspiracy behind the "scam" and, being an active politician and a member of the Telangana legislative council, she cannot seek parity with "vulnerable" women.

#### Dramatic scenes at Delhi airport

New Delhi: A Varanasi-bound IndiGo flight received a bomb threat at the airport here Tuesday morning but a search of the aircraft found it to be a hoax, officials said. # Ram Rahim acquitted in 2002 murder case

Chandigarh, May 28: The Punjab and Haryana High Court Tuesday acquitted Dera Sacha Sauda chief Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh and four others in the murder case of the sect's former manager Raniit Singh in 2002.

The Sirsa-headquartered sect chief, who is also serving a 20year jail term for raping two of his disciples, is currently lodged in Sunaria jail in Rohtak, Haryana. "The high court has acquitted him and four others in the Ranjit Singh murder case,'



Dera chief's lawyer Jitender Khurana said.

He said the arguments in the case had got over earlier and the matter came up for pronouncement of verdict before the high court Tuesday. Khurana said a division bench of Justice Sureshwar Thakur and Justice Lalit Batra

pronounced the decision on the appeals filed by Ram Rahim and four others who had been convicted by a special CBI court in Panchkula, Haryana, in October 2021.

The court had sentenced them to life imprisonment in the nearly 20-vear-old murder case of Raniit Singh. He had been held guilty of hatching a criminal conspiracy with his co-accused. Ranjit Singh, who was also a follower of the sect, was shot dead July 10, 2002, at Khanpur Kolian village in Haryana's Kurukshetra.

## **CBI slaps attempt** to murder charges against Shahjahan

New Delhi, May 28: The CBI has charged suspended TMC leader Shahjahan Sheikh, his brother and five others with criminal conspiracy and attempt to murder in connection with a mob attack on an Enforcement Directorate team in Sandeshkhali January 5, officials said Tuesday.

The agency's first charge sheet in the case was filed Monday before a Basirhat special court, they said. The ED team came under attack from a 1,000-strong mob when it went to raid Sheikh's house in connection with the multi-crore ration distribution scam in West Bengal. It had also gone to arrest Sheikh because of his alleged close links with arrested former state food minister Jyoti Priya Mallick, under the scanner in the scam, they said.

The charge sheet is against seven people, including Sheikh, his brother Alomgir and associates Jiauddin Mollah, Mafujar Mollah, and Didarbaksh Mollah. they said. The CBI has invoked Indian Penal Code Sections 120-B (criminal conspiracy) and 307 (attempt to murder) on the accused besides rioting and unlawful assembly among a number of other charges, they said.

Sandeshkhali, has been in the news after local women alleged land-grabbing and sexual abuse by Sheikh and his men, who areinvolved in fish farming and trading.

# Blood cancer cases may be rising among young adults: Experts

New Delhi, May 28: Chronic myeloid leukaemia (CML) -- a rare, yet treatable type of blood cancer -- is significantly rising among young adults, aged 30 to 40 years, in India, warned doctors Tuesday.

CML affects the bone marrow and is characterised by the uncontrolled growth of white blood cells (WBC), specifically granulocytes, in the bone marrow.

Globally, CML affects a significant number of people, with estimates ranging between 1.2 to 1.5 million individuals.

Despite its prevalence, CML remains relatively rare compared to other forms of leukaemia, comprising nearly 15 per cent of all leukaemia cases. A recent study published in the journal Lancet showed that the condition is found in much younger persons, with the majority of patients being diagnosed between the age of 30 to 40 years, in India.

With vigilant monitoring and personalised treatment strategies CML can be managed," Tulika Seth, Professor Haematology, AIIMS, New Delhi, told IANS. "Living with CML is a journey

that comes with unique challenges at each stage. Prioritising frequent monitoring, compliance with treatment aiming for optimal treatment goals, and embracing advancements in therapy is key," she added.

# Spain, Norway and Ireland recognise Palestinian state

Barcelona, May 28: Spain, Norway and Ireland formally recognised a Palestinian state Tuesday in a coordinated effort by the three western European nations to add international pressure on Israel to soften its devastating response to last year's Hamas-led attack. Tel Aviv slammed the diplomatic move that will have no immediate impact on its grinding war in Gaza.

Israel's Foreign Minister Israel Katz quickly lashed out at Spain on X, saying Sánchez's government was "being complicit in inciting genocide against Jews and war crimes".

Ireland and Norway soon joined Spain in formalizing a decision they had jointly announced the previous week. ## Judge nixes bid to restrict Trump statements

Washington: The judge overseeing Donald Trump's classified documents case in Florida Tuesday denied prosecutors' request to bar the former President from making public statements that could endanger law enforcement agents participating in the prosecution. US District Judge Aileen Cannon said in her order that prosecutors on special counsel Jack Smith's team didn't give defence lawyers adequate time to discuss the request before it was filed Friday evening. The request followed a distorted claim by Trump last week that the FBI agents who searched his Mar-a-Lago estate in August 2022 were "authorised to shoot me" and were "locked & loaded ready to take me out & put my family in danger.

## Qalibaf re-elected as speaker of Iran's Parl

Dubai: Iran's Parliament re-elected hard-liner Mohammad Bagher Qalibaf Tuesday as its speaker, reaffirming its hard-right makeup in the wake of a helicopter crash that killed the country's president and foreign minister. Of 287 lawmakers voting, 198 backed Qalibaf to retain the position he first took in 2021. He initially became speaker following a string of failed presidential bids and 12 years as the leader of Iran's capital city, in which he built onto Tehran's subway and supported the construction of modern high-rises. Many, however, know Qalibaf for his support, as a Revolutionary Guard general, for a violent crackdown on Iranian university students in 1999. He also reportedly ordered live gunfire to be used against Iranian students in 2003 while serving as the country's police chief.

## Nawaz Sharif re–elected as PML–N president

Lahore: Nawaz Sharif was re-elected "unopposed" as the President of the ruling Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) party Tuesday, six years after the three-time former Prime Minister was forced to quit the post following a Supreme Court ruling in the Panama Papers case. The 74year-old veteran politician, who returned to Pakistan in October last year after a four-year self-imposed exile in the UK, was elected without a contest in the party's general council meeting held here. PML-N election commissioner Rana Sanaullah told the general council that only Nawaz was nominated for the slot of the party president. Sanaullah sought the approval from the members of the general council who stood on their seats to endorse his nomination. They chanted slogans in his favour.

# 21 dead after Israeli tanks hit Rafah evacuation zone

Cairo, May 28: Israeli strikes on a tent camp in an evacuation area west of Rafah killed at least 21 Tuesday, Gaza health authorities said, and tanks advanced to the centre of the southern Gaza city for the first time after a night of heavy bombardment.

At least 12 of the dead were women, according to medical officials in the Hamas militant-

run Palestinian enclave. An Israeli military spokesperson said: "As of this time, we are not aware of this incident."

International unease over Israel's three-week-old Rafah offensive has turned to outrage after an attack Sunday set off a blaze in a tent camp in a western district of the city, killing at least 45 people.

Israel said it had targeted Hamas commanders and had not intended to cause civilian casualties.

Around one million people, many repeatedly displaced by



shifting waves of the war, have fled the Israeli offensive in Rafah since early May, the UN agency for Palestinian refugees (UNRWA) reported Tuesday. ISRAEL SAYS IT'S IN COMBAT NEAR **EGYPT BORDER** 

Since Israel launched its incursion by seizing control of the Rafah border crossing with Egypt three weeks ago, tanks had probed around the outskirts and entered some eastern districts but had not yet rumbled into the city in full force.

Witnesses in central Rafah said the Israeli military appeared to have brought in remote-operated armoured vehicles and there was no immediate sign of personnel in or around them. An Israeli military spokesperson had no immediate comment.

## Taiwan's Parliament passes bill pushing pro-China changes

Taipei, May 28: Taiwan's Opposition-controlled legislature passed changes Tuesday that are seen as favouring China and diminishing the power of the island's president.

The changes pushed by the opposition Nationalist Party and its allies give the body greater power to control budgets, including defence spending that the party has blocked in what many see as a concession to China.

The Nationalists officially back unification with China, from which Taiwan separated during a civil war in 1949. They took control of the legislature with a single-seat majority after elections in January, while the presidency went to Lai Ching-te of the Democratic Progressive Party, which favours Taiwan's de facto independence from China.

The legislative chamber was festooned with banners promoting both sides in the dispute, while arguments on the floor broke into shouting and pushing matches. DPP legislators accused deputies from the KMT and the minority Taiwan People's Party of undermining Taiwan's democracy by expanding the legislature's oversight of the executive branch.

#### Indonesia braces for droughts, fires

Jakarta: Indonesia's Meteorology, Climatology, and Geophysics Agency (BMKG) Tuesday warned of potential droughts and peatland fires as the dry season is already starting in some regions of the archipelago. The head of BMKG, Dwikorita Karnawati. has said that 19 per cent of Indonesia's territory entered the dry season, particularly Aceh, North Sumatra, Riau, West Java, and the Special Region of Yogyakarta, Xinhua news agency reported.

#### **Aid deliveries** suspended

Washington: A US built temporary pier that had been used to deliver humanitarian aid to Gaza was damaged by rough seas and has temporarily suspended operations, three US officials told The Associated Press Tuesday. The Joint Logistics Over The Shore, or JLOTS, pier only began operations in the past two weeks and had provided an additional way to get critically needed food to Gaza. The setback is the latest for the \$320 million pier, which has already had three US service member injuries and had four if its vessels beached due to heavy seas

Without naming any country, Hasina, 76. Sunday said that she was offered a hassle-free re-election in the January 7 polls if she allowed a foreign country to build an airbase inside Bangladeshi territory. Hasina, ruling the strategically located South Asian nation since 2009, secured a fifth overall term in the one-sided election in January, which was boycotted by the main Opposition Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) led by former prime minister Khalida Zia.

## **UNP** proposes to postpone elections

Colombo, May 28: The United National Party headed by Sri Lankan President Ranil Wickremesinghe Tuesday suggested holding a referendum to postpone both presidential and general elections and extending the terms of both offices for two years to pursue much-needed economic reforms, a proposal that was immediately criticised by the opposition parties as unconstitutional.

The island nation's Elections Commission earlier this month said the presidential election would be conducted between September 17 and October 16.

United National Party (UNP) general secretary Palitha Range Bandara presented a proposal to postpone both the presidential and general elections by two years and emphasised that if circumstances warrant, this proposal can be formally submitted to Parliament, paving the way for a referendum, news portal NewsFirst.lk reported.

'The UNP General Secretary highlighted a pivotal moment in Sri Lanka's history. The nation faced economic adversity, but resolute measures were taken to steer it away from the brink. These efforts yielded significant victories," Bandara told reporters here.

Incidentally, President Wickremesinghe, 75, last week reiterated his intention to hold the next presidential electionthis year ahead of the parliamentary election.

# How to predict landslides to save lives

#### THE CONVERSATION

Sydney, May 28: A devastating landslide struck several remote villages in the mountainous Enga province in Papua New Guinea late last week.

While it is too early for official confirmation, estimates place the death toll between 690 and 2,000 people, with thousands more missing. That only a few bodies have been recovered serves as a tragic reminder of the destructive power of these events.

The ongoing search and rescue operations have proven challenging.

As often with landslides, secondary slides and rock falls are hampering efforts in the search zone. There's also a lack of access to heavy digging machinery, and roads need to be cleared or repaired for assistance and equip-

ment to arrive. Even more critically, it is difficult to locate potential survivors, as landslides carry away



buildings and their occupants in an unpredictable manner. What causes these devastating sliding downhill. events and why are they so sud-Depending on den and unpredictable? WHAT CAUSES LAND-

**SLIDES?** Landslides happen when the pull from gravity exceeds the

strength of the geomaterial forming the slope of a hill or mountain. Geomaterials can be as varied as rocks, sand, silt and clays.

Unfortunately, all the money in the world can't buy accurate landslide

predictions - especially in remote parts of the world

where the slope fails, the material sliding down can be just a few cubic

metres or a few million cubic metres in volume.

#### WHY DO SLOPES FAIL? Most natural landslides are

triggered by earthquakes or rainfall, or a combination of both.

Earthquakes shake the ground, stress it and weaken it over time. Rainwater can seep through the ground and soak it - the ground is often porous like a sponge – and add weight to the slope. This is why PNG is so prone to landslides, as it sits on an active fault and is subjected to heavy

rainfalls WHY CAN'T

WE PREDICT LAND-**SLIDES?** It's very dif-

ficult to predict and mitigate landslide risk effectively. The Enga landslide and the thou-

sands of deadly and costly landslides occurring every year worldwide suggest so. Even in Australia - the flattest continent in the world-home insurance policies don't tend to cover landslide risk for a simple reason: this risk is difficult to

estimate. So what would it take to warn people of a coming landslide? You would need a prediction for earthquakes and rainfall, in addition to a perfect knowledge of the slope-forming geomaterial. Under our feet, geomaterials may include multiple. entangled layers of various kinds of rocks and particulate materials, such as sand, silt and clays. Their strength varies from a factor of one to 1,000, and their spatial distribution dictates where the slope is likely to fail

To accurately assess the stability of the slope, a three-dimensional mapping of these materials and their strengths is needed. No sensor can provide this information, so geologists and geotechnical engineers must deal with partial information obtained at a few selected locations and extrapolate this data to the rest of the slope.

The weakest link of the chain - such as an existing fracture in a rock mass - is easily missed.

#### **GIC Re net profit** rises to ₹2,642cr

New Delhi: GIC Re Tuesday posted a 3 per cent increase in net profit to ₹2,642 crore for the fourth guarter ended March 2024 compared to ₹2.564 crore in the same quarter a year earlier. During the quarter, the company collected a gross premium of ₹8,724 against ₹7,370 crore in the year-ago period, GIC Re said in a regulatory filing. Total income of the re-insurer. however, declined to ₹9.157 crore in the March quarter compared to ₹9.259 crore in the same quarter a year ago. The net commission improved to ₹1,491 crore compared to ₹824 crore in the

corresponding quarter of the previous fiscal. For the entire 2023-24. GIC Re recorded a 3 per cent rise in net profit to ₹ 6.497 crore from ₹6.313 crore in the preceding financial

people and a growing affluent class, India is a lucrative market for big tech companies. Apple CEO Tim Cook said this month the company posted a 'revenue record' in India during the March quarter, when its overall global revenue declined 4%.

The Indian panel says the new law is needed as a few large digital enterprises 'wield immense control over the market.' As in the EU, it is recommending a penalty of up to 10% of a company's annual global turnover for violations.

The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has for years been investigating big tech firms.

The CCI in 2022 fined Google \$161 million, ordering it to stop restricting users from removing its pre-installed apps and allow downloads without using its app store. Google denies wrongdoing and says such restrictions boost user security.

Amazon is also facing an antitrust investigation for favouring select sellers on its India website, an allegation it denies. Apple, too, denies allegations but faces an investigation for alleged abuse of its dominant po sition in the apps market.

A group of 40 Indian startups, though, has come out in support of the new Indian law, saving it can help address monopolistic practices of dominant digital platforms and create a level playing field for smaller companies.

There is no fixed timeline, but the Indian government will next review feedback on the proposal before seeking parliament approval with or without changes.

## Strong fundamentals behind share market rally, say experts

New Delhi, May 28: The current spurt in the stock market is on account of strong fundamentals and robust corporate earnings and retail investors can look for buying opportunities to accumulate quality stocks, experts said.

The benchmark Sensex Monday scaled 76,000 level for the first time while the Nifty hit a new lifetime peak of 23,110.80.

Last week also, the stock market benchmarks Nifty 50 and Sensex touched their respective all-time highs on two occasions.

Experts said corporate balance sheets are very clean now compared to 5 years ago. Most of the corporates have deleveraged their balance sheet and have scope for capacity expansion.

The recent rally in the Indian market is supported by strong domestic macroeconomic fundamentals, like GDP growth, and manufacturing PMI (Purchasing Managers' Index). Even inflation is also largely stable,<sup>3</sup> Narendra Solanki, Head Fundamental Research-Investment Services, Anand Rathi Shares and Stock Brokers, said

Wealth management company The Infinity Group, Founder & Director, Vinnaayak Mehta said, "diversifying portfolios, investing in quality stocks with strong fundamentals, and avoiding speculative trading can help mitigate risks"

"It is crucial to avoid making short-term investments... Instead, focus on long-term investment horizons of at least two to three vears." Mehta said. The volatility is expected to persist until the final phase of the election June 1. However, despite these fluctuations, a major correction in the market before the election results is unlikely as the markets have already factored in potential outcomes, he said.

# Stock markets fall for 3rd day ahead of poll results

Mumbai, May 28: Extending the falling streak to the third day in a row, benchmark BSE Sensex declined by 220 points in volatile trade Tuesday due to profit-taking in power, oil and capital goods shares ahead of results of Lok Sabha polls.

After gyrating between gains and losses during the day, the 30-share BSE Sensex ended 220.05 points or 0.29 per cent lower at 75,170.45. During the day, it hit a high of 75,585.40 and a low of 75.083.22. The NSE Nifty dropped 44.30 points or 0.19 per cent to settle at 22,888.15 despite beginning the day on a positive note.

Analysts said that stock markets are witnessing 'buying on dips and sell on rallies' amid uncertainty ahead of the general poll results. Sensex and Nifty scaled lifetime highs on Monday but closed lower due to heavy profit taking at the fag-end. From the Sensex pack. Power

Grid. NTPC. Tech Mahindra. Bharti Airtel, Tata Motors, IndusInd Bank, Reliance Industries, Kotak Mahindra Bank and Maruti were among the laggards. Asian Paints, Wipro, JSW Steel, Hindustan Unilever. Bajaj Finserv and Mahindra & Mahindra were among the biggest gainers.

The Indian market exhibited mild consolidation post the recent sharp surge. The uncertainty-led volatility is likely to continue as the market approaches the election outcome, Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services said. Analysts said mid- and smallcaps underperformed, while de-

fensive sectors like pharma and FMCG were optimistic. "Nifty ended lower for third

day in a row on Tuesday. Nervousness ahead of the election results is on the rise as is evident from the poor advance-decline ratio and falling volumes, said Deepak Jasani, Head of Retail Research, HDFC Securities.

In the broader market, the BSE smallcap gauge declined 1.09 per cent and midcap index declined 0.63 per cent.

together," said Sato. But details on when the engines were coming to market weren't disclosed. The legacy of the car engine could be felt everywhere.

Mazda said that its prized rotary engine, introduced more than 50 years ago, was being adapted for electric vehicles. Subaru, meanwhile, showcased its trademark smaller hor-

izontally opposed engine. While Chief Technology Officer Tetsuro Fujinuki confirmed the company was working on a great 'Subaru-like" electric vehicle, he said the company wasn't about to dump the engine altogether. Toyota, too, is working on styl-

ish BEVs.

The executives said Tuesday that energy supply conditions differed globally, adding that products had to meet various customer needs and the investments needed for mass-producing BEVS were enormous.

Toyota officials also repeatedly noted that 5.5 million jobs were at stake in the overall supply chain for vehicle production in Japan nowadays, so a sudden shift to electric cars wasn't economically possible or socially responsible.

Takahiro Fujimoto, a profes-

sor of business at Waseda University, believes electric vehicles are a key solution for reducing emissions. But they still have weak points, such as large amounts of emissions produced while making lithium-ion batteries, a chief component.

In Japan, for instance, commuters use trains, so that may be a better ecological choice for transportation, Fujimoto said.

"At the very least, I believe the proliferation of and innovations in BEVs are definitely needed. But that argument is logically not the same as saying that all we  $\rightarrow$ need are BEVs," he said.

Uncertainties remain, spanning research and development, as well as social, political and market conditions, said Fujimoto.

"I couldn't go to the airport because I was nervous about facing people in a wheelchair. I couldn't even brush my teeth for two months, and for six to seven months, I suffered unbearable pain," Pant recalled.

# Shooters level gun-tampering allegations against rifle coach

NRAI refutes charges, says person responsible should be named

New Delhi, May 28: A reputed national coach has been accused of tampering with rifles of some shooters by their parents. However, the charge has been vehemently denied by the National Rifles Association of India (NRAI). It has urged the aggrieved individuals to file complaints.

One of the parents of the al-legedly affected shooters, who declined to be named, told this agency Tuesday that he had to purchase a new equipment for his ward after the original rifle was 'spoilt' by the coach. However, the person refused to reveal the coach's identity.

'Yes, my ward's gun was spoilt by the coach. We had to buy a new one because of that. How can the coach just come and do all these setting changes (alter the settings) without the approval of the shooter just one day before a World Cup," the father of the shooter said.

"It happened during the ISSF World Cup in Bhopal last year. Not only this tournament, but also in other events the coach does it. Whenever the coach goes abroad, all these things are done. The logic the coach gave (for changing the settings) was 'you need to experiment'. But experimenting just a day before the World Cup, what experiment are you doing?" he asked.

The father also alleged that a lot of shooters had met NRAI officials and brought it to their notice. "There was a meeting held in NRAI in front of all the



shooters they also told the officials these things. The federation has promised they will look into it. The NRAI knows about it," the father added.

NRAI secretary Rajiv Bhatia refuted the charges. He said he was not aware of any such instance."I have no idea, nobody has approached us. We have not received anything, any complaints. I don't think so (this has been done)," Bhatia said.

"Even if such a thing has been done, they (shooters) should have the guts to come forward, why these allegations come up once they are not selected? The Bhopal World Cup happened in March last vear, so much time has elapsed. If anyone has to say anything, it should be prompt and backed up with facts," Bhatia added. Another parent of a rifle shooter however, alleged that the coach had an 'old record' of tampering with guns.

"My ward had gone to play a World Cup and the coach had tampered with the gun in connivance with a jury (member). The coach has an old record of tampering with guns. We have not brought it to the notice of NRAI as we fear retribution from the national body," he alleged.

Meanwhile the NRAI said it has convinced all shooters to compete in the upcoming World Cup in Munich, and affirmed that a mechanism will be worked out to ensure athletes are not deprived of guidance from personal coaches during competitions. "We have assured them that their grievances will be looked into," Bhatia stated

According to the advertisement issued by the BCCI, the applicant 'must be willing to meet work expectations and pressures associated with handling marquee athletes'; and they should help in 'developing a world-class Indian cricket team that deliver sustained success in all conditions and formats, inspiring current and future generations of cricketers and stakeholders with their approach to the game'.

Team India's current head coach Rahul Dravid's stint will come to an end after the conclusion of the T20 World Cup. Dravid has already said that he does not want the job for a third term.

Meanwhile KKR mentor Gautam Gambhir is reportedly leading the race to be appointed as head coach of the Indian cricket team. sources stated.

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
