



Hooch claims 2 lives; ruckus in Assembly

Berhampur/Bhubaneswar, August 21: The death toll in the Ganiam spurious liquor case rose to two Wednesday, after one more person undergoing treatment at MKCG Medical College & Hospital died, police said.

At least 15 people were receiving treatment at the medical facility after they fell ill after consuming illicit country liquor Monday.

The incident has sparked a political row as the issue was raised in the Assembly with the Opposition BJD demanding a probe by an RDC-level officer into the tragedy. Loknath Behera of Jenasahi died during treatment at the hospital Wednesday, while 60-year-old Jura Behera of the same village succumbed Tuesday night.

Excise minister Prithiviraj Harichandan Wednesday directed the transfer of the excise superintendent of Berhampur.

"All the persons involved in

such cases will be traced and strict punishment will be imposed as per law," he said.

The minister informed that as many as eight people have been arrested so far in the liquor death case in Chikiti.

"We demand the state government to inform the House about the actions taken in the incident so far. The BJP came to power with the slogan of regulating liquor, but now a hooch tragedy is taking place," Opposition chief whip Pramila Mallik said.

Congress MLA Taraprasad Bahinipati demanded adequate compensation to the families of liquor tragedy victims and stringent action against the persons responsible for the circulation of spurious liquor in Chikiti area.

BJP MLA from Chikiti. Manoranjan Dyan Samantray, blamed the previous BJD government for the tragedy and alleged that the people linked to the liquor business in the area are connected to the regional

151 MPs, MLAs face cases of crimes against women

West Bengal tops the list with 25 sitting MPs and MLAs facing charges related

to crimes against women, followed by Andhra Pradesh with 21, according to an ADR report

New Delhi, August 21: As many as 151 sitting MPs and MLAs have declared cases related to crimes against women in their election affidavits, with West Bengal having the highest number of lawmakers facing such cases, according to a recent report by a poll rights body.

For the report, the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) examined 4.693 out of 4.809 affidavits of sitting MPs and MLAs submitted to the Election Commission of India during elections between 2019 and 2024. The organisation identified 16 MPs and 135 MLAs facing cases

related to crimes against women. The 17 from Odisha are MP Jual Oram (BJP) and MLAs Braja Kishore Pradhan (BJD), Sanatan Mahakud (BJD), Prakash Chandra Sethi (BJP), Krushna Chandra Patra (BJP), Prasanta Kumar Jagadev (BJP), Rabi Narayan Naik (BJP), Ashok Mohanty (BJP), Ashrit Pattanayak (BJP), Jayanarayan Mishra (BJP), Om Prakash Mishra (BJP), Prakash Soren (BJP), Suryabanshi Suraj Sthitaprajna (BJP), Pravati Parida (BJP), Ramesh Chandra Jena (Congress), Bijaya Kumar Dalabehera (Independent), and Himanshu Sekhar Sahoo (Independent), according to the ADR report.

According to the report, there are 16 sitting MPs and MLAs who have declared cases related to rape under Indian Penal Code (IPC) Section 376, which carries a minimum sentence of 10 years and can be extend to life imprisonment. Of these, two are MPs and 14 MLAs.

The charges include repeated offenses against the same victim, further underscoring the gravity of these cases.

Among political parties, the BJP has the highest number of representatives (54 MPs and MLAs) with declared cases related to crimes against women, followed by the Congress with 23 and the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) with 17, according to the report.

Both BJP and Congress have five sitting lawmakers each facing rape charges.

The ADR has issued strong recommendations in response to these findings. It stressed on the need for political parties to refrain from giving tickets to candidates with criminal backgrounds, especially those with charges of rape and other crimes against women.

The report called for the fasttracking of court cases against MPs and MLAs, ensuring professional and thorough investigations by police.

The ADR urged voters to avoid electing candidates with such

After Mohanta, Jagannath Pradhan files nomination

Bhubaneswar, August 21: Hours after Kudumi community leader Mamata Mohanta filed her nomination as the BJP's official candidate for the Rajya Sabha bypoll Wednesday, another BJP leader Jagannath Pradhan also submitted his papers as an Independent candidate, giving rise to speculations in political circles about a rift in the party.

He was accompanied 10 BJP MLAs – Agasti Behera. Durgaprasad Nayak, Raghunath Jagdala, Rupu Bhadra. Gourishankar Majhi, Dushmanta Kumar Swain, Laxman Bag, Umacharan Mallik, Prakash Soren and Manoranjan Dyan Samantray.

Odisha BJP in-charge Vijay Pal Singh Tomar, on the other hand, clarified that Mohanta is the official BJP nominee, while Pradhan is a 'dummy candidate' meant to safeguard Mohanta's position. "Mohanta is our official candidate and Pradhan is a dummy candidate. Pradhan has been fielded for safety of the party candidate. There should be no more discussions on Pradhan's candidature," Tomar said.

He emphasised that Pradhan's role is purely precautionary and that the party would proceed with its official candidate.

Pradhan had previously contested the Bhubaneswar-Central seat in the Assembly elections,

losing narrowly to BJD's Ananta

Narayan Jena. Earlier in the day, Mohanta, accompanied by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, Tomar, and other party leaders, submitted her nomination papers to the returning officer at the Assembly.

Given the BJP's strong position in the 147-member Assembly, Mohanta is well-positioned to win the bypoll and secure the Rajya Sabha seat she vacated as a BJD member July 31. She joined the BJP the following day.

The BJP has 74 seats in the Odisha Assembly, compared to BJD's 51, Congress' 14, three Independents, and one CPI(M) legislator.

After submitting her papers, Mohanta expressed gratitude to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah, BJP president JP Nadda, and Majhi, pledging to work for the people of Odisha and her community.

Majhi expressed confidence in Mohanta's victory, saying, 'We are optimistic that she will emerge as a winner and represent Odisha in the Rajya Sabha."

Mohanta had previously been elected to the Rajya Sabha as a BJD candidate in April 2020 but resigned with 18 months remaining in her six-year term.

Odisha has 10 Rajya Sabha seats - eight held by the BJD, one by the BJP, and one is currently

Swift support latest in Trump's fake claims

Washington, August 21: Former US President Donald Trump has been active on his social media accounts as Democrats gather for their convention in Chicago, but some of his posts don't have much to do with reality.

Ahead of the Democratic National Convention, he posted a fake image of someone who looks like Vice President Kamala Harris addressing what appears to be a communist rally in Chicago with a depiction of a red banner with a communist symbol. That followed his repost of a phony video of himself dancing next to billionaire Elon Musk, one of his most vocal supporters.

Just before the convention kicked off, he reposted an image of Taylor Swift in an Uncle Sam



outfit and accepted her endorsement for his campaign,

which she had never given. They're the latest examples of how Trump is promoting im-

ages produced by artificial intelligence tools to attack his opponents or create illusions of support around his own campaign. It's in keeping with a long-

standing strategy in which Trump amplifies messages from QAnon adherents to those who deny the results of fair elections -- to score political points and satisfy his base by promoting alternate realities.

Some of the images and videos Trump has shared are cartoonish or obviously fake. Yet the rise in AI-generated content across political social media concerns experts who say it can be used to push more insidious and believable disinformation. As fake images, videos and audio clips created by generative AI models begin to saturate social media, they also risk eroding people's trust in what they see and hear.

"The AI-generated deepfakes of Taylor Swift are yet another example of AI's power to create misinformation that deceives and

defrauds voters," said Lisa Gilbert, co-president of Public Citizen, a progressive consumer rights advocacy group that has pushed for legislation to regulate AI.

One AI-generated image in Trump's Truth Social post, shared Sunday, showed women in "Swifties for Trump" shirts, a reference to the artist's devout fans. The fake image showing Swift dressed as Uncle Sam included text saying, "Taylor wants YOU to VOTE for DONALD TRUMP." In his repost of the image, Trump added, "I accept!"

One of the images Trump shared included a small satire label, though he didn't clarify whether he meant his post was in jest.

Swift, who remains on her world tour, has made no endorsement in this year's US presidential race.

IAF fighter jet drops 'air store' near Pokhran

It said an inquiry has been ordered to investigate the incident. "An inadvertent release of an air store from an Indian Air Force (IAF) fighter aircraft took place near Pokhran firing range area, due to technical malfunc-

tion, today," the IAF said on 'X'. The nature of the 'air store' released by the aircraft is not immediately known. In military parlance, anything attached to an



aircraft or part of it is called an 'air store'. Bombs, missiles, munitions and even fuel tanks are also referred to as 'air store'.

City IIT develops solar-powered reactor for waste mgmt

Bhubaneswar, August 21: A research team from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT)-Bhubaneswar has developed a solar-powered microwave pyrolysis reactor designed to recover valuable resources from both segregated and mixed waste materials, including biomass and plastics.

The reactor uses microwaveassisted pyrolysis to rapidly convert waste into valuable products such as highly porous carbonaceous material (biochar) and bio-oil, depending on the feedstock and operating conditions, the institute stated Wednesday.

Pyrolysis is the heating of an organic material such as bio-

mass in the absence of oxygen. Current solid waste management practices mainly involve incineration, biogas plants, or land-



fill disposal which offer limited recycling opportunities. While incineration serves as an alternative to land filling, it often leads to significant environmental pollution through the release of

toxic gases and ash, it said. The microwave-assisted pyrolysis technology developed by IIT-Bhubaneswar's School of Infrastructure offers a promis-

ing solution to these challenges,

'Microwave-assisted pyrolysis produces valuable end products like biochar, bio-oil, and syngas in a very short time, addressing the urgent need for sustainable waste management,' said Remya Neelancherry, the lead researcher.

"Our research at IIT-Bhubaneswar focuses on the feasibility and applicability of these products across various sectors, including agriculture, transportation, and energy production," Neelancherry added.

This environment-friendly technology can be implemented by municipalities and industries in various locations within cities, offering the potential for significant revenue generation with minimal pollution compared to incineration and other conventional waste management techniques, Neelancherry said.

Depending on waste management needs, the technology can be implemented with either a fixed bed reactor or a fluidised

bed reactor, Neelancherry added. "Research indicates promising potential for this technology to positively impact the alternative energy market. We encourage investors to explore this technology, ensuring environmental protection while fostermarket growth,' Neelancherry said.

Koraput sees uptick in Malaria cases

Koraput/Sunabeda/Semiliguda August 21: Malaria has acquired an alarming proportion in Koraput district as the district administration is allegedly not taking enough measures for control of the vector-borne

The disease continues to spread its tentacles in the district sparking concern among the residents. According to reports available from the district Health department, blood samples of 4, 62,734 persons were taken for malaria tests in 2022, out of which 2,830 persons were found affected of the disease.

In 2023, 5,43,080 blood samples were examined and 7,007 were found positive. Similarly, in 2024 3.22.812 blood samples were taken for test and 5,500 persons were found positive by July end show ing an increasing trend.

The dengue fever case count is also spiraling in the district. Blood samples of 8,309 persons underwent test and 509 were

blood samples of 6,594 persons underwent test out of which 160 were tested positive for dengue.

Similarly, by August 19 this year, blood samples of 2,371 persons were taken for test and 40 persons tested positive for the dis-

When enquired, district malaria officer Susant Das said that various measures are being taken by the district Health department for control of vector borne diseases like malaria and

dengue. An official has been specially engaged in every municipality area to keep a tab on the spread of the diseases ASHA workers, members of

Gram Kalyan Samiti and Anganwadi workers are being trained and put on alert in their respective areas. They have been asked to admit the persons suffering from fever in hospitals in both rural and urban areas.

Anganwadi workers are also visiting every house in their areas and sensitising people on

the measures to stay safe from malaria and dengue, he added.

On the other hand, many areas under Sunabeda Municipality become waterlogged. Muddy water has stagnated at various spots due to the torrential rainfall which lashed the district in past weeks. This has given rise to mosquito menace in various wards resulting in spread of malaria and dengue fever in these areas, residents

However, the local civic body authorities are not taking any preventive measure like fogging, sprinkling of mosquito oil and cleaning of drains in the wards, locals alleged.

When contacted, executive officer Narayan Nayak of Sunabeda Municipality said fogging is done on a regular basis in various wards while phenyl, mosquito oils and bleaching powder are also being applied. Moreover, Swachh Sathis are visiting every house in the civic body area and conducting

8 more killed in lightning strikes

Bhubaneswar, August 21: At least eight people were killed in lightning strikes in different districts of the state Wednesday, taking the toll to 24 in the past four days. Additionally, five people suffered serious burn injuries after being outdoors during lightning strikes.

All the deceased were farmers who were struck while working in their fields. The tragic incidents occurred in Kendrapara, Balasore, Bhadrak and Dhenkanal districts Wednesday, according to official reports. Most of the victims are from rural areas, primarily engaged in agricultural activities.

Condoling the fatalities, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi announced an ex-gratia amount of ₹4 lakh each for the bereaved families. The injured will also receive free medical treatment and financial assistance in accordance with disaster regulations. as stated by an official from the Revenue and Disaster Management department.

It is noteworthy that the state experiences approximately 300 lightning-related deaths annually. In response to this natural calamity, the state government has started an extensive campaign to plant palm trees, which experts believe can help mitigate lightning strikes.

Huge cache of cough syrup seized in Sambalpur; 4 held

Sambalpur, August 21: Excise department officials here seized 2,400 bottles of banned cough syrup while conducting raids at Sindurapanka and Choudhury Chhak area under Sadar police limits in this district, Wednesday. Four persons including the mastermind were arrested in

The four arrested persons were identified as Manoj Kumar Pruseth, 39, resident of Ladukhai village, Jitu Sahu, 30, resident of Goshala area, Gurumel Singh, 55, resident of Tekanaka in Nagpur district of Maharastra and Bijinder Singh, 38, resident of Pabarali village in Gurudaspur district of Punjab. Manoj is the mastermind.

Police seized the mini truck along with cough syrup and a motorcycle from the possession of the accused.

According to information pro-



vided by Additional Excise Superintendent Asit Mallick, the department got a tip-off about a truck with the consignment of banned cough syrup coming to Sambalpur from Kolkata. Acting on the tip-off, the Excise sleuths of Sambalpur Sadar were waiting near Padiabahal on NH-55 to catch the vehicle.

While checking, a mini truck (MH 04-CT-0946) did not stop at the check point and fled the cle, the excise sleuths managed to stop it near Choudhury Chhak

While checking, they found huge stock of the banned contraband along with some machinery inside the truck. As the driver of the truck could not produce valid documents, the Excise sleuths seized the truck and arrested the truck driver along with other three accused.

The approximate cost of the seized cough syrup is estimated to be ₹7 lakh, said Mallick. He said that the prime accused Manoj had been arrested earlier in the banned caough syrup smuggling case and many cases are pending against him in the court.

Populism's Lost Summer

hink back to late June and early July. The French far right was favoured to win a snap parliamentary election. Trumpist judges in the United States were conveniently resolving the legal woes of the former president, who seemed to be gliding to victory after President Joe Biden's disastrous debate performance. And while Britain was getting a Labour government, a new anti-immigration party led by the chief Brexiteer, Nigel Farage, had made unprecedented gains. Faced with it all, pundits warned that a wave of populist, "anti-incumbency" rage was sweeping across the world's democracies.

The commentariat's bleak outlook should since have been tempered by new sources of political hope. Not only is there little evidence of a "populist wave" – a metaphor that conjures images of far-right parties inevitably rising to power in many countries – but recent experience suggests workable strategies for countering such forces.

One lesson from the past few months might sound like a truism: All parties that value democracy must unite to face down anti-democratic threats. This is what happened in France, to many pundits' surprise. Left-wing parties formed the New Popular Front, evoking memories of the fight against fascism in the 1930s, when the socialist leader

Léon Blum led a coalition of Communists, socialists, and liberals to defend the re-

After President Emmanuel Macron's surprise decision to dissolve the National Assembly the left got creative, while Marine Le Pen's far-right National Rally was caught flat-footed. But more to the point, the New Popular Front did not merely appeal to abstract democratic values; it also repeatedly called attention to the far right's pro-business plans, making clear that the National Rally is not the pro-worker party

A second lesson comes from the US where few anticipated the enthusiasm and outpouring of joy that would greet the new Democratic ticket. Vice President Kamala Harris, an incumbent, has masterfully presented herself as a representative of change, in contrast to both former US President Donald Trump and the sitting president, Biden. Her pick for vice president, Minnesota Governor Tim Walz, has delighted many with his characterisation of the Republican ticket, particularly Trump's vice-presidential pick, JD Vance, as "weird." Finally, it seems, Democrats play the kind of rhetorical hardball that the right always has.

Of course, self-declared centrists preaching civil discourse are less pleased. They are reminding Democrats that Hillary Clinton's comments about "deplorables" came to haunt her 2016 campaign. Yet to condemn the "weird" label as childish name-calling misses the point. In the fight against far-right populism, this particular epithet can be especially

After all, in claiming to speak for "the real people" or the "the silent majority," far-right populists are presenting themselves as the representatives of normality. In Germany, one of the far-right Alternative für Deutschland's slogans is: Deutschland, aber normal. The populists' supposed base comprises what are always presented as "ordinary people" who are threatened by nefarious elites and dangerous Others. That is how populists incite fear of already-vulnerable minorities, be they refugees or transgender people.

Savvy anti-populists should concentrate their rhetorical fire on populist leaders, rather than on their supporters. Vance is "weird" because he is obsessed with controlling women's bodies and punishing the childless, and because he appears sympathetic toward monarchists and other assorted alt-right figures. The GOP now holds many positions that are far out of step with US political traditions; open admiration for autocrats is an obvious example. One can point all this out without suggesting that Republican voters themselves are weird. The point is to dispute the claim to normality by leaders who are anything but.

The far-right populists who claim to speak for the silent majority in fact represent a loud minority. There is nothing wrong with that as such; plenty of progressive movements started the same way. But movements that pretend to speak for the majority while vilifying everyone else pose a threat to democracy. It is no accident that populists who lose at the ballot box often resort to accusations of fraud. Since they supposedly represent the silent majority, an electoral loss can be attributed only to foul play, usually by "liberal elites" who supposedly somehow silenced the majority.

Anti-populists should recognise that majorities do not in fact support far-right populist forces. The new Labour government's first few weeks in power have confirmed this salutary insight. The country has experienced its worst riots in more than a decade, as disinformation has fuelled racist violence. While being careful not to endorse violence directly, Farage has made it sound like the rioters have legitimate grievances shared by the silent majority. But polls show that only one in three Britons support the broader anti-migration protests. whereas opposition to the riots is overwhelming.

True, the argument "We are more!" - a slogan coined by anti-populist protesters in Germany - only goes so far. While the far right falsely claims a monopoly on normality, the truth is that far-right parties are becoming normalised as more center-right politicians copy their rhetoric or enter coalitions with them. A stance focused on defending democracy is necessary, but not sufficient, to counter this trend: one must offer a positive vision, too. That is what the French left and UK Labour both did this summer.

Those canvassing for Harris will be asked on doorsteps what she truly stands for, beyond being an alternative to Trump-Vance weirdness. It is a legitimate question, and one for which anti-populists must provide a good answer.

PRINCIPLED OR PRAGMATIC

GANDHI'S PRINCIPLED NON-VIOLENCE CONSISTED OF A RADICAL ONTOLOGY THAT CONCERNED **BOTH LARGER POLITICAL MOVEMENT AS WELL AS A STRUGGLE WITH** THE INDIVIDUAL **SELF**

The consensus among international relations scholars for a long time has been that violence has been the most efficacious method of achieving political ends. In recent years, the axiomatic nature of this claim has been challenged by political developments as well as the emergence of new scholarship. In the last two decades, we have witnessed a massive spate of organised non-violent civilian protests against the establishment across different societies. Prominent instances include the overthrow of Slobodan Milošević in Serbia, the Rose Revolution in Georgia, the Orange revolution in Ukraine, the Cedar revolution in Lebanon and the 2006 democracy movement in Nepal.

The literature on explaining the reasons for the success of non-violent movements has been steadily becoming extensive. While it is easier for the state to justify violence against armed insurgents, violence against non-violent protesters is likely to backfire on the establishment. The masses at large may see violent militants as having undesirable extremist goals, as is the case with Naxalites in India. Non-violent protesters, on the other hand, are seen as virtuous and a legitimate expression of the public mood on the street. As the prominent political theorist Gene Sharp points out, non-violence is characterised by the actions of people, not beliefs. Thus, non-violence is essentially "an alternative weapons system.'

Pragmatic or strategic non-violence does not demand any personal or moral commitment to non-violence. A commitment to non-violent lifestyle, such as the one that Mahatma Gandhi led, are often considered to be impractical by proponents of pragmatic non-violence. Pragmatic non-violence looks at physical violence as impractical.

It does not concern itself with what is morally correct but on what is most effective. Pragmatic non-violence is seen as a means. to a political end. Thus, it focuses on short-term goals like the overthrow of an oppressive regime, the eradication of corruption or the withdrawal of oppressive laws. Principled nonviolence, on the other hand, seeks to eradicate violence in all forms. Due to its belief in nonviolence as an alternate weapons system, pragmatic non-violence focuses its attention towards articulating various types of protest tactics and civil disobedience to unjust laws and illegitimate regimes.

Even though pragmatic nonviolent protests have proven to be effective in the short-run, its long-term efficacy is still debated. Proponents of principled violence are understandably critical and wary of the violence that lies at the heart of a state. This is evident in the works of Leo Tolstoy. For Tolstoy, the essence of slavery lay in the existence of legislation itself i.e. the idea that few people have the right to decree law in their interest. War, or violence, is merely the result of the state keeping armies. Tolstoy considered human beings to be irrational and thus found no justification at all for governmental violence. While Tolstoy was an anarchist, his wariness of the state is shared by other proponents of principled non-violence including Gandhi.

According to LK Bharadwaj, pragmatic non-violence is not only self-defeating but also merely a moderate form of Machiavellianism. Like Machiavellianism, pragmatic proponents of non-violence assert the immorality of politics and emphasise on the primacy of success i.e. the achievement of the end goal. The opportunistic acceptance of non-violence lays the ground rule for the consideration of the other alternative i.e. violence in case non-violent protests fail. This argument has been vindicated in recent years in both Egypt and Tunisia.

In contrast, Gandhi sought to seek the purity of the means as well as the end. He adopted truth and non-violence as his means and asserted that these principles were "as old as hills." When violence erupted during the Non-Cooperation Movement at Chauri Chaura, Gandhi immediately called off the movement. While it would have been easy to reject the incident as an aberration and fringe while continuing the movement.

Gandhi instead chose to make his rejection of violence in its entirety absolutely clear by calling off the movement.

Gandhi's principled non-violence consisted of a radical ontology that concerned both larger political movement as well as a struggle with the individual self. This is best exemplified by Gandhi's autobiography, where the majority of his "experiments with truth" concern the personal. Pragmatic non-violent activists assume that mere regime change will lead to a solution. Principled non-violence, on the other, emphasise on the local, exemplified by Gandhi's "swadeshi" movement. For Gandhi, swaraj, or self-rule, is as much about the assumption of full responsibility for organisation of one's community as it is about emancipation from the colonial power. Using the ancient Hindu and Jain idea of "ahimsa," Gandhi emphasises on non-harm to all species which will eventually culminate in 'sarvodaya" or justice for all.

Over the years, the world has witnessed a steady but by no means satisfactory decrease of violence both for protests as well as the use of arbitrary violence by state. This is not due to the acceptance of non-violence means as effective but due to a growing normative and social disapproval of violence in all forms. In contemporary times, figures such as Gandhi Martin Luther King Jr. and Mandela have served as guiding lights for principled non-violence. Due to its emphasis on compassion, non-harm and the personal, principled non-violence generates organisational and personal discipline and moral commitment to the cause in a way that pragmatic nonviolence never can.

However, in recent years, a shift towards financial assets like mutual funds, equities, and bonds has been observed For decades, Indian households have maintained a strong preference for physical savings. Gold, in particular, has held a special place in Indian society, not only as a symbol of wealth but also as a hedge against inflation and currency fluctuations. Similarly, real estate has been another major avenue for savings, providing both capital appreciation and rental income opportunities.

The dominance of these physical assets can be attributed to several factors. Historically, Indian households have had limited access to formal financial markets. The banking infrastructure, particularly in rural areas, was underdeveloped, and financial literacy was low. Furthermore, gold and real estate were considered safer investments, offering protection against market volatility and the complexities associated with financial products.

attributed to enhanced financial literacy, technological advanceing demographics and declining returns from physical assets. COVID also played a major role in the financialisation process. With multiple applications available in smartphones, one could invest in such products through a 'click of a button'. From just 40.9 million in March 2020, before the COVID outbreak, the number demat accounts in India has more than doubled to 100.5 million in 2024.

The reasons for this shift can be

India's younger population, with its higher risk appetite and greater familiarity with technology, is more inclined towards financial assets than previous generations. Unlike older generations, who preferred the safety of gold and real estate, younger investors are exploring new avenues for wealth creation, such as

stock markets and mutual funds. While the financialisation of household savings presents several opportunities, it also brings with it certain challenges. Financial assets, particularly equities, are subject to market risks. Household savings invested in stocks and mutual funds can be adversely affected by market downturns, leading to potential wealth erosion. For risk-averse investors, this volatility can be a significant deterrent.

Despite improvements in financial literacy, large segments of the population, particularly in rural areas, still lack a comprehensive understanding of financial products. The benefits of financialisation are not evenly distributed across society. While wealthier households have the resources and knowledge to invest in financial products, poorer households may remain reliant on traditional savings mechanisms, perpetuating inequality.

As more household savings flow into equity markets, there is a risk of over-reliance on stock market performance for wealth creation. Any prolonged downturn in markets could have a negative impact on household wealth.

The financialisation of household savings in India marks a paradigm shift in how households approach wealth accumulation and investment. While the trend has numerous benefits, including greater market participation and economic growth, it also comes with inherent risks. As this trend continues, it will be crucial for policymakers and financial institutions to focus on promoting financial literacy, improving access to financial markets, and ensuring that the benefits of financialisation are inclusive and widespread.

Sir, Mpox being allowed to worsen into a global public health emergency shows how little the global community has learned from previous disease outbreaks, including the COVID pandemic. Neglecting surveillance and a coordinated response against the disease seeing a surge in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and some other African nations could prove costly, given the viral strain in circulation this time is more infective. Clade 2b which was in circulation in 2022 was transmitted primarily through sexual contact. Clade 1b, in circulation this time, has seen non-sexual transmission, and is likely more virulent given the higher fatalities reported. Even when the sole vaccine that exists was deployed in the West in the first emergency, African nations didn't get as many shots as they required though the virus was endemic in parts of the continent. Given the levels of global interconnectedness, the fallout shouldn't be allowed to exacerbate. The disease reaching Western shores again is the price for neglecting Africa. The global community must now control it there, even as nations step up surveillance and work on boosting vaccine capacity and reach.

New Delhi, August 21: In the wake of landslides in Sikkim, the Congress Wednesday hit out at the government and said hydel projects in ecologically fragile regions have been coming up over the past few years without giving adequate thought to their cumulative environmental impact.

The opposition party also asserted that dams on the Teesta river are the prime example of how ecology is being fundamentally altered with grave consequences for this and future generations.

A massive landslide struck east Sikkim Tuesday, damaging parts of a 510-mw hydroelectric project on the Teesta river.

The landslide happened at Dipu Dara near Singtam in Gangtok district around 7.30 am. causing significant damage to the powerhouse of the Teesta Stage V hydroelectric project of

In a statement, Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh said a series of landslide disasters in Sikkim has substantially damaged the Teesta V, a 510 MW hydel power station on the Teesta. This disaster comes on the

caused massive devastation in Sikkim and Kalimpong, West Bengal, he noted.

The Union Budget, unveiled in July 2024, had a section dedicated to 'Irrigation and Flood Mitigation,' where Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman made the vague promise of "assistance" without any details of funds for Sikkim, he said.

"In a classic case of the Government's confrontational federalism, the Budget was indifferent to the areas in West Bengal which were equally affected," Ramesh said.

"The obvious vendetta politics aside, the Budget announcements were insufficient what the entire region needs is for a development framework that centres ecological dimensions, the case for

which has become apparent from the cascading series of disasters in the last year," the former environment minister argued.

National Highway 10, the lifeline of Sikkim and Kalimpong, runs along the Teesta and has been in a precarious state with frequent landslides and closures, he pointed out.

As of today, the NH has been closed for over a month, severely affecting trade, tourism, and more importantly, the security of these sensitive border areas of India, he said, adding these floods are an economic, social, and political disaster for these regions.

A spate of hydro projects on the Teesta River has caused the river to become more flood-prone, washing away sections of the NH10, the Congress general secretary said.

As per the National Hydropower Development Corporation (NHDC), 47 hydropower projects are in different stages of development on the Teesta River in Sikkim and West Bengal, he noted.

Of them, nine have been commissioned, work on 15 dams is going on and another 28 are in the pipeline, Ramesh said.

The October 2023 disaster was provoked by the GLOF, but it only reached its catastrophic scales due to the failure of the Teesta-III dam, the Congress leader said.

Amidst these hydel projects. IRCON has also undertaken tunnelling of this sensitive region for the Sivok-Rangpo railway line (14 tunnels), contributing to the region's increased vulnerability, Ramesh said.

'The mismanagement in the debris disposal has also resulted in the riverbed level going up, making the region more flood prone," he said in his statement. Aside from this environmen-

tal catastrophe in the making. these projects have also been undertaken without local communities in mind, Ramesh argued.

Shah to chair meetings on anti-Naxal operations during Chhattisgarh visit

New Delhi, August 21: Union Home Minister Amit Shah will review the inter-state coordination among the Naxal-affected states at a high-level meeting to be held in Chhattisgarh Saturday.

At a separate meeting on the same day, Shah will also review security and development initiatives in Maoists-hit areas of Chhattisgarh, sources said.

The chief secretaries and directors general of police of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh Maharashtra, besides top security officials of the central government are expected to attend the inter-state coordination meeting.

During his three-day tour of Chhattisgarh, Shah will also visit the Mahaprabhu Vallabhacharya Ashram in Raipur, review the functioning of the Narcotics Control Bureau in the state capital and attend a meeting related to the Ministry of Cooperation.

Earlier, Shah had said after a Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government assumed charge in the central Indian state late last year, about 125 Naxals were killed, more than 352 arrested and about 175 had surrendered in just five months.

On April 16, security personnel gunned down 29 Naxals, including some senior cadres, in Chhattisgarh's Kanker district. This was the highest number of fatalities suffered by the red ultras in a single encounter in the history of the state's fight against left-wing extremism.

New Delhi, August 21: The Coal Ministry said Tuesday that the Coal India subsidiary South Eastern Coalfields Limited (SECL) has made significant strides in environmental sustainability through the successful implementation of the Accredited Compensatory Afforestation guidelines issued by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.

The ministry said that these guidelines were issued for increasing forest cover, thereby contributing to national environmental goals and earning valuable carbon credits. "Coal mining projects often

require forest land, necessitating Forestry Clearance (FC) as part of the environmental approval process. A major challenge in securing these clearances is the identification of suitable Compensatory Afforestation (CA) land," the ministry said.

The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change issued guidelines January 24, 2023, which encourage both government institutions and private landowners to undertake afforestation on fallow lands. thereby increasing the "Trees Outside Forests" and supporting biodiversity.

The ministry said that in a proactive response to the ACA guidelines, SECL identified approximately 2,245 hectares of afforested non-forest de-coaled land, with 1,424 hectares in Chhattisgarh and 821 hectares in Madhya Pradesh.

"These lands were identified as suitable for ACA and were proposed to the respective State Forest Departments for notification as ACA land banks. This move is expected to expedite the FC process for future coal mining projects that require forest land diversion," the Coal Ministry said.

It said that SECL has undertaken biological reclamation and plantation across several sites, including Bishrampur Opencast (OC) Project, Dugga OC, Kurasia Colliery, Jamuna OC, Kotma OC, and Sharda OC in the districts of Surajpur and Manendragarh-Chirmiri-Bharatpur in Chhattisgarh, and

Anuppur and Shahdol in Madhya

"These efforts have transformed de-coaled lands into thriving ecosystems with local species such as Teak, Sal, Babul and ' the ministry said.

It said that the reclaimed lands now host a rich variety of flora and fauna, including species like the Sloth Bear. Fox. and various reptiles and migratory birds, which have recolonised the area,

particularly around water bodies. The ministry added that out of the 1,424 hectares identified in Chhattisgarh, 696 hectares have been inspected by officials from the Surajpur and Korea Forest Divisions.

New Delhi/Patna, August 21: The daylong nationwide strike called by some Dalit and Adivasi groups against the Supreme Court's verdict on the sub-classification of Scheduled Castes affected normal life in Bihar and Jharkhand as well as tribal areas of various states

The Chhattisgarh unit of the Congress said the government should consider the "legitimate demands" of the protesters sympathetically. However, the BJP's prominent tribal leader Faggan Singh Kulaste accused the opposition of politicising the Supreme Court's ruling on the issue. Twenty-one organisations across the country had called for the Bharat Bandh against the apex court's order, which they said would harm the basic principles of reservation.

The protesters put up rail and road blockades in several districts of Bihar, and police used batons and water cannons to disperse them. Darbhanga and Buxar witnessed disruption in train services while traffic was blocked in Patna, Hajipur, Darbhanga, Jehanabad, and Begusarai districts.

The RJD and other partners of the INDIA bloc extended their support to the bandh. Independent MP Rajesh Ranjan alias Pappu Yadav, led demonstrations in Patna and other areas, criticising the NDA government's stance on SC/ST quota and alleging that it wants to undermine reservations



Public buses stayed off the roads and schools remained closed in Jharkhand where the call for the bandh was backed by the state's ruling alliance.

The Left parties too have extended their support to the strike. Chief Minister Hemant Soren has cancelled his visit to Palamu Wednesday due to the strike, an official said, adding security was bolstered at key locations to prevent any untoward incident.

In parts of Bastar and Surguja divisions, and Mohla-Manpur-Ambagarh Chowki and Dhamtari districts several shops and commercial establishments remained closed. Bastar Division comprises seven districts and Surguja Division six districts.

At Dantewada district's headquarters, a huge motorcycle rally was organised by members of Sarva Adivasi Samaj (SAS), an umbrella body of tribal organisations. The Opposition Congress extended its "moral" support to the shutdown and called for addressing concerns of members of ST and SC communities.

The call for the nationwide strike had some impact in Guiarat's tribal belts as well, including in Chhota Udepur, Narmada, Surendranagra. Sabarkantha and Aravalli districts where markets in cities and semi-urban areas remained closed. The call for strike had little impact on normal life in Uttar

Pradesh as shops were open and it was business as usual in large parts of the state amid tight security arrangements.

The opposition BSP and SP extended their support to the bandh. BSP workers held a demonstration near Hazratganj, briefly affecting the traffic flow.

The Bhim Army held protests in pockets of western Uttar Pradesh where it has a sizeable presence.

Other northern states, including Rajasthan, Punjab and Haryana, remained largely unaffected, barring a few places where markets remained closed and public transport services were partially affected.

In Jaipur, the SC/ST Sanyukt Sangharsh Samiti held a rally against the August 1 Supreme Court. "During the rally, the markets remained closed and opened after 3 pm. The bandh was peaceful," Suresh Saini, general secretary of Jaipur Vyapar Mahasangh, said.

Shops and other commercial establishments functioned normally in Punjab and Haryana as police in both states made elaborate security arrangements to maintain law and order.

The bandh had no impact in Assam where schools, offices and business establishments functioned normally with almost full attendance across

65 lakh students did not clear Class X, XII exams in 2023: MoE

New Delhi, August 21: More than 65 lakh students from across the country did not clear Class X and XII board exams last year with the failure rate being higher in state boards than the national boards, according to Ministry of Education (MoE) officials.

An analysis of Class X and XII exam results of 59 school boards, including 56 state boards and three national boards, revealed that more girls appeared in Class XII exams from governmentmanaged schools but it is opposite in private schools and government-aided schools.

However, across school management it's they who are outperforming their male counterparts by a big margin.

Overall, across schools of different management as well the gap in pass percentage is also in favour of the girls by over six per "Around 33.5 lakh students

New Delhi, August 21: To ensure a level-playing field in the Haryana assembly polls, the Commission Election Wednesday barred authorities in the state from announcing the results of ongoing recruitment processes of police constables and teachers till the election is over.

The Election Commission's $(EC)\,model\,code\,instructions\,do$ not bar the continuing regular recruitment process or promotion through the UPSC, the state public service commission or

the staff selection commission or any other statutory authority. But state that "recruitments through non-statutory bodies will require prior clearance of the commission".

After ascertaining the facts from the state government and in view of the existing Model Code of Conduct (MCC) instructions, the commission found no violation of the code in the ongoing recruitment processes by the Haryana Staff Selection Commission (HSSC) and the Haryana Public Service Commission (HPSC). The commission has found



that the recruitment processes were initiated before the announcement of the election August 16 and is within the existing MCC instructions as stated above, where statutory authorities can continue their work.

However, in order to maintain level playing field and to ensure that no undue advantage is accrued to anyone, the EC has directed that announcement of

results of these recruitments by the authorities concerned (HSSC and HPSC) will not be released till completion of the Assembly poll in the state.

The commission took cognisance of a complaint from Congress leader Jairam Ramesh regarding violation of the MCC in the process of recruitment against 5,600 vacancies for the post of constable in the Haryana Police, 76 posts of two categories of teachers by the HSSC and recruitment for var-

ious posts by the HPSC. The advertisement regarding 5.600 posts of police constable and 76 posts of two category of teachers (TGT and PTI) were published on the website of the HSSC at 1.45 pm August 16, 2024. the day EC announced polls.

New Delhi, August 21: The World Health Organization (WHO) Wednesday called on the countries in its South-East Asia Region to accelerate action to protect all children with lifesaving vaccines being offered under the childhood immunisation programme, focusing on those who have missed all or some doses, and protect all adolescent girls from cervical

'We should aim for a big catchup to vaccinate all zero-dose and partially-vaccinated children, and restore the immunisation progress lost during the (COVID-19) pandemic, protect all adolescent girls from cervical cancer and accelerate efforts to

eliminate measles and rubella from WHO South-East Asia by 2026," said Saima Wazed, Regional Director, WHO South-East Asia, in her inaugural address to the 15th meeting of the WHO South-East Asia Regional Immunisation Technical Advisory Group (SEAR-ITAG).

Wazed acknowledged and thanked all experts, national programme managers, immunisation champions and partners, including the vaccinators and community workers and the communities themselves. on the expanded immunisation programme completing 50 years


Immunisation Coverage data released last month shows slow progress and no meaningful change in childhood-immunisation coverage last year compared to 2022, and the coverage is yet to be restored to the prepandemic 2019 levels.

"Nearly 2.7 million (27 lakh) children in our region did not get any vaccine and another 0.6 million (six lakh) children were partially vaccinated in 2023. We need to understand where and why these children were missed and prioritise reaching them as soon as possible. No child should ever fall sick or die of any vaccine-preventable disease, when safe and effective vaccines exist to protect them," Wazed said.

The stagnation in post-pandemic recovery highlights the need to innovate, she added. "We need to find locally-impactful approaches and most critically, enhance the political and social leadership that are the basis for intensified actions needed to meet our regional targets, Wazed said.

One of the priorities in the regional director's Regional Roadmap for Results and Resilience is "reaffirming investment in women, girls, adolescents and vulnerable populations". "Against this, we must ensure that all adolescent girls in our region are protected and get at least one dose of HPV vaccine to protect them from cervical cancer."Wazed said.

Revitalising immunisation programmes, strengthening community-centred health systems, ensuring vaccine supply and boosting demand through community engagement are critical components for success. Policy and resources should urgently prioritise routine immunisation, particularly for measles, and focus on reducing zero-dose and partially-vaccinated children, she said.

Parl panel on Waqf Bill to hold first meeting

New Delhi, August 21: Parliament's Joint Committee on the Waqf (Amendment) Bill will hold its first meeting Thursday and its members are scheduled to interact with representatives of the ministries of minority affairs, and law and justice.

The 31-member committee, headed by BJP member Jagdambika Pal, has been tasked by the Lok Sabha to scrutinise

the contentious Bill, which has drawn protests from the opposition parties and Muslim organisations. The representatives from the minority affairs ministry are expected to brief the committee on the "amendments proposed on the Bill", the Lok Sabha secretariat said.

The Bill is the first major initiative from the BJP-led NDA government aimed at reforming the registration process for Waqf properties through a centralised portal. It proposes sev-

eral reforms, including establishing a Central Waqf Council alongside state Waqf Boards with representation to the Muslim women and non-Muslim representatives. A contentious provision of the Bill is the proposal to designate the district collector as the primary authority in determining whether a property is classified as Waqf or government land.

The Bill was introduced in the Lok Sabha on August 8 and referred to a joint committee of Parliament after a heated debate, with the government asserting that the proposed law did not intend to interfere with the functioning of mosques and the opposition calling it a targeting of Muslims and an attack on the Constitution.

Engineer Rashid moves Delhi court seeking bail

Additional Sessions Judge (ASJ) Chander Jit Singh Tuesday issued notice to the National Investigation Agency (NIA) and directed it to file its response by August 28. when the court will hear arguments on the application.

The court had earlier granted Rashid custody parole to take the oath of office July 5.

Rashid has been in jail since 2019 after he was charged by the NIA under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act in the alleged terror funding case. He is at present lodged in Tihar jail.

The former MLA's name cropped up during the investigation of Kashmiri businessman Zahoor Watali, who was arrested by the NIA for allegedly funding terrorist groups and separatists in the Kashmir Valley.

The NIA had filed a charge sheet against several people, including Kashmiri separatist leader Yasin Malik, Lashkar-e-Taiba founder Hafiz Saeed and Hizbul Mujahideen chief Syed Salahuddin, in the case.

Malik was sentenced to life imprisonment by a trial court in 2022 after he pleaded guilty

Panaji, August 21: Research by scientists from different organisations including the CSIR-National Institute of Oceanography here has confirmed the presence of microplastics in the gastrointestinal tracts of Adelie Penguin in Antarctica, hinting at the "impending emergence of microplastic hotspots" in Antarctic ecosystems.

The study, published in the "Science of the Total Environment" journal last week, claimed to be the first comprehensive examination of microplastics across various tissue types, gastrointestinal tracts and scat samples obtained from



Adelie Penguins inhabiting mainland Antarctica.

The research was conducted by a team of scientists including Mahua Saha, Shrayan Bhattacharjee, Chayanika Rathore, Akshata Naik, Praveen

Tudu, Prabir Ghosh Dastidar, Subarna Bhattacharyya, Jacob de Boer and Punarbasu Chaudhuri from research institutes including CSIR-NIO, University of Calcutta, Ramakrishna Mission

Vivekananda Centenary College (Autonomous), Academy of Scientific and Innovative Research (AcSIR), SGT University, Polar Science Division of the Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES), School of Environmental Studies of Jadavpur University. and Vrije University, Netherlands.

Microplastics in natural environments present a formidable global environmental threat, the research paper said, adding that among the five identified polymer types, low-density polyethylene (LDPE) emerged as the most prevalent one, in approximately 63 per cent of the total microplastics.

The findings underscore the need for heightened attention and mitigation efforts to safeguard Antarctic ecosystems, the scientists said.

Adelie penguins, it is believed, either ingest microplastic fibers inadvertently, or ingest them indirectly through their prey species. Local or long-range airborne transport appeared to be additional sources of MP fibers found in lung and trachea tissues, the study said.

Past investigations into microplastics pollution across diverse penguin species have raised alarming concerns, hinting at the impending emergence of microplastic hotspots in Antarctic ecosystems, it noted. The latest findings underscore the urgency for future extensive research, the paper added.

Putin meets Chinese premier in Moscow

Moscow: Russian President Vladimir Putin met Chinese premier Li Qiang in Moscow Wednesday, the Kremlin said Wednesday. "Our countries have large-scale joint plans, projects in the economic and humanitarian areas, we expect them to last for many years," the RIA state news agency quoted Putin as saying. Li said earlier Wednesday that Beijing was ready to work with Russia to strengthen all-round practical cooperation.

Tate's house raided over rape charges

Bucharest: Romanian authorities Wednesday searched the home of controversial influencer Andrew Tate, who is awaiting trial over human trafficking and rape charges, as part of a new investigation, officials said. The misogynist of having formed an organised criminal network in early 2021 in Romania and Britain, along with his brother Tristan. They have denied the charges. Prosecutors allege that Tate, his brother and two women set up a criminal organisation and sexually exploited several victims.

5 bodies retrieved from supervacht

Porticello: Divers searching the wreck of a superyacht that sank off Sicily found the bodies of five passengers Wednesday and searched for one more as questions intensified about why the vessel sank so quickly when a nearby sailboat remained largely unscathed. Rescue crews unloaded three body bags from rescue vessels that pulled into port at Porticello. Salvatore Cocina, head of the Sicily civil protection agency, said two other bodies had also been found in the wreckage for a total of five. The Bayesian, a 56-metre Britishflagged yacht, went down in a storm early.

33 cases filed against Hasina

Dhaka: A case was filed Wednesday against Bangladesh's deposed Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and 86 others on charge of attacking a procession in Sylhet citywhich left several people shot and injured during the recent mass protests August 4. Hasina's sister Sheikh Rehana is also an accused in the case. With this case, Hasina is now facing 33 cases against her, including 27 for murder, four for crimes against humanity and genocide, and one for abduction, the paper said.

Drones swarm Moscow skies

Russia's defence ministry says its air defences destroyed a total of 45 drones over Russian territory

Moscow, August 21: Ukraine attacked Moscow Wednesday with at least 11 drones that were shot down by air defences in what Russian officials called one of the biggest drone strikes on the capital since the war in Ukraine began in February 2022.

The war, largely a grinding artillery and drone battle across the fields, forests and villages of eastern Ukraine, escalated August 6 when Ukraine sent thousands of soldiers over the border into Russia's western Kursk region.

For months, Ukraine has also fought an increasingly damaging drone war against the refineries and airfields of Russia, the world's second largest oil exporter, though major drone attacks on the Moscow region, with a population of over 21 million, have been rarer.

Russia's defence ministry said its air defences destroyed a total of 45 drones over Russian territory, including 11 over the Moscow region, 23 over the border region of Bryansk, six over the Belgorod region, three over the Kaluga region and two over the Kursk region.

Some of the drones were shot down over the city of Podolsk, Moscow Mayor Sergei Sobyanin said. The city in the Moscow region is some 38 km south of the Kremlin.

"This is one of the largest attempts to attack Moscow using drones ever," Sobyanin said on the Telegram messaging app in the early hours of Wednesday. "The lavered defence of Moscow that was created made it possible to successfully repel all the attacks from the enemy UAVs."

Along Moscow's boulevards, the cafes, restaurants and shops of the capital, which has been carefully insulated from the war,

were crowded with little sign of concern, while President Vladimir Putin met Chinese premier Li Qiang in the Kremlin.

Russia meanwhile is advancing in eastern Ukraine, where it controls about 18% of the territory, and battling to repel Ukraine's incursion into the Kursk region, the biggest foreign attack on Russian ter-

ritory since World War Two. Russian media showed unverified footage of drones whirring over the dawn sky of the Moscow region and then being shot down in a ball of flame by air defences.

Moscow's airports, Vnukovo, Domodedovo and Zhukovsky, limited flights for four hours but restarted normal operations from 0330 GMT, Russia's aviation watchdog said.

Sobyanin said that according to preliminary information, there were no injuries or damage reported in the aftermath of the attacks. There were also no casualties or damage reported following the attack on Bryansk in Russia's southwest, the governor of the region, Alexander Bogomaz, wrote on Telegram.

The Russian defence ministry did not mention either Tula or Rostov in its statement listing destroyed Ukrainian air weapons. Ukraine's military said Wednesday it overnight struck an S-300 anti-aircraft missile system based in the Rostov region.

The drone attack on Moscow was on a par with a May 2023 attack when at least eight drones were destroyed over the capital, a strike Putin said was a Ukrainian attempt to scare and provoke Russia.

In Kursk, Russian war bloggers said intense battles were ongoing along the front in the region where Ukraine has carved out at least 450 square km of Russian territory.

Modi arrives in Warsaw

Warsaw, August 21: Prime Minister Narendra Modi Wednesday said his maiden visit to Poland will add momentum to the bilateral friendship and benefit the people of the two countries as he arrived here on the first leg of his two-nation visit during which he will also travel to the Ukrainian capital Kyiv.

Modi, who will meet Poland's President Andrzej Sebastian Duda and hold bilateral talks with Prime Minister Donald Tusk, said he was looking forward to the various programmes in the Polish capital here.

"Landed in Poland. Looking forward to the various programmes here. This visit will add momentum to the India-Poland friendship and benefit the people of our nations," Modi said in a post on X soon after his arrival at the Warsaw military airport here.

Prime Minister Modi's visit to Poland is the first trip by an Indian Prime Minister to the country in the past 45 years.

From Warsaw, Modi will travel to Kyiv on the first visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Ukraine since the country became independent in 1991

The Indian community members in Poland gave a warm welcome to Prime Minister Modi when he arrived at the hotel where Polish and Indian artists performed Gujarati traditional dance.

"My visit to Poland comes as

we mark 70 years of our diplomatic relations. Poland is a key economic partner in Central Europe," Modi said in his departure statement earlier today. From Warsaw, Modi will travel

to Kyiv on the first visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Ukraine since the country became independent in 1991.

"From Poland, I will be visiting Ukraine at the invitation of President Volodymyr Zelenskyy. This is the first-ever visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Ukraine," he said. Modi said he was confident that his visit to Warsaw and Kyiv "will serve as a natural continuation of extensive contacts with the two countries and help create the foundation for stronger and more vibrant relations in the years ahead".

India has not yet condemned the Russian invasion of Ukraine and has been calling for resolution of the conflict through dialogue and diplomacy.

Pak police charge man over misinformation that led to riots in UK

Lahore: Pakistani police have arrested a man and charged him with cyber terrorism for his alleged role in spreading misinformation that led to widespread rioting in the UK earlier this month, a senior police investigator said Wednesday. The suspect was identified as Farhan Asif, 32, a



freelance web developer, said Imran Kishwar, deputy inspector general of investigations in Lahore, the capital of eastern Punjab province. The man is accused of spreading misinformation from YouTube and Facebook about the British teenage suspect in a stabbing attack that killed three girls and injured 10 other people July 29 at a dance class in Northwest England. The false information claimed that the suspect was a recently arrived asylumseeker and had a name that suggested the teen was Muslim.

Taliban bars UN human rights special rapporteur from Afghanistan

Kabul: The Taliban have barred United Nations-appointed special rapporteur Richard Bennett from entering Afghanistan, the administration's spokesperson told local broadcaster Tolo. accusing the human rights watchdog of "spreading propaganda". Bennett was appointed by the United Nations Human Rights Council in 2022 to monitor Afghanistan's human



rights situation after the Taliban took over the previous year. Bennett, who has previously said the Taliban's treatment of women and girls could amount to a crime against humanity, is based outside Afghanistan but has visited several times to research the situation. The UN Human Rights Council did not immediately respond to request for comment. The Taliban administration's foreign ministry spokesperson Abdul Qahar Balkhi told Reuters Bennett "had been unable to acquire a travel visa to Afghanistan".

Congo reports over 1K mpox cases in a week

Cape Town, August 21: Congo reported more than 1,000 new mpox cases in the last week up to Tuesday as African health authorities asked for desperately needed vaccines to help fight its "growing" threat on the continent. The World Health Organisation has declared the outbreaks in Africa a global

Mpox belongs to the same family of viruses as smallpox but causes milder symptoms like fever, chills and body aches, and mostly spreads through close skin-to-skin contact, including sexual intercourse. People with more serious cases can develop lesions on the face, hands, chest and genitals.

While mpox has been reported in 12 of Africa's 54 countries during these outbreaks, the vast central African nation of Congo has recorded by far the most cases this year. Out of a total of 18.910 cases in 2024, 94%, or 17,794, were in Congo, the Africa Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said, with 535 of the 541 deaths reported.

The figures are likely an underestimate, as only about one in five suspected cases in Congo are being tested for mpox. Africa CDC director-general Dr Jean Kaseya said many affected African countries had limited testing and surveillance capabilities.

Over the last seven days, Congo recorded 1,030 of the 1,405 new cases in Africa according to statistics provided late Tuesday by the Africa CDC. Only 16% of the cases have been confirmed by virus tests, but the infections meet the agency's definition of the disease

The WHO has previously said

its past efforts to raise donations for mpox failed to elicit even a single donor dollar.

Africa CDC's Kaseya said that his organization had received a pledge of 215,000 mpox vaccines from the European Union and the vaccine maker, Bavarian Nordic, which were due to arrive in the next few days. The United States' aid agency said it had donated 50,000 other doses of the same vaccine to Congo. Japan has also donated some doses to Congo.

28 Pak pilgrims – die in bus crash

Tehran, August 21: A bus carrying Shiite pilgrims from Pakistan to Iraq crashed in central Iran, killing at least 28 people, an official said Wednesday.

The crash happened Tuesday night in the central Iranian province of Yazd, said Mohammad Ali Malekzadeh, a local emergency official, according to the state-run IRNA news agency.

Another 23 people suffered injuries in the crash, 14 of them serious, he added. He said all of the bus passengers hailed from Pakistan.

at the time of the crash outside of the city of Taft, some 500 kilometers southeast of the Iranian

capital, Tehran. Iranian state television later broadcast images of the bus, turned upside down on the highway with its roof smashed in and all of its doors open. Rescuers stepped gingerly through the broken glass and debris littering the road.

In the state TV report, Malekzadeh blamed the crash on the bus brakes failing and a lack

of attention by its driver. A surveillance video later aired by state TV showed the bus speeding past a parked car into a dirt lot just before the crash, narrowly missing bystanders

Obama night at DNC: Barack, Michelle rouse crowd for Harris

America's first Black President, Obama has thrown his considerable political capital behind Kamala Harris

Chicago, August 21: Former US President Barack Obama and his wife Michelle Obama delivered a one-two punch at the Democratic National Convention Tuesday night, urging Americans to back Kamala Harris in her 11th-hour presidential bid against Republican Donald Trump.

America's first Black President, Obama has thrown his considerable political capital behind Harris as she seeks to make history herself November 5 as the first woman and first Black and South Asian person to be elected US President.

"We do not need four more years of bluster and bumbling and chaos. We have seen that movie before, and we all know that the sequel is usually worse," Obama told delegates on Day Two of the Chicago convention. "America is ready for a new

chapter. America is ready for a better story. We are ready for a President Kamala Harris.' He took aim at Trump, the

Republican who followed him into the White House in 2017 and praised President Joe Biden, his vice president who was forced out of the 2024 race by Democratic allies who feared he would lose to Trump in November. 'History will remember Joe

Biden as a President who defended democracy at a moment of great danger. I am proud to call him mv President, but even prouder to call him my friend," Obama said, eliciting chants of "We love Joe."

Obama was introduced by his wife, Michelle, who tops Democrats' wish list as a future President. "America, hope is making a comeback," Michelle Obama



said, in a nod to Obama's first presidential campaign in 2008. Pulling no punches, she cau-

tioned that Trump would try to distort Harris' truth, much as he did "everything in his power to try to make people fear us.

Republicans delivered strong Trump

The program Tuesday night made a point to feature Republicans, former Republicans and former Trump allies who are now backing Harris. Some of the more notable testimonials

"The View" co-host Ana Navarro, who hosted the session, compared Trump to Latin American dictators including Nicaragua's Daniel Ortega (for calling the media the "enemy of the people"), Cuba's Fidel Castro (for using office to enrich himself and his family) and Venezuela's Nicolás Maduro (for refusing to accept legitimate election results). Trump has recently suggested without any evidence that Harris will lead the country to communism.

Harris's spouse plays up their blended family

Harris got what's likely to be her most significant characterwitness speech of the week Tuesday night from her husband, second gentleman Doug Emhoff. And Emhoff's comments about the challenges involved in their blended family were a particularly potent moment in a Democratic convention that

NCLT okays delisting of ICICI Securities

Mumbai: The Mumbai bench of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) Wednesday approved the delisting application of ICICI Securities from the stock exchanges and also rejected objections filed by minority shareholders. The NCLT in an oral order approved the Scheme of Arrangement for delisting of shares of ICICI Securities. As per the scheme of arrangement, shareholders of ICICI Securities (ISEC) will get 67 shares of ICICI Bank for every 100 shares they hold. The court also rejected objections filed by minority shareholders Quantum Mutual Fund and Manu Rishi Gupta. Quantum Mutual Fund held 0.08 per cent and Manu Rishi Gupta, a minority shareholder held 0,002 per cent shares in ICICI Securities opposed the

Decathlon to invest 100mn euros in 5 yrs

New Delhi: French sports retailer Decathlon Wednesday said it will invest 100 million euros (around ₹933 crore) in India, its one of the fastest growing markets. in the next five years to expand retail footprint and manufacturing operations. The company expects its business to become double in next three to five years, said Decathlon India CEO Sankar Chaterjee. The company plans to have a network of 190 stores, having presence in over 90 cities in next 5 years as part of its expansion, he added. Besides, a handful of this would also be spent on enhancing the digital channel as per the omni-channel approach of the company. Decathlon will expand its manufacturing operations and increase sourcing from india for the local market and its global operations.

Hero MotoCorp to drive in new scooters

New Delhi: Two-wheeler major Hero MotoCorp is gearing up to expand its scooter range and consolidate its position in the 125 cc bike segment as it looks to grow faster than the competition, according to CEO Niranjan Gupta. The company plans to roll out both petrol and electric scooter trims and also bolster the production capacity of 125 cc bike Xtreme 125R to cater to enhanced demand, "There will be action on the scooters front and action will be big on both ICE and EV side. The Destini full-body change will be unveiled very soon and then it will be followed by Xoom models - 125cc and 160cc - within this fiscal," Gupta said.

Disney-Reliance merger in soup

Watchdog concerned about combined cricket broadcast rights

New Delhi, Aug 21: India's antitrust body has reached an initial assessment that the \$8.5 billion India merger of Reliance and Walt Disney media assets harms competition due to their power over cricket broadcast rights, four sources told Reuters.

It is the biggest setback so far to the planned Disney-Reliance merger which aims to create India's biggest entertainment player which will compete with Sony, Zee Entertainment, Netflix and Amazon with a combined 120 TV channels and two streaming services.

The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has flagged possible anti-competitive concerns with respect to the proposed Viacom18-Star India merger and has sought detailed responses from the parties concerned, sources said.

In case the regulator is not satisfied with the replies, it can go for public scrutiny of the deal, they added.

After the companies filed an application with the CCI for deal approval in May this year, the watchdog had sought various clarifications and additional information from the parties.

The sources said the parties have been served show cause notice asking why a detailed

scrutiny of the deal should not be carried out as there are anticompetitive concerns in relation to certain business segments, including cricket

broadcasting rights. Viacom is owned by Reliance Industries and Star India is part of the Walt Disney Company.

The merged company, which would be majority owned by Asia's richest man Mukesh Ambani's Reliance, would have lucrative rights worth billions of dollars for the broadcast of cricket on TV and streaming platforms, raising fears over pricing power and its grip over

Antitrust experts had warned the merger, announced in February, could face intense scrutiny, especially on the sporting rights issue.

The CCI earlier privately asked Reliance and Disney around 100 questions related to the merger. The companies have told the watchdog they are willing to sell fewer than 10 television channels to assuage concerns about market power and win an early approval, sources told Reuters.

But they had refused to relent on cricket, telling the CCI that broadcast and streaming rights will expire in 2027 and 2028 and cannot be sold right now, and that any such move would require the cricket board's approval, which could delay the

The CCI notice may delay the approval process but the companies can still address the concerns by offering more concessions, the first source said.

"This is a precursor of things getting complicated ... The notice means that initially the CCI thinks the merger harms competition and whatever concessions offered are not enough,' added the person.

A second source said CCI has given the companies 30 days to respond and explain their posi-

tion, and the concerns currently revolve around how advertisers could face pricing challenges if the entities are merged.

The CCI is concerned the entity can increase rates for advertisers during live events,' said the person.

New Delhi, August 21: Online food delivery platform Zomato will acquire Paytm's entertainment ticketing business for ₹2.048 crore to strengthen its "goingout" segment in a deal that will help the troubled fintech firm to sharpen its focus on core payments and financial services distribution.

Paytm's entertainment ticketing business covers movies. sports, and events (live performances). The boards of Zomato and One 97 Communications Ltd (OCL) have approved the all-cash deal.

As part of this agreement, OCL's entertainment ticketing business will transfer business to its 100 per cent subsidiaries Orbgen Technologies Pvt Ltd (OTPL) and Wasteland Entertainment Pvt Ltd (WEPL), followed by the sale of 100 per cent stake in these subsidiaries (which operate the TicketNew and Insider platforms) to Zomato.

Subsequently, Zomato will spin off the new business into a new app called 'District'.

Under the deal, Zomato will fully acquire Orbgen Technologies Pvt Ltd (OTPL), which is into movie ticketing, for ₹1,264.6 crore and buy Wasteland Entertainment Pvt Ltd, which is into events ticketing for ₹783.8 crore.

Global markets exhibited a mildly cautious tone ahead of the release of the FOMC minutes later today. Currently, the expectation of a rate cut remains high, given the fall in US inflation and moderation in overall growth," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services, said.

India remains net steel importer as China cargoes rise

Mumbai, August 21: India continued to be a net importer of steel during the first four months of the current fiscal year beginning April, with China as its biggest supplier of the alloy, according to provisional government data seen by Reuters.

India imported 2.69 million metric tonne of steel between April and July and exported 1.57 million tonne, the data showed

India, the world's secondiggest crude steel producer, became a net importer of the alloy in the fiscal year to March 31, 2024, and the trend has continued since then, with imports from China rising steadily.

China was the top steel exporter to India from April to July, shipping about 807,000 tonne to its neighbour. It was followed by Japan and South Korea, the data showed.

Leading Indian steelmakers such as JSW Steel and Tata Steel have cited rising imports into India as a major concern, and the government has initiated an anti-dumping investigation on certain steel products imported from Vietnam.

Steel prices in India have plunged to their lowest level in more than three years due to higher imports and subdued exports, according to data from commodities consultancy



Antil (men's javelin F64), Deepthi Jeevanji (women's 400m_ T20), Sachin Khilari (men's shot put F46), Ekta Bhyan (women's club throw F51), Simran Sharma (women's 200m T12) and Mariyappan Thangavelu (men's high jump T42) won gold at Tokyo. They start favourites in their respective events at Paris.

In the Tokyo Paralympics in 2021, India had won a record 19 medals (five gold, eight silver and six bronze).

India are sending their biggest ever team of 84 athletes across 12 sports disciplines to the Paralympics, with 38 in the paraathletics squad. Paralympic Committee of India (PCI) president Devendra Jhajharia has predicted at least 25 medals from the Paris Games.

Antil and Bhagyashree Jadhav, who won a silver in Hangzhou Asian Para Games in women's shot put F34, will be the joint flag-bearers for India during the opening ceremony, which will be held outside a stadium for

India series equal to Ashes: Starc

Sydney, August 21: Australia pace ace Mitchell Starc believes that with the upcoming Border-Gavaskar Trophy against India becoming a five-Test affair for the first time in over three decades, it would be 'right on par' with the esteemed Ashes series for his team.

The marquee series between India and Australia, set to begin in November, was extended by a match this year for the first time since the 1991-92 season. "Being five matches now, the series is probably right on par with the Ashes series," Starc told 'Wide World of Sports', Wednesday.

Since 2014-15, Australia have failed to lay their hands on the Border Gavsakar Trophy, with India winning four consecutive series including the historic triumphs Down Under in 2018-19

Starc is not only intent on reversing this trend but also harbours aspirations of a clean



sweep, particularly as the series forms a crucial part of the World Test Championships. "We always want to win every game at home and we know India are

a very strong team," Starc stated. Currently, India lead the World Test Championships points table with Australia in second place. "As we're placed at the minute we're the top two teams on the Test ladder... so a very exciting

series coming up for the fans

and certainly the players," Starc pointed out. "Hopefully when we're sitting there on the 8th of January we have that trophy back on our shores.

The 34-year-old is just 11 matches shy of reaching a milestone 100 Tests and has no plans to quit red ball cricket. In fact the left-arm pacer said he is scaling back his white ball commitments to prolong his Test career for as long as possible.
