
NMC backtracks

New Delhi: The National Medical Commission (NMC) Thursday withdrew and cancelled guidelines under Competency Based Medical Education Curriculum in which it had reintroduced sodomy and lesbianism as unnatural sexual offences in the forensic medicine and toxicology curriculum for UG medical students. The guidelines were issued August 31. Besides sodomy and lesbianism, the NMC had brought back topics such as the hymen and its type, and its medico-legal importance in addition to defining virginity and defloration, legitimacy and its medico-legal importance. These subjects were done away with in 2022.

Jolt to EV makers

New Delhi: Union Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari Thursday said there is no need to provide subsidy to electric vehicle (EV) makers as consumers are now choosing EVs or compressed natural gas (CNG) vehicles on their own. Addressing BNEF Summit, he said initially costs of manufacturing EVs were high, but as demand has increased, production costs have dropped, making further subsidies unnecessary. "Consumers are now choosing electric and CNG vehicles on their own and I do not think we need to provide much subsidy for EVs," Gadkari said.

Kota, Sept 5: A 21-year-old student preparing for NEET-UG here allegedly ended his life by hanging himself from the ceiling of a rented room in a house Wednesday night.

This is the 14th case of suicide by a student in the coaching hub this year since January, while 26 cases of death by suicide were

reported in the city in 2023. The deceased was identified as Parshuram Jatav of Barsana in Mathura of UP. Parshuram's father held the alleged NEET-24 exam scam responsible for the extreme step taken by the youth. No suicide note was recovered from the room in which the student stayed. **P9**

3L tribal students to get ₹5K/yr

Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: The state government Thursday announced an annual financial assistance of ₹5,000 under Madho Singh Haath Kharch Yojana to around three lakh tribal students for their studies.

The announcement was made by Parliamentary Affairs Minister Mukesh Mahaling in the Assembly.

He said, "Every tribal student having passed Class VIII/X and taking admission in Class IX/XI, respectively, will be provided ₹5.000 annually as an incentive.'



BJD to oppose Waqf Bill

Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: Leader of Opposition in the state Assembly Naveen Patnaik Thursday asserted that his party, the BJD, would "strongly oppose" the Waqf (Amendment) Bill if it is tabled in Parliament.

Addressing the concluding session of the BJD Minority Cell meeting at 'Sankha Bhawan' here, Patnaik said Odisha is known for harmony, brotherhood and peace.

"The BJD will strongly oppose the bill if it is tabled in Parliament," the five-time former chief minister said.

The contentious Waqf (Amendment) Bill seeks to reform the registration process for Waqf properties through a centralised portal. It has been referred to a joint parliamentary

Need Bengal-like law for women's safety: Oppn

Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: Opposition BJD and Congress Thursday demanded a stringent law in the state on the lines of the one passed recently in neighbouring West Bengal for women's

On September 3, the West Bengal Assembly unanimously passed the 'Aparajita Woman and Child Bill (West Bengal Criminal Laws and Amendment) Bill 2024' that seeks capital punishment for rape convicts if their actions result in the victim's death or leave her in a vegetative state, and life sentence without parole for other perpetrators.

Other significant features of the proposed legislation include the completion of probes into rape cases within 21 days of the initial report, a reduction from the previous two-month deadline, and a special task force where women officers will lead investigations.

During discussion in Odisha Assembly, both the Opposition parties, the BJD and the Congress, alleged that the state's BJP government has no sensitivity towards rape victims and none from the administration have met kin of the victims of rape-murder cases in Remuna in Balasore district, Naktideula in Sambalpur district, Patana in Keonjhar district and Bhubaneswar that took place after the formation of the new government in the state in June.

Initiating a debate on the alleged rise in the number of rape murder cases in the state. Opposition Chief Whip Pramila Mallik claimed that incidents of crime against women and children have increased alarmingly after the BJP came to power in the state.

Demanding ₹10 lakh as compensation for the kin of the victim of rape and murder in Remuna area of Balasore district, Mallik said the nine-vear-old girl was raped and murdered August 27, but government representatives were yet to visit their house.

She also cited an instance from Chief Minister Mohan

'This government lacks sensitivity and sympathy towards the victims and their families,' Mallik said, hailing the West Bengal government which has enacted a stringent law after the rape and murder of a woman doctor in Kolkata.

Mallik said the BJP government in Odisha should also bring a similar law in the state to curb crimes against women and children. "The number of such cases is rising as there is no fear among criminals," Mallik said alleging that atrocities on women and children have gone up significantly in the last three months after the Majhi-led government took charge.

BJD member Goutam Buddha Das from Balasore district, also came down heavily on the BJP and said that the new government has developed a habit of attacking the previous regime over crimes against women.

However, the white paper issued recently showed that crimes like rape and murder had declined during the BJD rule, he claimed.

Senior Congress MLA Taraprasad Bahinipati alleged that women and children were not safe in Odisha.

Urging both the BJD and the BJP not to engage in mudslinging, Bahinipati said the state government must act promptly to prevent such incidents by bringing in a new law with stringent provisions to provide justice in a time-bound manner in cases of crime against women.

Congress's woman MLA Sofia Firdous also lashed out at both BJP and BJD for indulging in blame-game instead of focusing on the issue of increasing crimes against women. She blamed liquor as the major factor behind rape and murder cases in Balasore, Sambalpur and Bhubaneswar.

In order to secure women and girls, Sofia suggested the state government provide proper education and impart lessons in self-defence to girls.

Replying on behalf of the Chief Minister and Home department in-charge Mohan Charan Majhi, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Mukesh Mahaling claimed that the police have swiftly arrested the accused persons, in some cases, within 24 hours of getting information

about the incident. Stating that the BJP government was committed to protecting women and children, Mahaling said that it has not

left any criminal to go free. All the accused have been arrested and the law is taking its

own course, he said. Dissatisfied with the minister's reply, both the BJD and_ Congress members later walked

out of the House in protest.



Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: The state government has so far provided subsidy of ₹154.27 crore to electric vehicle (EV) owners since the 2022-23 financial year, Transport Minister Bibhuti Bhusan Jena said Thursday.

The sale of EVs has also shown an increasing trend in Odisha, after the government started giving subsidy from September 1, 2021, Jena said in a written statement in the Assembly. The state government has so far distributed a subsidy of ₹154.27 crore to EV owners since the 2022-23 financial year, he said. While a subsidy of ₹8.83 crore was disbursed during 2022-23, it was increased to ₹57.21 crore during 2023-24.

The Odisha government has provided subsidy for 14,182 EVs registered during the fiscal year 2022-23, which rose to 36,518 during 2023-24, it said.

During 2024-25 till August, the Odisha government has already distributed subsidies for 38,766 EVs registered in the state, the statement said.



EOW arrests 6 in ₹16.7cr loan fraud



Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of Odisha Police Thursday arrested six persons on charges of obtaining loans to the tune of ₹16.71 crores from the State Bank of India (SBI) by producing fake employment certificates and inflated salary slips.

A senior EOW official said the accused- Anirban Patnaik, Anupama Dash, Tophan Rout, Satvaban Rout, Tukuna Mallick and Feroz Khan -introduced themselves as employees of Phonepe company to avail 161 credit loans from five branches of SBI in the City: Jayadev Vihar, Patia, Raghunathpur and Jharpada, from November 2022 to October 2023.

The EOW stated an investigation following a complaint by the regional manager of SBI, Shiba Sundar Sahoo, August 12 this year. The complainant alleged that Aniraban ran a company-Purvi Venture-out of a rented office at DLF building in Patia which was shown as the regional office of Phonepe. During pre-sanction visits by the bank personnel, this address was mentioned as Phonepe office in the official documents while applying for corporate loans. The fraudsters used a fake email address to give the false impression that they were employees of Phonepe.

EOW said money was sent in advance for 3-4 consecutive months to the accounts of loanees on a particular date of a month to give the impression that regular salaries were being credited every month. When the loans became stressed due to non-refund, fraudulent activities were suspected. This necessitated an internal investigation during which the fraud came to the surface.

The EOW has booked the six men under IPC Sections 409,420,467,471, 120 (B), and Section 66 of IT Act, and produced them before a local court Thursday for remand.

People with depression have a much bigger brain network

RESEARCHERS FOUND THAT A PART OF THE **BRAIN CALLED THE FRONTOSTRIATAL SALIENCE NETWORK WAS EXPANDED BY** 73% ON AVERAGE IN **PARTICIPANTS WITH DEPRESSION**

esearchers have found a particular brain network is far bigger in people living with depression. The largest imaging study of-its-kind has found that a certain brain network involved in directing attention to stimuli is nearly twice as big in people with depression as it is in the rest of the population — and that it remains that way when a person no longer

feels depressed.

The surface of the brain is a communication junction box at which different areas talk to each other to carry out particular processes. But there is a finite amount of space for these networks to share.

Researchers say that in people

with depression, a larger part of

the brain is involved in the net-

work that controls attention to rewards and threats than in those without depression. 'It's taking up more real estate on the brain surface than we see is typical in healthy controls," said Charles Lynch, a coauthor of the research, from

Weill Cornell Medicine in New York. He added that expansion meant the size of other - often neighbouring – brain networks were smaller. Writing in the journal Nature,

Lynch and colleagues report

how they used precision func-

tional mapping, a new approach to brain imaging that analyses a host of fMRI (functional MRI) scans from each individual.

The team applied this method to 141 people with depression and 37 people without it, enabling them to measure accurately the size of each participant's brain networks. They then took the average size for each

They found that a part of the brain called the frontostriatal salience network was expanded by 73 per cent on average in participants with depression compared with healthy controls.

These findings were supported by an analysis of single brain scans previously collected from 932 healthy people and 299 with

depression. The team said the size of this brain network in people with depression did not change with time, mood or transcranial magnetic stimulation treatment.

However, brain signals between different parts of the network became less synchronised when participants had certain symptoms of depression, with these changes also associated with the severity of future symptoms.

The team added that an analysis of brain scans from 57 children who went on to develop depression as adolescents revealed this brain network was expanded years before their symptoms developed, while it was also expanded in adults with late onset depression.

The researchers said this suggested an expanded brain network could be a risk factor for developing depression, rather than a consequence of the condition.

Conor Liston, another author from Weill Cornell Medicine, said the results could benefit people with depression more widely. "Having that information, that there's something identifiable in the brain that is associated with their depression and may be conferring risk for their depression, I think is, by itself, really reassuring for some people," he said

Miriam Klein-Flügge, of the University of Oxford, who was not involved in the work, said it was surprising the study did not touch on the amygdala - a brain area at the core of depression re search for decades.

However, she said, the new work was robust, important and exciting, adding it raised the question of whether it was possible to reverse an expanded frontostriatal salience network

with early intervention.

On being informed, Bhograi tehsildar Himanshu Sekhar Giri reached the spot and took stock



of the situation. The women relented after Giri advised them to make correction in their Aadhaar cards at 33 numbers of common service centres titled 'Mo Seva Kendras' and 'Jan Seva Kendras' functioning under the block.

The tehsildar warned to cancel the licenses if any of the common service centres is found closed or collecting money from the applicants of Subhadra

The scheme aims at enhancing the economic and social status of women by offering financial assistance and essential resources. Women within the age group of 21 to 60 can apply for financial assistance. Women who are income tax returnees or those engaged in government service are not eligible to apply under the scheme.

Buoyed by this announcement, thousands of women under the block were seen making long queues outside the banks and post offices from the Wednesday evening till Thursday to link their phone numbers with

TOOLS, EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLES PURCHASED BY UTILISING THE DMF FUND ARE NOT BEING PUT INTO USE AND ARE LYING UNATTENDED TO

Keonjhar, Sept 5: Despite several allegations of misappropriation of District Mineral Foundation (DMF) funds in this district, there is no change in the situation as 13 mobile medical units (MMUs), purchased with DMF fund, have been lying unused on the district headquarters hospital premises here for more than six months.

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, who represents Keonjhar Sadar in the Assembly, had earlier expressed his concern over the misuse of DMF funds. When Majhi was in opposition, he had raised questions on misuse of DMF funds several times in the

While DMF money is being spent at the own sweet will of the officials, the tools, equipment and vehicles purchased by utilising the fund are not being put



into use and are lying unattended to. This has triggered anger and dissatisfaction among the locals.

Meanwhile, residents have expressed their displeasure over 13 MMUs or ambulances (purchased with DMF fund) lying unused in the district. These MMUs are meant for 13 blocks in the tribal dominated district. These ambulances have not been put into use for more than six months.

Peeved over the development, a social activist has lodged a complaint at the Chief Minister's grievance cell Monday, on the basis of a news report published in a premier vernacular daily. He urged the CMO to take immediate steps and inquire whether the ambulances were purchased after approval of DMF trust board.

He also urged for an inquiry into the rationale behind the purchase of these vehicles and the reason as to why they have been kept unused for months together. He also demanded to re-

cover the losses from those 'ir-

responsible' officials. Sources said despite establishment of Dharanidhar Medical College and Hospital and the district headquarters hospital, people of tribal and inaccessible areas are facing difficulties to get free healthcare. They are unable to reach the hospitals in time due to long distances and lack of money. This has deprived them of availing free treatment. The condition of patients from these areas often turns critical due to delay

in hospitalisation. This has severely hit the purpose of the free healthcare service launched by the state government.

There are many inaccessible pockets in Banspal, Telkoi, Harichandanpur and Joda blocks of the district. With many unknown diseases and common ailments like, cold, fever and diarrhoea are endemic to these areas, MMUs are required to provide free healthcare to the affected people.

These MMUs have all kinds of arrangements including presence of a doctor. Considering the need, 13 free MMUs were purchased with DMF fund to provide healthcare to the poor villagers at their doorsteps. However, they have been lying unused on the premises of the district headquarters hospital for the last several months.

Surprisingly, it had come to notice that Sundargarh DMF logo was affixed on these ambulances, instead of Keonjhar DMF. The logo of Sundargarh DMF was replaced after it was highlighted

Keonihar chief district medical officer (CDMO) Kishore Chandra Prusty said, "The ambulances will be put into use after a launching programme."

Keonjhar Collector Vishal Singh, however, said he would look into the matter and take appropriate steps accordingly.

tribal outfit asks people to shun ties with ultras

The anti-Maoist posters issued by 'Kandhamal-Boudh Adivasi Surakhya Mancha', an apex body of local tribals, surfaced in various villages of Kandhamal district

The posters have been put up in Maoist-hit villages such as Rebingia, Barkhama, Bataguda, Kamerikia, Mediakia. Kurtamgarh and other neighbouring villages in Baliguda and Tumudibandha police station areas in the district in the last one week, he said.

The incident is being investigated from all angles, Superintendent of Police (SP) Subhendu Patra said.

In the printed posters, the outfit appealed to villagers, particularly in Maoist-affected areas, to take an oath not to keep any relations with the Red Rebels in any manner and not to allow them to enter their villages at any cost.

The posters claimed that the Maoists have gradually become extremely self-centred and opportunistic.

Five bootleggers arrested with seizure of 115 litre duplicate IMFL

Rourkela, Sept 5: At a time when the state government has launched a crackdown on illicit liquor trade across the state in the wake of hooch deaths in Ganjam, Rourkela Excise department Thursday seized 115 litres of duplicate Indian-Made Foreign Liquor (IMFL) and arrested five persons in this regard.

Besides, the Excise sleuths have seized one auto-rickshaw, one bike, one scooter and mobile phones of the persons involved in the illegal trade. Excise sources said the contraband was being brought from Jharkhand.

The department did not reveal the identity of the five accused in the case. Two of them are regular offenders and have cases against them in different police stations, sources said. The arrested individuals include the owner of a 'dhaba' and two auto-rickshaw drivers.

They used to bring the illicit liquor from Jharkhand for sale in



the roadside eateries or 'dhabas'. The total value of the seized contraband has been pegged at Rs 5 lakh. Further investigation is going on in this regard.

Speaking about the arrest and seizure, Excise official Archana Barik said, "We have launched an investigation into the matter. The arrests were made after we received a tip-off and came to know that the contraband was to be off-

Barik informed that the total seizure was 115 litre and five persons were arrested. "However, we are sure more people are involved in this," Barik said. One Kalu from Rourkela is the mastermind of the entire operation and search for him is on for some time, she added. Duplicate Excise Licence and faulty barcodes that could not be scanned properly led to the conclusion that the liquor consignment was duplicate.

DQC OF PLATE MILL ACHIEVES MAJOR BREAKTHROUGH

POST NEWS NETWORK

Rourkela, Sept 5: The Dynamic Quality Circle (DQC) group of the plate mill department of Rourkela Steel Plant (RSP) has successfully eliminated delays caused by failures of the groove roll gearbox bridge. It was their innovative project titled "Elimination of Delay Due to Groove Roll Gearbox Bridge Failure" that led to the success.

Notably, the plate mill relies on 12 groove rolls to feed slabs into the mill, with eight rolls, including one idle roll, on the entry side and four rolls on the delivery side.



These groove rolls are powered by three gearboxes. The Dynamic QC group identified that groove roll gearbox -2, positioned near the mill's work roll, was particularly vulnerable to failures.

The bridge of this gearbox, which supports the output gear train, frequently cracked at the welded joint due to uneven load conditions from the mill. These failures caused damage to both input and output gears resulting in significant delays, taking 10 to 12 hours to restore the gearbox to operational status.

Dynamic QC group SK Swain, deputy manager, JC Bisoi, MOMT, group leader, K Berik, OCT, Deputy leader, RP Hembrom, OCT, SK Behera, operator, S Sahoo, ACT and Anand Ekka, ACT found that while the outer sides of both bridges inside the gearbox were welded to the walls, the inner sides lacked ver-

tical support. To resolve this, the team cut two plates, each 20 mm thick, to fit into the blank spaces between the bridges. These plates were then fabricated and welded vertically to the bridges and the bottom of the gearbox, effectively transforming the two separate bridges into a single, sturdy structure. This modification now ensures that any uneven load from the mill is evenly distributed between the bridges, preventing the stress points that previously caused the welds to crack.

The innovative initiative has resulted in the complete elimination of delays caused by bridge failures enhancing production, performance and productivity.

Protesting Ethically

limate protesters have disrupted the tennis at Wimbledon, thrown tomato soup at the glass protecting famous paintings, sprayed orange powder on Stonehenge, and blocked traffic. In response, European governments have been cracking down on environmental protesters with detentions and fines, and, in one case, with a five-year prison sentence for advocating civil disobedience in a Zoom call.

Whether a protest is ethical is distinct from whether it is legal. As Martin Luther King, Jr., argued in his "Letter from a Birmingham Jail," protesters who engage in civil disobedience show their respect for the law when they behave nonviolently and accept the penalty that the law imposes.

We agree that nonviolence is a crucial element in an ethical protest, and that protesters who live in a democracy with safeguards against excessive penalties for nonviolent political actions should be willing to accept the penalty that the law imposes. But what counts as an excessive penalty depends on how much inconvenience protesters can ethically inflict on the public.

We suggest adapting the internationally recognised principle of proportionality in war. That principle prohibits military actions when the harm to civilians is disproportionate to the military advantage gained.

To target a single enemy commander, while foreseeing that the method used will kill hundreds of innocent civilians, is wrong.

Applying this approach to nonviolent protests in liberal democracies has four aspects. First, a "protest proportionality principle" should attempt to balance the annoyance to others against the number of citizens protesting. If a million people join a protest march, it is inevitable that they will fill the street, stopping traffic.

Princeton University professor Zeyner Tufekci is correct that contemporary mass protests have lost gravitas because social media has made them so much easier to organise. Instead of investing years building bonds between like-minded individuals and then leveraging such grassroots efforts to culminate in a national protest, organisers can simply send a tweet with a time and place to meet.

Yet such ease of communication does not invalidate the difference between five protesters and 500,000. People still have to be willing to give up their time and make the effort to turn out. Vast numbers of protesters tell a democracy that something may be fundamentally wrong (although it is also possible that the protesters are wrong).

The second component of the protest proportionality principle is the importance of the issue relative to the incon-

venience caused. Just because protesters are few in number does not necessarily make their actions wrong. The art-targeting climate activists are trying to spur us to action against a slow-motion crisis that has already harmed millions, and without drastic action, will alter our planet's climate in ways that harm billions. Even a small chance of waking people up to the need for change outweighs the disappointment of many tourists who are temporarily unable to see the Mona Lisa.

Of course, protesters tend to believe that their cause is crucial. If they are wrong, the protest may be unethical, even if it causes only minor

The third consideration is whether activists intend to inflict significant inconvenience or seek to minimise disruption. Protesters feel they are trapped in an activist's dilemma: the easiest way to gain publicity is to protest in a disruptive way that might turn public opinion against their cause. To break through the media fog, they believe they must cause

It can be hard to think of creative ways to let others know about injustice without disturbing their lives, but it can be done. Instead of disrupting a Christmas tree lighting for kids, protesters could hold a rogue tree-plant ing event in a public park. The originality of such a protest could go viral, while also ensuring that any response by bureaucrats, such as removing the newly planted trees, would only add to the media coverage.

Intentionally inflicting inconvenience is not necessarily unethical; it must be weighed in relation to the other protest proportionality factors, including who is being inconvenienced. This is the fourth factor. A dozen climate protesters blocking thousands of people from driving their kids to school or going to work is more ethically worrisome than disrupting the routine of those with the power to reduce greenhouse-gas emissions.

It is more ethical to inconvenience politicians and bureaucrats in their official capacity than the public. For democracies to function, public officials must know the views of citizens. Yet protesters need to consider the importance of the services to be disrupted. Interrupting a politicians' meeting with corporate lobbyists is easier to justify than blocking the provision of public services.

Whether we are assessing international conflicts or nonviolent protests, the principle of proportionality will not yield precise answers. Yet ethical considerations remain vital. Unethical activism, even when nonviolent, can easily spur counter-protests that spiral into violence. The principle of proportionality can serve as a useful guide to the factors that protesters should consider, enabling us to defend the right to protest while also specifying protesters' ethical responsibilities.

A STEALTHY ASSAULT

ith great-power rivalries again at the tional relations, democratic governments have been relying on secret statecraft to shape or sway regimes in weaker states, including by supporting or aiding regime change. Far from advancing democracy globally, these efforts are exacerbating its vulnerabilities at a time when authoritarianism is on the rise.

To be sure, local militaries with or without external backing - remain the leading drivers of regime change. In Pakistan, for example, the military reasserted its traditional dominance over government in 2022, when it engineered the ouster of Prime Minister Imran Khan. In Bangladesh, the military recently took advantage of a violent student-led uprising to compel Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to flee the country, before installing an interim civilian-led administration headed by Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus.

But external powers also often play a key role in driving regime change. Yes, the mechanisms remain murky. Since strategic skullduggery rarely leaves any political fingerprints, intervening powers can plausibly deny involvement, leaving independent analysts struggling to distinguish fact from fiction.

Nonetheless, it is usually fairly easy to see where an external power gets its leverage. China, for example, is the world's largest trading economy and official creditor for developing countries. While the details of China's loan agreements are far from transparent, there is no doubt that it attaches many strings to its funding, which increase its leverage over borrowers, possibly even driving them into sovereignty-eroding

The United States, for its part, dominates the international financial architecture, enjoys

considerable leverage over traditional lenders like the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund, and issues the world's main reserve currency. With these levers, it has significant power to reward or punish countries, including by imposing painful economic sanctions.

The US has long been accused of – and sometimes admitted to – helping to topple or prop up foreign regimes, including by meddling in elections or aiding uprisings, such as the "color revolutions" in some post-Soviet states. Some have even alleged that the US played a role in the recent overthrow of Khan in Pakistan and Hasina in Bangladesh, though US officials have denied any involvement.

The question is what a democracy like the US hopes to achieve by contributing to regime change. The answer cannot be lasting democratic breakthroughs, which rarely arrive in the wake of popular uprisings. Instead, countries are likely to face political instability, social disorder, and economic disruption. That is certainly the case in Bangladesh, which is now facing chaos and violence, with mobs burning down factories, hospitals, hotels, and homes.

A more likely explanation-for

which there is ample evidence – is that Western powers are seeking to advance their own geopolitical and economic interests by supporting "friendly" regimes and driving out "unfriendly" ones. The regimes' democratic credentials (or lack thereof) seem to matter little here, though Western powers do prefer that there is a pretense of democracy.

This helps to explain why military takeovers are often followed by elections or the installation, as in Bangladesh, of a government with a civilian face: military leaders hope to bolster the new government's international legitimacy and, in many cases, retain access to Western financial assistance. After all, the US is legally required to cut off aid to a country after a coup. After the military junta returned to power in Myanmar in 2021, US President Joe Biden's administration imposed stringent sanctions on the country and, later, began providing non-lethal aid to anti-junta forces.

But US leaders take great care in deciding which military takeovers to label as "coups." Of the more than two dozen military coups or indirect takeovers that have taken place in the last 15 years, the US refrained from condemning about half, because it considered the regime change favourable to its regional interests. In this sense, the US has often sacrificed democracy at the altar of geopolitics.

Elections alone – even if competitive - do not guarantee popular empowerment or adherence to constitutional rules, especially when the military holds decisive power. While the international community might view a civilian-led government positively – even if it is merely a façade for continued military control - domestic legitimacy may well be lacking, even when the coup-makers shed their uniforms and rebrand themselves "civilian" leaders, as the Thai army chief did after seizing power in 2014. (He remained in office as the country's "civilian" prime minister for nine years.)

Democracy is in retreat globally. Many populations are facing the erosion of their political rights and civil liberties. Even the world's leading democ racies are suffering from low public trust in governments and bitterly polarised politics. And closed autocracies now outnumber liberal democracies. By accepting or tolerating military rule – even behind a civilian façade – Western powers will only accelerate this trend.

Hyderabad, Sept 5: In an ecological disaster, an estimated 50.000 trees spread over about 500 acres in the forests of Mulugu district in Telangana were uprooted following a huge gale and a sudden cloud burst.

This happened on the night of August 31 because of local climatic conditions that suddenly developed there due to cloud formation, a senior forest official said Wednesday.

"We never saw such an incident in our lives," the official

With the massive wind and water gushing (in a particular width and length), it has destroyed the forest and big trees have been uprooted, he said.

The other reason why the trees got uprooted was that the plants do not develop a very deep root system as moisture and nutrition are easily available for them in the area, he said.

In some places, the root system is developed within one foot, he

Had it been a very deep root system, the damage would have been less, the official said. In some places, the top part was broken as one tree fell on another tree or the top might have got broken due to any "injury" to the tree.

The Forest department has started an enumeration of the damage, which is expected to be completed in about a fortnight once the ongoing rainfall sub-

The official said though cloud bursts have been reported from places like Himachal Pradesh, he has not come across damage to the forest on such a large extent of land.

Bangalore, Sept 5: The Air India's Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul facility being built in Bangalore is not only expected to generate over 1,200 new job opportunities for skilled aviation engineers in India, but it will also create seven times more indirect jobs for the local population, said Air India CEO and managing director Campbell Wilson Wednesday.

The ground-breaking ceremony for the MRO facility on a 35-acre land parcel at the Bangalore International Airport was held Wednesday.

"Studies have found that every job created at the airport had a simulated effect on the economy that resulted in seven more jobs. This is consistent with what we see in other parts of the world," said Wilson, who addressed a press conference elaborating on the reliant aviation eco-system for

According to Wilson, Air India has earmarked ₹1,400 crore for the MRO project, which is expected to become an important hub for Air India's aircraft maintenance operations in the region, as the airline modernises its fleet

and expands its global operations. The upcoming MRO facility will feature a mega hangar to accommodate wide body and narrow body aircraft under a single roof for base maintenance, said Wilson.

The facility, which will be equipped with the latest aircraft maintenance technology, including overhead tele platforms, cranes, universal docking systems, and the largest vertical lift hangar doors in the country, is expected to be completed by the end of 2025 and be operational by 2026, he said.

According to him, Air India

facility. Wilson also said Air India will be opening a Basic Maintenance Training Organisation (BMTO) in 2025, in Bengaluru, to ensure continuous inflow of trained personnel for aircraft maintenance and engineering activities.

"This will create opportunities for engineering students to receive training to become typerated engineers for certification. We are looking at training about 50 engineers initially," said Wilson.

Kanhaiya Lal murder accused granted bail

Jaipur: Mohammad Javed, one of the accused in the tailor Kanhaiya Lal murder case in Raiasthan's Udaipur in 2022. was Thursday granted bail by the Rajasthan High Court. Javed had pleaded for bail in the Jaipur bench of the high court after the NIA court denied him relief in the case Reacting to the development, former Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot alleged that the BJP used the case to gain electoral advantage, whereas BJP leader Rajendra Rathore said his party's government was committed to punishing the culprits behind the murder. Kanhaiva Lal was hacked to death at his shop in the busy Hathipole area of Udaipur in June 2022 by two cleaverwielding men - Mohammad Rivaz and Mohammad Gause for allegedly supporting a social media post against Islam, an incident that sent shockwaves across the country.

Rebellion in Haryana BJP

Chandigarh, Sept 5: A day after the ruling BJP announced its first list of 67 candidates for the October 5 Harvana Assembly polls, the party faced rebellion with minister Ranjit Singh Chautala and MLA Lakshman Dass Napa who were denied ticket quitting the party.

Energy and Jails Minister Ranjit Chautala (79), son of former Deputy Prime Minister Devi Lal, said he took a decision after a meeting with his supporters and will now enter the fray as an Independent. Napa quit the party after being denied ticket while former minister Karan Dev Kamboj also stepped down as state BJP's OBC Morcha chief after party ignored his candidature.

The rebel trouble for BJP started shortly after it came out with the first list of candidates as it left many sulking. After quitting the party, Napa met former Chief Minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda at his residence in the national capital and later said he will be joining the Congress along with his supporters. Ranjit Chautala called a meeting of his supporters after the party ignored his candidature from Rania segment in Sirsa district.

"I took the decision after consulting my supporters," he said when asked about his move. "I had good relations with them (BJP). They gave me Lok Sabha ticket (from Hisar, which he fought unsuccessfully). But don't know on whose advice they have acted. I will say anyone who has given them this advice has caused



damage to the party," Chautala said. Chautala was hoping to contest from Rania seat but the BJP fielded Shishpal Kamboj

Ranjit had resigned as Independent MLA from Rania ahead of the Lok Sabha polls to join the BJP and fought the Hisar parliamentary seat unsuccessfully

Napa, sitting MLA from Ratia reserve constituency in Fatehabad district, said he served his constituency with full dedication and undertook development works. He said he does not know why the party denied him re-nomination from the assembly segment. Napa said he had met Hooda Thursday morning. "I am joining Congress.

In another jolt to the BJP after it put out the first list of candidates, former minister Karan Dev Kamboj said he has resigned as state president of Haryana BJP's OBC Morcha and

from all party posts he held. Kamboj, who was also a ticket hopeful but did not get it, said he had been serving the party over the years with dedication. "Perhaps the BJP does not need loyalists anymore," he said, adding the party is rewarding leaders with tickets who joined a day before while ignoring those who served it for years.

Napa, in a letter to state party chief Mohan Lal Badoli shortly after the BJP put out the first list of 67 candidates for the polls, said he was resigning from the party's primary membership. A few sitting legislators, including minister Sanjay Singh and former minister Sandeep Singh, do not figure in the first list of BJP candidates.

Four soldiers die in Sikkim road mishap

New Delhi, Sept 5: Four Army personnel, on their way from their unit in Bengal to Sikkim, in a road accident in the latter's Pakyong district Thursday, officials said.

The accident occurred when the vehicle skidded off the road and fell into a deep gorge on the Rhenock Rongli state highway, popularly termed the Silk Route. The Army's Eastern Command, consoling the deaths of its personnel, identified them as Subedar K Thangapandi, Naik Gursev Singh, craftsman W Peter Singh and Sepoy Pradeep Patel.

Haryana has 15 cities among India's most polluted: Analysis

New Delhi, Sept 5: Fifteen out of 24 cities in Harvana ranked $among\,India \hbox{'s}\,100\,most\,polluted$ cities based on PM2.5 levels in the first half of 2024, according to a new analysis.

According to India's National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), safe limits for PM2.5 and PM10 annual levels are 40 micrograms per cubic metre and 60 micrograms per cubic metre, respectively. However, these limits are much higher than the World Health Organization's (WHO) 2021 guidelines, which recommend 5 micrograms per cubic metre for PM2.5 and 15 micrograms per cubic

Only three cities -- Palwal. Ambala, and Mandikhera -- man-

aged to keep PM2.5 levels below the NAAQS limits. Gurugram had the highest PM10 concentration at 227 micrograms per cubic metre while Ambala recorded the lowest at 79 micrograms per cubic metre.

"All 24 cities in Haryana over-

shot the WHO standards for particulate matter in the first half of the year. Fuel prices to go up in Punjab

Chandigarh, Sept 5: Fuel prices are set to go up in Punjab with the state Cabinet Thursday deciding to increase value-added tax (VAT) on petrol and diesel by 61 paise a litre and 92 paise per litre, respectively.

A decision in this regard was taken by the council of ministers in a meeting chaired by Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann here. At present, the retail price of petrol in Mohali stands at ₹97.01 per litre and diesel is priced at ₹87.21.



Already, the fuel is more expensive in Punjab than in Chandigarh. In the Union Territory of Chandigarh, prices of petrol and diesel are ₹94.24 and 82.40 per litre, respectively. Fuel pump owners strongly condemned the decision of the AAPled government, saying it would hit their business hard.

They further said it is the third time that the Bhagwant Mann-led government raised fuel prices in the past two-anda-half years. Addressing the media after the Cabinet meeting, Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema said the decision has been taken to raise VAT on petrol and diesel.

He said VAT on petrol will be raised by 61 paise and 92 paise a litre for diesel.

Reacting to the hike in VAT on fuel, Petrol Pump Dealers'Association, Punjab, spokesperson Monty Sehgal criticised the state government's decision. He said with the hike in VAT on fuel, the sales of petrol and diesel located in border districts will be impacted as their business will shift to neighbouring states where the fuel is less expensive.

Kejriwal, CBI spar over bail; SC reserves verdict

New Delhi, Sept 5: Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal Thursday vehemently opposed in the Supreme Court the CBI's argument that he should have approached the trial court first for bail in the corruption case linked to the alleged excise policy scam, asserting it would not be fair to send the matter back to the trial court at this stage.

After protracted arguments by the counsel for the beleaguered AAP leader and the central probe agency, the court reserved its judgement on separate pleas filed by Kejriwal for bail and against his arrest by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

Questioning the maintainability of Kejriwal's pleas, Additional Solicitor General S V Raju, appearing for the central agency, submitted that even in the money laundering case in which he had challenged his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate (ED), he was sent back by the apex court to the trial court.

"He has approached Delhi High Court directly without going to sessions court. Under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), both have concurrent jurisdiction. My preliminary objection is he must first go to trial court." "He seems to be an extraordinary person who requires different approach. When all other Aam

Aaadmis (common people) go to the trial court for bail, there cannot be a special treatment for anyone," Raju told a a bench of Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan. Raju said if the Supreme Court grants bail to Kejriwal, it will demoralise the Delhi High Court, while had upheld his arrest. Countering Raju's submissions, senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, appearing for the chief minister, said the questions arising for consideration in the present bail case have already been extensively dealt with by the trial court dur-

ing remand. "It's not a fair argument for CBI to raise at this stage. You cannot consider sending me back there. Arguments were looked into during remand and affirmed against me. It is not fair to raise that argument now. At this stage, there is huge delay involved since it has been heard on merits. I am giving the right of appeal. CBI should be the last one to complain," Singhvi said.

Pointing out alleged legal infirmities in the case, Singhvi said no notice was served to Kejriwal by the CBI before his arrest and an ex-parte arrest order was passed by the trial court. Caling it as a mere "technicality", the ASG said the CBI did not issue a notice to Kejriwal under section Section 41A of the Code of Criminal Procedure as he was already in judicial custody.





New Delhi, Sept 5: The National Medical Commission Thursday withdrew and cancelled guidelines under Competency Based Medical Education Curriculum in which it had reintroduced sodomy and lesbianism as unnatural sexual offences in the forensic medicine and toxicology curriculum for undergraduate medical

The guidelines were issued on August 31. "It is informed that the Circular of even number dated 31.08.2024 thereby issuing Based Medical Education Curriculum (CBME) 2024, stands "withdrawn and cancelled" with immediate effect. The above guidelines will be revised and uploaded in due course," the National Medical Commission (NMC) said.

Besides sodomy and lesbianism, the NMC had brought back topics such as the hymen and its type, and its medico-legal importance in addition to defining virginity and defloration, legitimacy and its medico-legal importance. These subjects were done away with in 2022 in accordance with a Madras High Court directive. The revised

curriculum under forensic medicine and toxicology also includes "Describe legal competencies including Bharatiya

Nagarika Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), Bharatiya Nyay Sanhita (BNS), Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam (BSA)" besides "Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO). Civil and Criminal Cases, Inquest (Police Inquest and Magistrate's Inquest), and cognisable and non-cognisable offences"

It talks about discussing sexual perversions, fetishism, transvestism, voyeurism, sadism, necrophagia, masochism, exhibitionism, frotteurism and necrophilia. However, distinctions between consensual sex between queer individuals have been removed, a source said.

The amended curriculum has done away with the seven-hour training on disability. At the end of teaching-learn-

ing in forensic medicine and toxicology, the student should be able to understand the medicolegal framework of medical practice, codes of conduct, medical ethics, professional misconduct and medical negligence, conducting medico-legal examination and documentation of various medico-legal cases and understand latest Acts and laws related to medical professional including relatedcourt judgments, the NMC said in its document.



Moscow, Sept 5: Russian President Vladimir Putin Thursday named India among the three countries he is constantly in touch over the Ukraine conflict and said they are sincerely making efforts to resolve it. TASS news agency reported.

Putin's remarks came within two weeks after Prime Minister Narendra Modi's historic visit to Ukraine where he held talks with President President Volodymyr Zelenskyy.

"We respect our friends and partners, who, I believe, sincerely seek to resolve all issues surrounding this conflict, primarily China, Brazil and India. I constantly keep in touch with our colleagues on this issue," Putin was quoted as saying by the Russian news agency.

Russian Separately, Presidential Spokesman Dmitry Peskov told the Izvestia daily

He, however, said there are "no specific plans" on Modi mediating on the issue.

"At this time they can hardly exist, as we do not see any preconditions for talks for now,' the Kremlin spokesman said.

Modi August 23 visited Ukraine where he conveyed to President Zelenskyy that both Ukraine and Russia should sit together without wasting time to end the ongoing war and that India was ready to play an "active role" to restore peace in the region.

Macron names former Brexit negotiator Barnier as new PM

At 73, Barnier will be the oldest PM in France's modern political history, taking over from Gabriel Attal, who was youngest

Paris. Sept 5: French President Emmanuel Macron appointed Michel Barnier, the European Union's former Brexit negotiator, as his new prime minister Thursday, in a bid to put an end to political paralysis following an inconclusive snap election.

A key question will now be whether Barnier's government will manage to get reforms adopted by a deeply divided parliament.

The discreet, conservative politician will quickly face a baptism of fire as time is running out to prepare France's 2025 budget, which could trigger a vote of no confidence if other parties are not satisfied.

Barnier first became a lawmaker aged 27, and later held roles in several French governments, including foreign minister and agriculture minister. He is best known abroad for having led



the EU's talks with Britain over its exit from the bloc from 2016-2021. Macron had considered a string of potential prime ministers in recent weeks, none of whom

mustered enough support to guarantee a stable government, which was his key criteria. There is no guarantee Barnier's government will be able to convince parliament to adopt reforms

or keep him in power for long. But at least the far-right National Rally (RN), the biggest single party in parliament after the early July election, signalled earlier Thursday it would not immediately reject Barnier if

he met certain conditions. Barnier is a staunch pro-European and a moderate career politician, but he toughened his discourse considerably during his failed 2021 bid to get his conservative party's ticket for the presidential election, saying immigration was out of control - a view shared by the RN.



The overall passenger vehicle (PV) registrations last month stood at 3,09,053 units, as compared to 3,23,720 units in August

"Even with the arrival of the festive season, the market remains under significant strain... Inventory levels have reached alarming levels, with stock days now stretching to 70-75 days and inventory totalling 7.8 lakh vehicles, valued at an alarming ₹77,800 crore," Federation of Automobile Dealers Associations (FADA) President Manish Raj Singhania said in a statement.

Rather than responding to the situation, PV Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs) continue to increase dispatches to dealers on a monthon-month basis, further exacerbating the issue, he added.

'FADA urgently calls upon all banks and NBFCs to intervene and immediately control funding to dealers with excessive inventory." Singhania said, adding that dealers must also act swiftly to stop taking on additional stock to protect their financial health.

The OEMs, too, must recalibrate their supply strategies without delay, or the industry

Sebi employees stir at HQ; demand **Buch's resignation**

Mumbai, Sept 5: A large number of Sebi employees protested outside the capital markets regulator's headquarters Thursday seeking chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch's resignation.

The staffers, numbering over 200 as per an estimate, held a silent protest outside the main building in the Bandra Kurla Complex, housing Buch and other officials' offices.

None of the protesting employees spoke to the media, but a handout purported to have been drafted by the protesting officials sought the withdrawal of a press release issued by Sebi Wednesday and also Buch's resignation. The protesting employees assembled in front of the building and were seen standing there for about 90 minutes before dispersing.

For Puri, protests and internal issues have come at a time when she is probably facing the most challenging times in her stint. The career banker-turned-regulator is battling speculations on whether a conflict of interest made her go slow on the probe against Adani Group and a raft of other allegations around it.

This is not the first instance of a protest at the Sebi, which witnessed a similar protest over a month ago by some employees.

In what is unprecedented for any financial regulator, around 500 employees are reported to have written to the Finance Ministry on August 6 against the top management for what they called a "toxic" work environment, which includes instances of public humiliation and shouting down.

Gadkari against EV subsidies

New Delhi, Sept 5: Union minister Nitin Gadkari Thursday said there is no need to provide subsidy to electric vehicle makers as consumers are now choosing EVs or CNG vehicles on their own.

Addressing BNEF Summit, Gadkari said initially costs of manufacturing electric vehicles were high, but as demand has increased, production costs have dropped, making further subsidies unnecessary.

"Consumers are now choosing electric and compressed natural gas (CNG) vehicles on their own and I do not think we need to provide much subsidy for electric vehicles," the road transport and highways minister said.

The minister pointed out that GST on electric vehicle is lower than petrol and diesel ve-

"In my opinion, manufacturing of electric vehicles no longer needs to be subsidised by the government. The ask for subsidies isn't justified anymore," he said.

At present, 28 per cent GST is levied on vehicles powered by



internal combustion engines. including hybrids, and 5 per cent on electric vehicles

While ruling out additional Gadkari said the overall shift away from fossil fuels to alternative fuels would be a gradual process, given the size of India's economy and energy needs.

The minister also opined that further reduction in cost of lithium-ion battery will bring down the cost of electric vehicles.

"Within 2 years, the cost of diesel, petrol and electric vehicles will be same...at the starting time, cost of EVs were very high, so we needed to subsidised EV manufacturers," he said.

Asked whether the government will extend FAME scheme, the minister said, "FAME scheme subsidy is a good subject and it is not related to my ministry." On Wednesday, Union Heavy Industries Minister HD

Kumaraswamy has said the government is expected to finalise the third phase of its flagship electric mobility adoption scheme FAME in a month or two.

He has said that an inter-ministerial group is working on the inputs received for the scheme. and efforts are being made to address the issues in the first two phases of the Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of (Hybrid and) Electric Vehicle (FAME) scheme.

FAME 3 will replace the temporary Electric Mobility Promotion Scheme (EMPS) 2024, which is set to expire in September.

The second phase of FAME was rolled out in 2019 with an initial outlay of ₹10,000 crore for three years. It was later extended up to March 2024 with an additional outlay of ₹1,500 crore

The initial target of the scheme was to support 10 lakh electric two-wheelers, 5 lakh electric three-wheelers, 55,000 passenger cars, and 7,000 elec-

The country's crude steel production shot up by over 35 million tonne in the last four years, from 109.14 million tonne in 2019-20 to 144.30 million tonne in 2023-24, as per the latest government data last month.

Addressing the 'ISA Steel Conclave' in the national capital, Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal, said the industry leaders should focus their energy on economies of scale through decarbonisation, as "green steel will be in more demand".

"This is India's decade to show innovation, inclusion, collaboration and cooperation among different sectors of Indian industries to realise the vision of Viksit Bharat," said the minister.

Hailing the steel industry for branding domestic steel as a 'Made in India' product, Minister Goyal said it is a signal of "our growing Atmanirbharta".

Singapore, Sept 5: India's stock market rally is ramping up its index weighting and creating a dilemma for global fund managers: sit back and watch as their relative exposure shrinks while the market grows, or buy in at increasingly eye-watering prices.

Most find the latter uncomfortably risky and are seeking alternatives, some driving money into India's smaller companies, while others are looking elsewhere at other emerging markets.

The trend has been driven by years of strong earnings in India at the same time as China's markets have stumbled, upending their weightings in the MSCI Emerging Markets' Index which serves as a benchmark for global EM funds.

India's MSCI EM weight has shot to 19%, up from just 8% four years ago and analysts at Nuvama Alternative & Quantitative Research expect it to top 22% by the end of this year. China's weighting over the 40% to 25%, data from MSCI

"The convergence between India and China is causing problems for a lot of portfolio managers because if you had a global mandate or a pan-Asia mandate, you probably were at best equal weight India and probably underweight," said Vikas Pershad. portfolio manager for Asian equities at M&G Investments. "And that underweight is growing."

Part of the reason for the longterm underweight has been that many investors preferred China's cheaper and dynamic market, while entry and exit costs for funds can be high in India. Managers would need to buy

The 35-year-old Dharambir broke the Asian record with a throw of 34.92m en route to the gold medal Wednesday at the Paralympics with Pranav Soorma clinching the silver with a throw of 34.59m.

"I am feeling very proud. For any athlete, winning a medal at the Paralympics is a dream and it has come true with this. My guide Amit Kumar Saroha has played a big role in it,' Dharambir said Thursday.

"We came into the sport after getting to know about him (Saroha). I hope the next generation (of athletes) will see us

and get into this sport," he added.

Dharambir, who has been guided by the 39-year-old Amit, dedicated the award to the veteran sportsperson. "I dedicate this award to my guru Amit Saroha. His blessings are with me since the start and that is why I was able to win this medal," he said.

While Dharambir will return home as one of India's gold medallists at the Paralympics, he was in trouble when he fouled the first four of his throws. Under pressure, Dharambir looked towards Amit, who gave him an assuring look and things fell in place for him

"At the start I made a few fouls because the gum (glue) had not set in," he said. "Pressure is also a major factor. I made eye contact with my coach and the fifth throw came out well," Dharambir added.

A quadriplegic who feels that the accident which left him wheelchair-bound was a 'blessing in disguise', Soorma quite lives up to his last name which will now get its fair share of fame after a silver medal on debut at the Paralympic Games.

Soorma was just 16 when a cement sheet fell on him leaving his spinal cord severely damaged causing loss of movement in his legs and hands. Even gripping the wooden club is a massive task for him and he has to use glue to hold it and compete in the event.

Kapil bags historic judo bronze

Paris, Sept 5: Kapil Parmar bagged India's first-ever Paralympic medal in judo, winning a bronze in the men's 60kg (J1) after convincingly defeating Brazil's Elielton de Oliveira in the play-off here Thursday. Parmar produced a superlative performance, dominating his opponent to record a 10-0 win in the bronze medal contest. It was India's 25th medal of the competition and matched the target predicted by president of Paralympic Committee of India (PCI), Devendra Jhajharia.

Kapil had earlier lost to S Banitaba Khorram Abadi in the semifinals, beaten 0-10 by his Iranian opponent. The J1 class in para judo is for the athletes who suffer from no to very low visual activity. Athletes in this category wear red circles to indicate that they may need guided support before, during and after a contest.

Parmar, who won the silver medal at the 2022 Asian Games in the same category, had earlier beaten Venezuela's Marco Dennis Blanco 10-0 in the quarterfinals.

Singh is King of archery

Paris, Sept 5: Dealing with the unexpected, whether in archery or life in general, is no big deal for Harvinder Singh. He has aced the anticipation game thanks to the hard lessons that came his way. In the final Harvinder overwhelmed his 44-year-old opponent from Poland, Lukasz Ciszek 6-0 (28-24, 28-27, 29-25) here Wednesday.

The 33-year-old from Haryana. who scripted history by becoming the first Indian archer to win a Paralympics gold, has impaired legs owing to a dengue treatment gone wrong when he was just one year old but instead of lamenting his fate, he chose to become bigger than his circumstances.

Harvinder's journey to Paralympics glory began with a bronze three years back in Tokyo, which made him the first Indian to finish on the Games podium. All his achievements are a first in Indian archery. And when he is not shooting down medals, Harvinder is busy pursuing a Ph.D in economics.

"In the last few months, I was shooting very well in practice,



happen," Harvinder was quoted as saying by 'World Archery'. "Archery is a game of unexpected. Everything can happen. I focused on one arrow at a time. Only the next arrow counts. Harvinder added.

Harvinder was India's second medal winner in archery at the ongoing Games after Sheetal Devi and Rakesh Kumar combined for the compound mixed team bronze.

What works best for Harvinder is to stay in the moment and not

think too far ahead. "I was just focusing on my next match. Only that way, I could move to the next round, and one by one, I moved to the final. And eventually won

gold," he described his process. Three years back in Tokyo, Harvinder who hails from Ajitnagar in Kaithal district of Harvana, could not realise his dream of a gold. He said his teammates had a role to play in instilling belief in him that he could

aim for the top podium finish. "In Tokyo, I won bronze, so I'm happy I could change the colour of my medal. Before the (Paris) Games, everybody told me I had a chance to get gold. I'm happy I was able to," said Harvinder.

'We can't take Bangla lightly'

Sept 5: Wicketkeeper-batter Rishabh Pant warned against taking Bangladesh lightly in the upcoming two-Test series, and stressed on the need for India to keep improving themselves to stay ahead of the competition. The 30-year-old will next face Karolina Muchova of the Czech Republic.

Draper defeated Alex de Minaur of Australia 6-3, 7-5, 62 and became the first British player to reach the semifinals after Andy Murray who achieved the feat in 2012.

Sinner, 23, is the only top-10 player to make the semifinals with No. 12 Taylor Fritz due to face US compatriot Frances Tiafoe, ranked 20, in Friday's other last four duel

Sinner said he was looking forward to facing Draper. "We are good friends off the court. He's having an incredible tournament and hasn't dropped a set,"the Italian added.
