





RBI keeps repo rate unchanged

Mumbai, August 8: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Thursday expectedly kept the benchmark interest rate (repo rate) and stance unchanged for the ninth straight policy meeting, saying it cannot afford to look through persisting high food inflation and has to remain vigilant to prevent spillover.

Retaining its unambiguous focus on inflation, the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), which consists of three RBI and three external members, kept the benchmark repurchase or repo rate unchanged at 6.50 per cent.

Four out of the six members of MPC voted in favour of the rate decision. The panel, whose four-year term ends in October, also decided to retain a policy stance at 'withdrawal of accommodation' to aid MPC's focus on bringing inflation towards its 4 per cent target.

Bhattacharjee, a stalwart of the Communist Party of India (Marxist),

was known for his efforts to bring industrialisation to the state, an endeavour that,

despite his best intentions, eventually led to the downfall of the Left Front government after 34 years of continuous rule. Bhattacharjee is survived by wife Mira and daughter Suchetana. Despite his failing health in recent years. Bhattacharjee remained a revered figure in Bengal's po-

Waqf heat singes House

New Delhi, August 8: The Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2024 was introduced in Lok Sabha Thursday and referred to a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) after a heated debate, with the government asserting the proposed law did not intend to interfere with the functioning of mosques, and the Opposition dubbing it an attack on the Constitution as well as a ploy to target Muslims before elections.

Speaker Om Birla said he will talk with leaders of all parties for constituting the JPC.

Soon after Union Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju sought leave to introduce the Bill, Opposition INDIA MPs strongly protested it, calling it an 'attack' on the Constitution and aimed at targeting Muslims.

Congress MP KC Venugopal, who had submitted notice to oppose its introduction, accused the government of violating the right to freedom of religion and claimed the legislation was being brought with an eye on the up-

coming Assembly polls in states like Maharashtra.

'This is a draconian law and a direct attack on freedom of religion....Next you will go for Christians, then Jains," he said. SP chief Akhilesh Yadav said the

Bill was being introduced to appease the BJP's hardcore supporters. "What is the point of including non-Muslims in Waqf boards when this is not done in other religious bodies?" he asked. NCP-Sharadchandra Pawar MP Supriya Sule said her party opposed the Bill as it was against a particular minority community. "Look at what is happening in Bangladesh, there is so much pain. It is the moral duty of a country to protect minorities," she said.

All India Mailis-e-Ittehadul

Muslimeen chairperson Asaduddin Owaisi claimed that the House did not have the competence to make the amendments. "It is a grave attack on the basic structure of the Constitution as it violates the principle of judicial independence and separation of powers," he said.

'You are enemies of Muslims and this Bill is evidence of that," Owaisi said. Defending the Bill and hitting out

at the Congress, Rijiju said the Wakf Act of 1995 did not serve its purpose and the amendments were necessitated as the Congress could not achieve the reform it should have.

He said in the earlier law there was no provision to challenge or review the order or judgement of the tribunal. "Now, provision was being made for verdicts to be challenged at higher courts." he said.

\$1.4mn watch captures Albania's history

Tirana, August 8: Albanian jeweller Pirro Ruco laboured day and night for five years to capture the essence of his country in a spectacular luxury watch.

Now the timepiece, worth roughly \$1.4 million, is set to face off against the best watches from across the world at the watchmaking Grand Prix in Geneva in November.

Set under a sapphire dome, the hours are marked by 12 golden folk dancers – each in a different regional dress – set on Murano glass, while the minute and the hour hands are adorned with eagle talons in homage to Albania's national symbol.

Ruco's rollercoaster rise mirrors that of Albania, from poverty and isolation as the most closed communist regime in Europe to rollicking capitalism.



Over one crore women & children to get vaccination

Bhubaneswar, August 8: Health and Family and Welfare (HFW) department Thursday said more than one crore women of reproductive age (WRA) and children across the state will be vaccinated on national deworming day (NDD) August 10.

The mop-up round will take place August 17 for those beneficiaries who missed the dose on coming Saturday, the officials informed.

Addressing the media here, Family Welfare director Sanjukta Sahoo said, "During NDD, the children aged between six and 19 years and women of reproductive age (20-24 years) will be provided with Albendazole tablet while children aged one to five years will be administered ageappropriate Albendazole suspension at respective schools and Anganwadi centres facilitated by teachers, Anganwadi and ASHA workers"

"Lymphatic Filariasis-Mass Drug Administration (LFMDA) will be implemented in identified Implementation Unit (IU) / blocks of 11 districts including Angul, Bargarh, Dhenkanal, Ganjam Jharsuguda, Jajpur, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Sambalpur, Subarnapur and Sundargarh in which, children aged 1-2 years will be provided with Albendazole suspension under NDD. In rest of the blocks of these 11 districts where LF-MDA is not implemented, children



The children will be given Albendazole (in tablet or suspension form) and women of reproductive age will be distributed Albendazole tablets. For those who would miss the dose August 10, a deworming mop-up round will be held August 17

and women will be covered under NDD," she said.

According HFW department, NDD round will be held in 19 districts including Balasore, Bhadrak, Bolangir, Boudh, Cuttack, Deogarh, Gajapati, Jagatsighpur, Kendrapara, Kalahandi, Kandhamal, Khurda, Koraput, Malkangiri, Nayagarh, Nabrangpur, Nuapada, Rayagada

Also, Lymphatic Filariasis-Mass Drug Administration (LFMDA) will be implemented in some IU/blocks of 11 districts including Angul, Bargarh, Dhenkanal, Ganjam Jharsuguda, Jajpur, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Sambalpur and Sundargarh.

"Along with the deworming

campaign, vitamin A supplementation programme will also be implemented. The children aged nine to 60 months will receive age-appropriate vitamin A solutions at routine immunisation sites and at special village health sanitation centres Nutrition Day, officials said.

"National Deworming Day is vital initiative in safeguarding the health of our children and communities. The campaign aims to improve the overall health, nutritional status, access to education, and quality of life of children and women of reproductive age," Unicef's Nutrition Specialist Sourav Bhattacharjee said.

Odisha accords Habitat Rights to three PVTGs under FRA

Bhubaneswar, August 8: Odisha has become a leading state in the entire nation to accord habitat rights to three Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) under the Forest Rights Act (FRA)

With the recognition of the habitat rights of Juangs, in tribaldominated Keonihar district August 7 by the district-level committee (DLC), the state has become a forerunner with three habitat rights recognised for the PVTGs, the maximum in the country.

Earlier August 6, the habitat rights of Juang PVTG community of Jajpur district was approved by the respective DLCs.

Paudi Bhuyan of Deogarh district was the first PVTG community in the state to receive the habitat rights title March 7,

While habitat rights of Paudi Bhuyan has been recognised

over 32 villages under Barkote block, habitat rights of Juangs in Jajpur has been recognised covering 13 villages under Sukinda block, and habitat rights for Juangs in Keonihar has been recognised covering 134 villages across four blocks.

PVTGs have been the stewards of their ancestral lands for generations, practicing sustainable living and preserving their rich cultural heritage. This approval not only affirms their rights but also reinforces the importance of respecting and upholding the traditions and lifestyles of indigenous populations.

Recognition of habitat rights under FRA is a significant step in recognising and safeguarding the rights of indigenous

communities. The Juangs of Keonjhar will become the sixth such title awarded under the category along with the Juangs of Jajpur and Paudi Bhuyans of Deogarh



Madhya Pradesh and Kamar PVTG and Baiga PVTG in Chhattisgarh, having legal title and rights over their forest habitats.

ST & SC Development, Minorities and Backward Classes Welfare Minister Nityananda Gond, while expressing his happiness over the development, said, "Our pro-people government is always there to see overall development of the tribal communities and especially the PVTGs, and with this Habitat Rights recognition, this will be more defined and concrete.'

Habitat for the PVTGs refers to an area where these communities have both spiritual and material connections.

The spiritual connection implies an area that is important to fulfil the socio-cultural needs of the community. This area includes burial grounds, birthplaces, temples, deities, ancestral lands, or areas used for any other socio-cultural purposes, such as festivals and processions.

This area also includes places

of customary land use for livelihood generation such as forest produce collection, fishing sources, cultivation areas, and seasonal migratory lands.

Habitat Rights under FRA can be defined as a bundle of rights consisting of these connections with the landscape: livelihood, social, and cultural practices embedded in the territory that forms their habitat.

Odisha houses 13 PVTGs - the highest among all the States and Union Territories of India.

The PVTGs inhabit 1,683 villages/settlements distributed in 285 gram panchayats (GPs) under 42 blocks and 14 districts of Odisha.

There are as many as 1,79,742 households with a total population of 7,73,092. All the 13 PVTGs have different socio-cultural and socio-political significance and different habitat aspects.

SC & ST Research and Training Institute (SCSTRTI), Bhubaneswar, has undertaken the research study on the determination and mapping of Habitat Rights of PVTGs under FRA across Odisha wherein Habitat Rights mapping for all 13 PVTGs have been done.

Under the guidance of SC-STRTI and with the support of partner NGO Vasundhara, the process of Habitat Rights determination and claim-making was done by the traditional institutions of each of the

Out of the 13 PVTGs, the Habitat Rights claims for 9 PVTGs across 14 micro-projects have been submitted at Subdivision Level Committees (SDLC) and are at various stages of approval at SDLC and DLC, official sources said.

ST & SC Development, Minorities and Backward Classes Welfare Commissioner-cum-Secretary Roopa Roshan Sahoo said, "The Habitat Rights for PVTG communities is a remarkable achievement.



Bhubaneswar, August 8: The Odisha Police Crime Branch Thursday arrested six cybercriminals from Gujarat and Tamil Nadu who had allegedly swindled Rs 71.95 lakh from a City resident.

The accused were identified as Arun Shaju, Seenu R and Vasu J -- natives of Tamil Nadu; and Jaimin Kukdeja Megharajbhai,



Brijesh Dayabhai Sathiya and Udaya Rameshbhai from Gujarat.

A probe was launched following a complaint by the victim, February 28

this year, who alleged that the fraudsters compelled him to join two whatsapp groups, GSQT and IBGI-NON, for share market trading. After joining the group January 23, 2024, a Crime Branch official said, the unsuspecting victim received lucrative profits on initial investments, which prompted him to make a cumulative investment of Rs 71.95 lakh in 10 different bank accounts till February 22. However, the profits did not show up in his bank account afterwards. When he queried with the scammers over the issue, they allegedly demanded more investment threatening that he will lose all his money if he failed to do so.

It was only then the victim realised he had been duped and approached the Crime Branch with a com-

How Safe Is AI

huge industry has emerged in recent years as China, the United States, the United Kingdom, and the European Union have made the safety of artificial intelligence a top priority. Obviously, any technology - from cars and pharmaceuticals to machine tools and lawnmowers - should be designed as safely as possible (one wishes that more scrutiny had been brought to bear on social media during its early days).

But simply raising safety concerns isn't enough. In the case of AI, the debate is focused far too much on "safety against catastrophic risks due to AGI (Artificial General Intelligence)," meaning a superintelligence that can outperform all humans in most cognitive tasks. At issue is the question of "alignment": whether AI models produce results that match their users' and designers' objectives and values a topic that leads to various sci-fi scenarios in which a superintelligent AI emerges and destroys humanity. The best-selling author Brian Christian's The Alignment Problem is focused mostly on AGI, and the same concerns have led Anthropic, one of the main companies in the field, to build models with their own "constitutions" enshrining ethical values and principles

But there are at least two reasons why these approaches may be misguided. First, the current safety debate not only (unhelpfully) anthropomorphises AI; it also leads us to focus on the wrong targets. Since any technology can be used for good or bad, what ultimately matters is who controls it, what their objectives are, and what kind of regulations they are subjected to.

No amount of safety research would have prevented a car from being used as a weapon at the white supremacist rally in Charlottesville, Virginia in 2017. If we accept the premise that AI systems have their own personalities, we might conclude that our only option is to ensure that they have the right values and constitutions in the abstract. But the premise is false, and the proposed solution would fall far short.

To be sure, the counterargument is that if AGI was ever achieved, it really would matter whether the system was "aligned" with human objectives, because no guardrails would be left to contain the cunning of a superintelligence. But this claim brings us to the second problem with much of the AI safety discussion. Even if we are on the path to AGI (which seems highly unlikely), the most immediate danger would still be misuses of non-superintelligent AI by humans.

Suppose that there is some time (T) in the future (say 2040) when AGI will be invented, and that until this time arrives, AI systems that don't have AGI will still be non-autonomous. (If they were to become self-acting before AGI, let that day be T.) Now consider the situation one year before T. By that point, AI systems will have become highly capable (by dint of being on the cusp of superintelligence), and the question that we would want to ask is:

Who is in control right now? The answer would of course be human agents, either individually or collectively in the form of a government, a consortium, or a corporation. To simplify the discussion, let me refer to the human agents in charge of AI at this point as Corporation X. This company (it could also be more than one company, which might be even worse, as we will see) would be able to use its AI capabilities for any purpose it wants. If it wanted to destroy democracy and enslave people, it could do so. The threat that so many commentators impute to AGI

would already have arrived before AGI. In fact, the situation would probably be worse than this description, because Corporation X could bring about a similar outcome even if its intention was not to destroy democracy. If its own objectives were not fully aligned with democracy (which is inevitable), democracy could suffer as an unintended consequence (as has been the case

with social media). For example, inequality exceeding some threshold may jeopardize the proper functioning of democracy; but that fact would not stop Corporation X from doing everything it could to enrich itself or its shareholders. Any guardrails built into its AI models to prevent malicious use would not matter, because Corporation X could still use its technology however it wants.

Likewise, if there were two companies, Corporation X and Corporation Y, that controlled highly capable AI models, either one of them, or both, could still pursue aims that are damaging to social cohesion, democracy, and human freedom. (And no, the argument that they would constrain each other is not convincing. If anything, their competition could make them even more ruthless.)


Thus, even if we get what most AI safety researchers want - proper alignment and constraints on AGI – we will not be safe. The implications of this conclusion should be obvious: We need much stronger institutions for reining in the tech companies, and much stronger forms of democratic and civic action to keep governments that control AI accountable. This challenge is quite separate and distinct from addressing biases in AI models or their alignment with human objec-

Why, then, are we so fixated on the potential behaviour of anthropomorphized AI? Some of it is hype, which helps the tech industry attract more talent and investment. The more that everyone is talking about how a superintelligent AI might act, the more the public will start to think that AGI is imminent.

Retail and institutional investors will pour into the next big thing, and tech executives who grew up on sci-fi depictions of superintelligent AI will get another free pass. We should start paying more attention to the more immediate risks.

SAGA OF A CULTURE WAR

THE FORMER ODISHA CHIEF MINISTER'S CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE 1971 WAR AND HER ADVOCACY FOR JUSTICE AND HUMAN RIGHTS HAVE LEFT AN INDELIBLE MARK ON SOUTH ASIAN HISTORY

andini Satpathy, the formidable Minister Information Broadcasting in Indira Gandhi's government, played a pivotal role during the 1971 Bangladesh Liberation War. This war was not just a conflict between East and West Pakistan but a profound clash of cultures. On one side were the meat-eating Punjabi Pathans of the Northwest, and on the other were the East Indian Muslims and Hindus, bonded by their shared struggles with cyclones, droughts, and famines, sustaining themselves with humble portions of fish and rice.

The 1971 war marked the liberation of a culture discovering its depth and strength—a renaissance of the Bangla nationalist spirit. During this tumultuous period, Nandini Satpathy took it upon herself to help set up the Swadhin Bangla Betar Kendra (Radio of Independent Bangladesh). The war was waged not only on the frontlines but also on the powerful medium of radio waves. Programs like Agnishiksha (The Flame) for freedom fighters, Jagarani (Awakening), a revolutionary musical program, Rakta Shaskhar (Impression in Blood), a nationalist literary program, and Chorom Potro (Letter Ultimate) hosted by MR Akhtar, broadcasted nationalist sentiments, galvanising civil society and aiding the Mukti Bahini, the under-equipped liberation front.

When the transmitter at Chittagong was bombed by the forces of Yahya Khan, she facilitated the setting up of a radio station in Calcutta. She oversaw the workings of the day and the public broadcasts which in modern-day warfare are as important as the foot soldier. Her strategic use of media played a crucial role in shaping international opinion about the atrocities committed by the Pakistani army. An article in the April 5, 1971, issue of Pakistan Affairs

quoted the Washington Post's Lee Lescaze criticising the Indian press for influencing global views by broadcasting reports from the Free Bangla Radio. The media's account was inseparable from the events creating new sentiments of nationalism and the idea of the liberation force or the Mukti Bahini given by the philosophers and poets of the day, preceded its creation.

The cultural lines along which Bangladesh was liberated resonate deeply with many, including Lubna Marium, artistic director at Shadhona in Dhaka. "Except Delhi and Kolkata, the rest of India doesn't understand what Bangladesh stands for," she says. Despite this, the country's spiritual heritage, with its bauls, boyatis, and snake cults, has persisted. Yet, regressive ideas have been creeping in, with parents questioning traditional practices. "In Bangladesh, we aren't even conscious of somebody's religion. Disturbingly, that is now changing.

This cultural and religious fabric is something Nandini Satpathy remembered as she fought for the freedoms that 1971 tore apart and stitched back together. Her legacy continued as she translated Taslima Nasreen's

Lajja into Oriya, bringing to light the struggles of minorities in a rapidly changing Bangladesh. Nasreen's Lajja depicts the plight of a Hindu family in post-1992 Bangladesh, mirroring the persecution Satpathy had fought against decades earlier.

Nandini Satpathy, India's I&B minister and Indira Gandhi's friend, had crossed borders to help the Mukti Bahini with arms, money and to oversee that a nation comes together in letter and spirit. Her dismay at the beginning of radicalism and the decline of the youth taking over a nation, have led to this day. In 2013, she was posthumously honoured with the title Friends of Liberation War Honour along with 69 international allies for their contributions to the 1971 Liberation War. "I wish more people in India knew about the contributions she made to our freedom struggle and to the development of the identity of a culture different from the one it freed away from," feels Quazi Sazzad Ali Zahir, a veteran of the Bangladesh Liberation War. The Bangladesh government awarded him the Bir Protik gallantry award and a Padma Shri by the Indian government at the 50th anniversary of the war.

and Bangladesh finds itself amidst another crisis. The vandalisation of Bangabandhu's statue symbolises the ongoing tensions and the rising tide of radicalisation. Satpathy's prescient warnings about the dangers of extremism echo louder today. Her efforts to protect minorities and foster a secular, inclusive Bangladesh are re minders of the vigilance needed to preserve these values.

Nandini Satpathy's contributions to the 1971 war and her advocacy for justice and human rights have left an indelible mark on South Asian history Her translation of Lajja and her unwavering support for Bangladesh's minorities underscore her enduring legacy. As Bangladesh grapples with its current challenges, the principles she championed remain as relevant and necessary as ever.

In Kazi Nazrul Islam's poem Bidroh (Rebellion), the call to defy oppression and reclaim dignity is both stirring and profound, when he writes, "O, my brothers! Stand up and take your stand, for the dawn of freedom is at hand. Shatter the chains that bind your soul, rise in rebel-

lion, and reclaim your goal." As Nazrul's words resonate with the spirit of rebellion and resilience that was once needed to deliver a nation from genocide, it becomes crucial for today's generation to accept that freedoms are inherited and earned by people like Bangabandhu Sheikh Muiibur Rahman whose van dalised statue stands as a tragic reminder of the fragility of these freedoms. Bangabandhu, who led Bangladesh to independence and rescued it from the horrors of genocide, symbolises the triumph of liberty and human dignity. The desecration of the structures erected in his honour underscores a concerning erosion of the values he fought for.

tunities and developing a skilled workforce. The Budget 2024 addressed this issue to some extent by allocating Rs 1.48 trillion towards education, employment and skilling. This represents a significant 30% increase compared to the previous financial year. Job creation has become a challenge for the government.

The Union Budget outlined five key schemes for facilitating employment and skilling for around four crore youths over a period of five years. One of these schemes is the internship programme for at least one crore youths in the top 500 companies over a period of five years.

Though complete details are vet to be chalked out, some key guidelines were announced. Youths between 21 to 24 years are eligible to apply for internship through an online portal. Candidates qualified from IITs, IIMs, IISERs, CA or CMA are not eligible to apply for the internship. Youths from non-professional streams and from tier III, tier IV institutions will have an opportunity to enter into the top companies for internship. However, it is a difficult task for

The presng enough employment oppor- ent scheme can be a magic wand for the newcomers to acquire skills in a leading organisation and increase their chance of employability. The period of internship is 12 months and the organisation is expected to provide actual working experience on a skill for six months at least.

Monthly allowance of Rs 5000 and a onetime additional payout of Rs 6000 will be given to the trainees. The organisation has to bear 10% of the internship allowance, i.e., Rs 6000 and training cost from their CSR funds. The first phase of the scheme is for two years and the second phase will be for three years.

The scheme is ambitious and well-planned, but providing internships to one crore youths across 500 top companies over five years is a challenging endeavour. This requires each company to accommodate around 20,000 interns over five years, or 4,000 per year, which is a substantial task even for large organisations. However, if companies participate earnestly, this innovative scheme could achieve its goals. Skill development is a joint responsibility of both the government and industry. As in-

India, home to the world's the humanities graduates to get dustry is one of the major stake-mographic dividend, which is tribute to the cause of skill development. For instance, the travel booking firm EaseMyTrip has announced plans to hire over 500 interns in the next 3 to 6 months to support the government's proposed internship programme.

Even rural youth are now favoring jobs in urban areas. According to a report by Global Development Incubator (GDI) titled "State of Rural Youth Employment - 2024," 70 to 85% of over 5,000 individuals surveyed in rural India expressed a desire to be employed in manufacturing. retail, or service sectors. This reveals the changing trends of employment preferences of the youth across the country.

The National Policy for Skill Development Entrepreneurship 2015 pointed out that we are one of the world's youngest nations, with over 62% of its population in the working age group (15-59 years) and more than 54% below 25 years of age. In the next 20 years, while the labour force in industrialised countries is projected to decline by 4%, India's labour force is expected to grow by 32%. This presents both a significant challenge and a tremendous opportunity. To capitalise on this de-

The advantages of internship are numerous. Internships provide hands-on experience in a real-world environment, helping students apply theoretical knowledge to practical situations. Interns develop a range of skills, including technical, interpersonal, and soft skills, which are essential for career success. The employment readiness capability of the candidates will be increased as employers prefer to pick the candidates with internship experience. Successful completion will enhance the confidence of the candidates which will help them to face interviews and tackle professional challenges. The guidelines are to be made carefully by the government keeping in view the importance of internship for the Indian youth so that the proposed internship scheme can be game changer in the sphere of youth unemployment.

Wildlife activists decry proposed translocation of blackbucks to Puri



Berhampur, August 8: Wildlife activists have opposed the proposed translocation of blackbucks from Ganjam district to Balukhand Wildlife Sanctuary and other locations in Puri.

Amulya Upadhyaya, president of the Blackbuck Conservation Society, expressed concerns about the survival of blackbucks if moved from their natural habitat in Ganjam to Puri district.

"The risk to their survival in a new landscape is significant.

Upadhyaya said. Blackbucks had been sighted in Balukhand sanctuary but became locally extinct there over the past two decades. As part of a habitat recovery programme, the wildlife organisation proposed relocating the animals from the overcrowded Ganjam district, with some already moved from Nandankanan to the sanctuary in June. Upadhyaya emphasised the need for wildlife officials to study why blackbucks previously went extinct in the Balukhand-Konark area before any further translocation.

He noted that Ganjam's residents have a strong sentimental attachment to blackbucks and have protected them despite crop

Despite natural calamities, blackbuck population in Ganjam has tripled over the past 12 years. A census by the state Forest department in January recorded 7.743 blackbucks in the district. up from 2,194 in 2011. The population was estimated at 6,885 in 2020 and 7,352 in 2021, official sources said.

Rather than relocating the blackbucks, Upadhyaya and other activists urged the government to improve their habitats and enhance tourist facilities.

Krushna Gouda, another activist, highlighted that visitors from distant places come to Bhetanai near Aska in Ganjam to see the blackbucks in their natural habitat.

The activists plan to meet the state's Forest, Environment, and Climate Change Minister Ganesh Ram Singhkhuntia and senior officers to request a reconsideration of the translocation decision.

BINKA DOUBLE MURDER

Excessive boozing led to fratricide, suicide

Sonepur, August 8: The death of two cousins at Chulimal village under Bhandar panchayat and Binka police limits Tuesday evening after firing from the police service pistol took place due to over consumption of liquor and sudden outburst of anger while partying, police said Thursday.

In this incident, Sonepur MLA Niranjan Pujari's Personal Security Officer (PSO) Manoj Jhankar, 30, and his uncle's son, Seshadev Jhankar, 24, were killed. The incident occurred in a fit of rage due to excessive liquor consumption by the two deceased.

This was stated here by IG Himanshu Lal (Northern Range) at a press meet held at the district police headquarters here in the

presence of SP Yashpratap Shrimal, Thursday while ruling out any past enmity in the case. Two other persons Debashis Bishi and Okil Bishi were also partying with them. While Debashis managed to return home, Okil lost his sense and was found lying at 40m distance from the crime scene.

Manoj first shot dead Sheshadev with his service pistol and later fatally shot himself out of remorse. The incident occured when the two were dead drunk. Sheshadev took the service pistol of Manoj and made five rounds of blank firing.

This angered Manoj as he feared departmental action due to misuse of his service pistol. Enraged, he fired at Seshadev from point blank range. Later, he lost his mental balance and took his own life out of remorse. The two cousins succumbed on the spot.

Man surrenders at police , station after killing wife

Jajpur, August 8: A 52-year-old man allegedly killed his wife over a family dispute in Jajpur district and later surrendered himself at a police station, an official said Thursday.

The accused has been identified as Abhimanyu Sahoo of Narayanpur village while the deceased is Sabita Sahoo (47).

As per reports, Abhimanyu, an electrician by profession, was married to Sabita for around 25 years and they had a turbulent relationship for the last several years as they had no issue.

The childless couple used to fight with each other over not being blessed with a child while blaming each other for the cause.

Sabita picked up an argument with Abhimanyu over a minor domestic issue when the latter returned home from work Wednesday afternoon. Soon the

argument between the couple turned into a violent quarrel.

In a fit of rage, Abhimanyu stabbed his wife with a sharp weapon leaving her profusely bleeding. After committing the crime Abhimanyu fled the village and finally surrendered before the local police Wednesday night.

Abhimanyu's mother, who was out of home when the incident happened, found her daughter-in-law lying in a pool of blood on the floor of the house when she returned. She then raised an alarm following which neighbours rushed Sabita to Mangalpur Community Health Centre (CHC), where doctors declared her dead on arrival.

Jajpur SDPO Satyabrata Lenka said that Abhimanyu has been arrested, while arrangements are being made for Sabita's postmortem examination.





Bharatiya Vayuyan Vidheyak to address discrepancies in aviation law

New Delhi, August 8: The government Thursday said the Bhartiya Vayuyan Vidheyak Bill 2024, which seeks to replace the 90-year-old Aircraft Act, would address the current discrepancies in the aviation law and help the industry grow.

Speaking during a discussion on the Bill in the Lok Sabha, Aviation Minister Kinjarapu Rammohan Naidu underscored the need for the new legislation, noting that the Aircraft Act, 1934 has become outdated due to its numerous amendments over the years.

The Bill, which was introduced in the Lok Sabha July 31, is intended to "regulate various aspects of the aviation industry, including the design, manufacture, maintenance, operation, and sale of aircraft"

Naidu explained that the 1934 Act had undergone 21 amendments, resulting in ambiguities and contradictions, particularly regarding the powers and functions of internal organizations like the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA).

He pointed out that these issues have created confusion within the aviation sector, making it difficult for the relevant authorities to operate effectively.

"Because of this, the whole structuring of the Act itself has led to a lot of ambiguity and contradictions in terms of powers and functions of certain in ternal organizations," he said.

The minister stressed that there was a "dire need to structurise the whole Act," which is why the government introduced the new legislation. Naidu emphasised his openness to suggestions from other members of Parliament.

He also touched upon the importance of aligning India's aviation laws with global standards. stating that the new Bill would address the current discrepancies and help the industry grow.

Congress MP Adoor Prakash raised concerns about the Bill.

Parties urge immediate Assembly polls in J&K

Srinagar, August 8: With the Supreme Court deadline for holding Assembly polls looming large, the Election Commission (EC) held a series of meetings in Jammu and Kashmir Thursday with political parties and district heads of the civil administration and police in order to get a feedback for holding the election.

The EC team, led by Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Rajiv Kumar and including election commissioners Gyanesh Kumar and SS Sandhu, met representatives of registered political parties, including the National Conference (NC), People's Democratic Party (PDP), Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Congress and Jammu and Kashmir Panthers Party (JKPP), at the International Convention Centre (SKICC) here.

Immediate Assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir was the dominant demand of all the political leaders who met the visiting EC team.

Assembly polls have not been held in Jammu and Kashmir since 2014. The polls were due to be held in early 2019 following the dissolution of the legislative body of the erstwhile state in 2018. However, after the bifurcation of Jammu and Kashmir into Union territories in August 2019, the Assembly polls could not be held due to various reasons, including a delimitation exercise that was completed in 2022.

Talking to reporters after party-wise meetings with the EC delegation, the leaders said they were unanimous in their de-



polls in Jammu and Kashmir. They also demanded that a

level-playing field should be ensured in the polls for the restoration of democracy in the Union Territory. The Supreme Court has directed the Centre to conclude the election process by September 30. The poll schedule is yet to be announced by the EC, with just a little over seven weeks left for the deadline. The BJP also batted for im-

mediate Assembly polls. Its Jammu and Kashmir unit spokesperson RS Pathania said. 'We told the EC that we want the election to be conducted as soon as possible." The party wants the polls to be held within the apex court's deadline, he added

NC's Kashmir provincial president Nasir Aslam Wani, who led a five-member party delegation to meet the EC officials, said, "Our only demand is that the people of Jammu and Kashmir now want to have their own government. We told the EC that you came here many times and we met you but now, there should be some definite decision on it.

Wani said the party also demanded a level-playing field in terms of providing a secure environment for the polls.

5 Indians arrested at Nepal airport

Kathmandu: Five Indians were arrested in Nepal on Thursday for allegedly carrying millions of Nepali rupees without disclosing any source, the police said, Prakash Narayan Gupta (44), Ajaya Mishra (43), Ashish Gupta (45), Bimal Gupta (46) and Pankai Jaiswa (39), all Indian nationals, were arrested from Raniha Airport in Nepalguni Municipality in western Nepal during a security check as they were about to board a Kathmandubound plane, the police said. The police said they have recovered 2.4 million Nepali Rupees from them without any valid supporting documents.

Quake hits Japan

Tokyo: A 7.1-magnitude earthquake struck Miyazaki prefecture and other areas in southwestern Japan Thursday, prompting the country's weather agency to issue its Nankai Trough Earthquake Extra Information for the first time. The earthquake, measuring lower 6 on the Japanese seismic intensity scale of 7, occurred at 1643 local time at a depth of 30 kilometers off the waters of Hyuga-nada in southern Kyushu, one of the country's four main islands, according to the Japan Meteorological Agency (JMA). Shortly afterwards, the JMA started investigating whether this earthquake is related to the possibility of a large-scale quake anticipated along the Nankai Trough, which experts have warned for years.

Cab mins swear in amid protest

Nairobi: Police hurled tear gas at protesters calling for the President's resignation in the Kenyan capital Thursday as a new Cabinet was sworn in. The protests in Nairobi were organised by activists upset with President William Ruto even after he dismissed almost all of his ministers and added opposition members to what he called a "broad-based" government. Businesses in the city were closed and public transport vehicles remained out of the central business district where they normally operate.

Boat explosion in Nigeria kills 20

Cairo, August 8: Israeli forces stepped up strikes across the Gaza Strip Thursday, killing at least 40 people, Palestinian medics said, in further battle with Hamas-led militants as Israel braced for potential wider war in the region.

Israeli airstrikes hit a cluster of houses in central Gaza's Al-Bureij camp, killing at least 15 people, and the nearby Al-Nuseirat camp, killed four, medics said. Nuseirat and Bureij are among the densely populated enclave's eight historic camps and seen by Israel as strongholds of armed militants.

Israeli aircraft also bombed a house in the heart of Gaza City in the north, killing five Palestinians, while another airstrike in the southern city of Khan Younis killed one person and wounded others, according to medics.

The armed wings of Hamas and Islamic Jihad said they were firing anti-tank rockets and mortar bombs at Israeli forces operating across Gaza, causing deaths and injuries among them.



RBI keeps hawkish stance

■ The central bank keeps interest rate unchanged for ninth time in a row despite global market volatility

Mumbai, August 8: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) kept its key interest rate unchanged Thursday, as widely expected, retaining its focus on bringing inflation down even as global market volatility left other major central banks poised to ease pol-

The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), which consists of three RBI and three external members, kept the reporate unchanged at $6.\overline{5}0\%$ for a ninth straight policy

Four out of six MPC members voted in favour of the rate decision. The MPC last changed rates in February 2023, when the policy rate was raised to 6.50%.

The monetary policy stance was retained at 'withdrawal of accommodation' to aid the MPC's focus on bringing inflation towards the target, with four of the six members voting in its favour.

It is important for monetary policy to stay the course in bringing inflation down towards its 4% medium term target, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said, adding that India's food inflation remains "stubbornly" high.

"Growth remains resilient, inflation has been trending downward and we have made progress in achieving price stability, but we have more distance to cover' Das said. Ensuring price stability is important for sustainable growth, he added.





"The domestic market reversed its earlier gains as RBI's held its current policy rates with a caution to revise upward the CPI and moderate the growth forecast for Q1," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geoilt Financial Services said.

Among 30 Sensex firms, Asian Paints, Infosys, JSW Steel, UltraTech Cement, Power Grid, Larsen & Toubro, HCL Technologies and Tata Steel were the biggest laggards. Tata Motors, HDFC Bank, Bharti Airtel, ITC, IndusInd Bank and Axis Bank were the gainers.

In the broader market, the BSE midcap gauge declined 0.44 per cent and smallcap index dipped 0.16 per cent. Among the indices, metal tanked 2.02 per cent. WRESTLER ANNOUNCES HER DECISION TO RETIRE A DAY AFTER BEING DISQUALIFIED FOR BEING 100 GRAMS OVERWEIGHT

Paris, August 8: Her long-cherished Olympic dream shattered by a cruel twist of fate, a crestfallen Vinesh Phogat bid adieu to her international wrestling career Thursday. She said that she doesn't have the strength to continue anymore. The 29-year-old announced her decision on social media, seeking forgiveness from everyone who supported her. Vinesh, a three-time Olympian

addressed her mother Premlata in her farewell note. "Ma, wrestling has won, I have lost. Please forgive me, your dreams and my courage, everything is broken," she said. "I don't have any more strength now. Goodbye wrestling 2001-2024. I shall be indebted to you all. Forgive (me),' added the two-time World Championships bronze medallist

Vinesh's stunning decision comes a day after she appealed against her disqualification from the Olympic finals in the Court of Arbitration for Sports (CAS) demanding that she be awarded a joint silver medal. The matter is to come up for hearing later in the day.

Vinesh had scripted history by becoming the first Indian woman wrestler to reach the gold medal bout in her category Tuesday night. She was assured of at least a silver medal before the disqualification. She has won gold medals in both the Asian and Commonwealth Games.

For the past one year, Vinesh had also been the face of fierce protests against former Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) head Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, who has been accused of sexual harassment by women grapplers

Vinesh, who has always competed in the 53kg category, was forced to come down to 50kg

She eventually dropped to 50kg category to stay in the hunt for an Olympic berth and against all odds, made it too.



"I don't like doing things like everyone else," Finot said. "It was the best way I could express my life and there can be no better place than the Olympics as we are both Olympians.

IHF promoting gender equality

Paris: In line with the Paris Olympics' goal to achieve gender equality, the International Hockey Federation (FIH) has showcased its commitment to inclusion and diversity by introducing mixed-gender on-field umpiring for the first time in the sport's Olympic history. This marks a significant change, as mixed-gender umpiring has not been a regular occurrence at the Olympic Games. In Paris, umpires and technical officials are evenly split between genders, with 50:50 ratio. "Gender equality is anchored into hockey's DNA, and FIH won't miss any opportunity to promote it. With the introduction of mixed-gender on-field umpiring at the Olympics, FIH is showcasing once more its determination towards a more gender-equal sport and society," said FIH president Tayyab Ikram here Thursday.

Antim deported, faces 3-yr ban

Major embarrassment for IOA after wrestler gives her official card to sister to enter Games village

Paris. August 8: In a major em barrassment for the country, wrestler Antim Panghal and her entire entourage has been deported from here for a major disciplinary breach. Antim and her entire team boarded the flight from here Thursday night. It has been alleged that the young wrestler handed her official accreditation card to her sister who was caught by security while leaving the Games Village.

Panghal had crashed out of the Paris Olympics after losing her opening bout in the women's 53kg Wednesday. She had replaced Vinesh Phogat in the 53kg category, but was completely outplayed by her Turkiye opponent and lost 0-10.

"The Indian Olympic Association has decided to fly wrestler Antim and her support staff back after a disciplinary breach was brought to IOA's notice by the French authorities," the body said in a statement, Thursday.

IOA sources both here and in New Delhi stated that Antim and her entire team are set to be banned for three years from wrestling. However, the decision will be formally announced only

after they return from Paris. While IOA did not share what the disciplinary breach was, a source shared the details. "Instead of heading to the Games village after her loss, she reached the hotel where her coach Bhagat Singh and sparring partner Vikas, who is actually her coach, were staying. Antim asked her

to go to the Games village and come back with her belongings. Her sister was caught for impersonation and was taken to a police station to record her statement," the source informed. The 19-year-old U20 World Champion Antim was also called by police to record her statement.

Poor show by Indian runners

Paris, August 8: National record holder Jyothi Yarraji failed to make the semifinals of women's 100m hurdle after finishing fourth in her repechage heat at the Paris Olympics here Thursday. The first Indian to compete in the 100m hurdles in the Olympics, the debutant produced a below-par show as she clocked 13.17s in her repechage heat to finish 16th overall out of 40 total runners. It was well below the 24-yearold's national record of 12.78s and even worse than the 13.16s she clocked in her heats Wednesday. The top two in each repechage heat advanced to the semifinals.

South Africa's Marioune Fourie (12.79s) and Dutch athlete Maayke Tjin-A-Lim (12.87s) advanced to the semifinals from Heat 1.

Earlier late Wednesday evening, Avinash Sable failed to keep pace with the best in the business as he finished 11th in the men's 3000m steeplechase final here.

The 29-year-old Sable clocked 8 minutes 14.18 seconds while crossing the finish line after running in the lead briefly in the dramatic race. Sable had recently broken his own national record with a time of 8:09.91 seconds at the Paris Diamond League.

Lifter finishes 4th, only 1kg behind Thai competitor who got bronze 1000 GRAMS DASH MIRABAI'S DREAM

Paris, August 8: One hundred grams had dashed Vinesh Phogat's hope of getting an Olympic medal. For weightlifter Mirabai Chanu it was 1,000 grams that prevented her from getting a medal. She came tantalisingly close to clinching a second Olympic medal but a faltered lift in her final attempt cruelly snatched the dream from her grasp, leaving her with a fourth place finish in the women's 49kg event at the Olympics here late Wednesday evening.

Mirabai lifted a total of 199kg

(88kg+111kg) at the South Paris Arena. It was three kilograms less than what she heaved at the Tokyo Olympics (202 kg) for a silver medal. She was just one kilogram short of Thai weightlifter Surodchana Khambao who bagged the bronze for her effort of 200kg (88kg+112kg)

The former World Champion had done well to keep herself in medal contention after the snatch event but her failure to lift 114kg in her final clean and jerk attempt cost her dearly. Had she succeeded she would have bagged the bronze medal.

"I am happy with the performance because I managed

this despite having very little time for recovery," Mirabai told

reporters. "I was managing 85kg in practice in snatch and I did it in the competition too. I was confident about clean and jerk also. It was my third day of the women's problem (periods) and that also affected me a bit. However I did my best and I have no complaints," added the Indian lifter.

China's Hou Zhihui smashed the clean and jerk Olympic record as she successfully defended her title with an effort of 206kg (89kg+117kg). Romanian — Mihaela Cambei took home the silver with total of 205kg (93kg+112kg).

Paris, August 8: "This is the perfect way to finish," said iconic Indian goalkeeper PR Sreejesh here Thursday after India had defeated Spain 2-1 to win the hockey bronze for the second consecutive time. Sreeiesh ruled out any possibility of reversing his decision to retire from international hockey. Before the start of the game he had said that his career has been 'nothing short of extra-ordinary and he couldn't have asked for more'

"I think this is the better way to finish an Olympic Games, with a medal. We are not going home empty-handed, that's a great thing," Sreejesh said on 'Jio Cinema'

"I respect the sentiments of people (who may have wanted him to continue). Some decisions are hard, but taking a decision at right time makes the situation more beautiful,' Sreejesh said after the match. "So, my decision stays," he asserted, when asked if he may re-

The 36-year-old from Kerala, whose illustrious career spanned 18 years, had announced before the Olympics that he would call it quits at the end of India's campaign.

"The team did a wonderful job and made this game so beautiful,' said Sreejesh. "I am happy that now I have two Olympic bronze medals (the first one from Tokyo). Tokyo has a special place in my heart. That (bronze) gave us back the confidence that we can win medals (in Olympics)," he added.

Earlier before the game, Sreejesh expressed his gratitude to the countrymen for believing

"As I stand between the posts for the final time, my heart swells with gratitude and pride. This journey, from a young boy with a dream to the man defending India's honour, has been nothing short of extraordinary," he wrote on 'X'.

2006 South Asian Games, Sreejesh was a part of various memorable wins for India, including a gold in the 2014 Asian Games and a bronze medal in the 2018 Asiad in Jakarta. He was also part of the Asian Champions Trophy-winning side in 2018, and the 2019 FIH Men's Series Finals champion team in

Paris, August 8: Young Indian grappler Aman Sehrawat lost to Japanese top-seed Rei Higuchi in the 57kg freestyle semifinal bout as the country's hopes of winning a gold medal from wrestling suffered a big blow at the Olympics here Thursday. The 21-year-old Aman will now play for the bronze medal Friday against Puerto Rico's Darian Toi Cruz.

Aman, who had raised hopes of securing a place in the final following two big victories against celebrated opponents in the earlier rounds, was no match for the 28-year-old Higuchi - the 2016 Rio Olympics silver medallist – as the Japanese toyed with the Indian to stamp his technical superiority with a 10-0 win in just over two minutes.

Higuchi's superior technique was evident in the first few seconds when he attacked Aman's legs to take a 4-0 lead. The Japanese, a former World Champion in 2022 in the 61kg category, kept up the pressure on the Indian, targeting Aman's legs and effecting regular throw downs with ease to garner six eight straight points to secure a 12-0 victory.


