New Delhi. Oct 16: In an initiative shedding the colonial imprint and traditional attributes, the statue of Lady Justice, in the judges' library of the Supreme Court, now holds a copy of the Indian Constitution, instead of a sword, and the blindfold has come off to leave her with open eyes

The change effected under the tenure of incumbent Chief Justice of India (CJI) DY Chandrachud, now signals that the law in the country is not blind and does not merely symbolise punishment. Traditionally, the blindfold suggested equality before the law, meaning that the dispensation of justice should not be influenced by the status, wealth, or power of the parties. The sword historically symbolised authority and the capacity to punish injustice.

In a departure from colonial influences, like the replacement of the colonial-era penal code with the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, the new Lady Justice signifies that the law in the country sees everyone equally as mandated under the

Deputy Commissioner of Police (IGI) Usha Rangnani said, "Airport police has responded to eight incidents involving reported bomb threats this month. After thorough verifications and inspection, all threats were confirmed to be hoaxes.

"Legal action has been initiated against those responsible for these false alarms to ensure strict measures against misuse and to maintain the safety and security of passengers and airport operations," she said.

She said an FIR under Section 217 and 351(4) of BNS, as well as section 3(1)(d) of the Suppression of Unlawful Acts Against Safety of Civil Aviation Act, 1982, has been registered in connection with the recent hoax bomb threat concerning Akasa Air flight.

Entry curbs at Srimandir

Puri, Oct 16: Keeping in view the possible massive congregation of devotees on the occasion of the holy month Kartik, Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) Wednesday announced a restriction on entry into the 12th Century shrine from October 18.

From that day, the devotees would be allowed entry only through the Singhadwara (Lion's Gate) and the Western Gate.

At present, the devotees enter the temple through all four gates of the shrine. Except for the Lion's Gate, the other three gates can be used by the devotees to leave the temple, according to an order issued by the SJTA.

The restriction won't apply to the temple servitors and their family members. The SJTA has urged all to adhere to these rules so that darshan becomes smooth and organised.

Taking to X, SJTA chief administrator Arabinda Padhee said: "The auspicious month of Kartik is knocking on the door. Along with performing several important rituals of Lord Jagannath, it is our duty to ensure that darshan arrangements for devotees and those keeping the fast are well-planned.'

State to constitute Law **Revision Commission**

Bhubaneswar, Oct 16: Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan Wednesday said that a Law Revision Commission will be formed within next 45 days to review the old laws which have become obsolete, and suggest ways to bring in reforms.

He said that irrelevant and obsolete laws need to be amended and this could only be done by constituting a Law Revision Commission.

"We will bring necessary amendment to the Right to Information (RTI) Act. Odisha will be a model state in the country for implementation of the RTI Act." said the Law minister.

Attending the workshop on RTI Act, Harichandan said the state government will take decisions regarding the cases registered against RTI activists to intimidate them. "We will bring in amendments to Odisha RTI Act and will change the rules such as withdrawal of mandatory forms and fees, renewal and publication of self-disclosed information, review of all the false cases lodgedagainst RTI activists," the minister

asserted.

Canada-India standoff seen as image booster for Modi, Trudeau think tank, said the more

New Delhi/Ottawa, Oct 16: At a time when diplomatic ties between Canada and India have hit a new low following expulsion of six Indian diplomats by Canada and a tit-for-tat move by India, foreign affairs experts are of the view that the current escalation would rather benefit both Modi and Trudeau in their image makeover; even as both the leaders face domestic challenges.

Canada kicked out six Indian diplomats Monday, linking them to the murder of a Sikh separatist leader and alleging a broader effort to target Indian dissidents in Canada. India retaliated by telling six Canadian diplomats to leave.

Although the tit-for-tat move sent bilateral relations skidding to a new low, Narendra Modi and Justin Trudeau are unlikely to mind too much. Both leaders are in their third terms and face political challenges

could bolster Modi's image as a hawk on national security.

"I think people will see the government of India standing up to intimidation and coercive measures applied by a developed country," said Harsh Vardhan Shringla, India's former foreign secretary. "The public will strongly back Prime



No hard proof of India's involvement: Trudeau Ottawa: Canadian PM Justin Trudeau Wednesday acknowledged that he

had only intelligence and no "hard evidentiary proof" when he alleged the involvement of Indian government agents in the killing of Khalistani separatist Hardeep Singh Nijjar last year. Testifying before the public inquiry into foreign interference in federal electoral processes and democratic institutions, Trudeau claimed the Indian diplomats were collecting information on Canadians who are in disagreement with the Narendra Modi government and passing it to the highest levels within the Indian government and criminal organisations.

Minister Modi and the govern-

ment." he said. In a June election, Modi suffered a setback when the BJP unexpectedly lost its majority. In his weakened position, Modi is forced to rely on regional allies

to form a coalition government. Canada is home to the highest population of Sikhs outside their home state of Punjab, or about 2 per cent of Canada's population. Demonstrations in recent years to carve a separate homeland have irked India's government, which regularly accuses Canada of harboring separatists.

Harsh Pant, foreign policy head at the New Delhi-based Observer Research Foundation

Trudeau targeted India, the better it was for Modi. '(He is seen as) a leader of a

country standing up for the territorial integrity and sovereignty of a nation. ... That someway encapsulates why Modi and his popularity will not be dented," he said.

For Trudeau, whose Liberal Party is trailing far behind in the polls for a national election that must be held by October 2025, the news took the spotlight off a supposed effort by unhappy legislators to urge him to quit and let a new leader take over. "There will be time to talk about internal party intrigue at another moment," he told reporters when asked about the matter Sunday.





NHRC issues notice to Delhi govt over Odisha woman rape

Bhubaneswar, Oct 16: The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) Wednesday issued notices to the Chief Secretary, Government of NCT of Delhi, and the Commissioner of Police, Delhi, calling for a detailed report within two weeks on the rape of a 34-year-old woman from Odisha October 10.

Hearing a plea filed by human rights activist Radhakanta Tripathy, the NHRC has also asked for a report on the victim's health status, the progress of police investigation, and the steps taken to provide relief and rehabilitation to the victim, who is currently under medical treat-

It sought information on measures being taken or proposed to prevent such incidents, which violate the dignity of women, from recurring in the future.

Prez on 3-day visit to state from Oct 23

Bhubaneswar, Oct 16: President Droupadi Murmu is scheduled to visit Odisha for three days from October 23 during which she will lay the foundation of several key railway and development projects in the state, an official statement said.

The President will land at

Bangriposi helipad in

Mayurbhanj district at 9.55 am October 23. From there, she will proceed to Bangriposi railway station by road and lay the foundation of three new railway Bangriposi-Gorumahisani, Buramara-Chakulia and Badampahar-Kendujhargarh, it said. Murmu is also scheduled to virtually lay the foundation of three proj ects - tribal research centre, an airport, and a sub-divisional hospital. Later in the day, the President will fly to Rangamathia and visit Uparbeda Government Upper Primary School in

her village. On October 24, the President will visit Srimandir in Puri and seek the blessings of the sibling deities. She is scheduled to attend the 75th anniversary celebration of Gopabandhu Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya, the release said.

Later that afternoon, she is scheduled to return to Bhubaneswar and attend the 40th convocation of Odisha University of Agriculture and Technology. In the evening around 6 pm, she will attend the grand opening of the newly-constructed judicial court complex in the state.

The President will spend the night at Raj Bhavan October 24 and is slated to unveil a statue of Pandit Raghunath Murmu in Bhubaneswar's Niladri Vihar

FAKE CALL CENTRE BUSTED

6 CYBER CROOKS HELD

DEBADURLLAV HARICHANDAN, OP

Bhubaneswar, Oct 16: The Commissionerate Police Wednesday busted a fake call centre running from a rented accommodation in Sundarpada area under Airfield police limits here and arrested six Kolkatabased youths. The fraudsters were using the illicit 'mail bombarding' method and sending a huge number of emails to netizens, especially those based in the US, who have taken subscriptions of anti-virus software.

The police seized six laptops 11 mobile phones, internet routers, cables, and other incriminating materials from them during the raid, said a senior officer of Cyber police station.

Bhubaneswar Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Pinak Mishra said on the receipt of reliable inputs, a team of six officials from Cyber police station swung into action around 8 am and raided the apartment. "As of now, we have not found any evidence of their links with any anti-national activity. However, assistance has been sought from cyber experts for more investigation into the case," said the DCP, adding that the police would seek an extra remand of the accused after producing them in the court Wednesday.

According to a source at the Cyber police station, the accused were identified as Sameer Mobin, 26, Md Javed Hussain, 26, Md Tosif, 23, Faizan Alam, 24, Sueb Raza, 22, and Md Haider Ali, 34.

"They were staying in Block A-205 of Kanchan Towers at Balabhadrapur on rent. They were not having regular interactions



What is mail bombarding?

'Mail bombarding' is a form of a denial-of-service attack which can fill a user's mail inbox by sending a number of emails. It targets to overwhelm the recipient's disk space on the server or overload a server to stop it from functioning. It is worth mentioning that the incident has come close on the heels of a 'fake sim box setup' that was busted by City police in August this year. Raids were conducted at multiple places including Bhubaneswar, Cuttack and Ranchi.

"Those were phishing mails used by scamsters to steals users' data and credentials used under the guise of anti-virus service providers, he added.

"As the users opened these mails, it re-directed them to a page, which asked them to contact a toll-free number. On receiving the calls, the accused would ask the users to connect over Skype calls to resolve the issues. In the meantime, they would hack the system, and take control of their passwords and other important bank credentials to swindle money," he added.

OIC FUNCTIONING WITHOUT CHIEF

The report says that the estimated waiting period for an appeal/complaint to be disposed by Odisha Information Commission is 3 years and 11 months

Bhubaneswar, Oct 16: The Odisha Information Commission (OIC) is one of the five commissions in the country which were functioning without a chief information commissioner (CIC), said a report on performance of Information Commissions (ICs) released here by Satark Nagrik Sangathan at the state-level workshop organised by Odisha Soochana Adhikar Abhiyan (OSAA) Wednesday.

The workshop was held on the topic on 'RTI Act—Reshaping Indian Democracy'

The chief of Odisha Information Commission (OIC) demitted office October 4 and since then the post has been lying vacant, the report said.

The report card revealed a troubling rise in the backlog of appeals and complaints, with over 4 lakh cases piling up across the 29 information commissions

The situation underscores the increasing delays in citizens' access to information, with many commissions facing waits of over a year to resolve cases.

nationwide as of June 30, 2024.

As per report, OIC is functioning with two commissioners despite having a large pendency of more than 20,000 appeals and complaints. The assessment shows that the estimated waiting time for an appeal/complaint to be disposed by the OIC is three years and 11 months.

The Central Information Commission (CIC) is made up of a chief information commis-

sioner (CIC) and up to 10 information commissioners (ICs) as per the Right to Information

The RTI Act was enacted in 2005 to provide a practical regime for people to exercise their fundamental right to information by accessing information from public authorities.

Unfortunately, nineteen years after the RTI Act was implemented, experience in India suggests that the functioning of information commissions is a major bottleneck in the effective implementation of the RTI law.

Large backlog of appeals and complaints in many commissions across the country have resulted in inordinate delays in disposal of cases, which render the law ineffective.

"One of the primary reasons for the backlogs is the failure of Central and state governments to take timely action to appoint information commissions to the CIC and state information commissions, respectively," OSAA convener Pradeep Jena said.

Attending the workshop, Law Minister Prithviraj Harichandan said, "We will bring amendments in Odisha Right to Information Act and will change the rules such as withdrawal of mandatory forms and fees, renewal and publication of self-disclosed information and review of all false cases against RTI activists.'

Election after election, the villagers cast their valuable votes and elect representatives with the hope of receiving constitutional recognition and benefits. However, they have been left in the lurch for many decades in the absence of local self-government.

The tribal communities residing in these villages have repeatedly demonstrated in front of the offices of Rourkela Sub-Collector, RMC, and also the Rourkela Additional District Magistrate pressing for their demands, but there has been no progress in this regard.

Residents say they have been living in the eight villages since pre-Independence times. The tribal population has been the original inhabitants of these villages. However, neither the

representatives have paid any attention to their demands for in-

clusion in a local body. Their

votes in every election go to

waste, they lamented. Moreover, the state's Panchayati Raj department has not extended any kind of grants or benefits to these villages owing to the non-inclusion. The tribal villagers had met the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST) in Delhi September 26, 2018 to bring their issues to its attention. The NCST then ordered a ground survey and asked the Panchayati Raj department and the district administration to

submit a report on the matter. As per the order, a boundary survey of these eight villages was conducted August 20 in 2022. The survey showed that Tangarpali, Rengadi, Badasuna Parbat, and Jharmunda are closer to Suidi panchayat in Lathikata block, while Bankia. Luakera, Tumkela, and Hamirpur are near Jhirpani panchayat under Bisra block.

However, even after the survey, these villages have not been included in the panchayats. Frustrated with the situation, the tribals are now planning to resort to protests if their demands are not met.

On the other hand, efforts are being made to bring these villages under the RMC, despite the Orissa High Court's interim stay order issued March 27, 2015 regarding the municipal elections.

The tribals have protested such efforts to include the villages in the RMC area without their consent. They argue that they are indigenous people and should be included in the panchayat. They wish to live a free life with out the burden of various municipal taxes such as house tax, road tax, and electricity tax, which would be a hardship for them, said local tribal leaders like Lachhu Oram, Mangra Oram, Ramchandra Sahu, Gajendra Tanti, Sonu Madek, Pyari Kerketa, and Jashenta.

Questioned in this regard, Additional District Magistrate, Rourkela Ashutosh Kulkarni said all the necessary reports regarding these eight villages have already been submitted to the Odisha Panchayati Raj department. The MLA of Raghunathpali has also made considerable initiative in bringing these issues to the attention of the department. The decision is expected to come after a hearing, he added.

Villagers attack police team in Binika; 22 held

According to reports, three minor boys from Rampur village allegedly attacked a villager and attempted to loot his mobile and bike near Singhijuba-Khairamal road Tuesday night. However, they were caught, brutally thrashed and held hostage by the villagers inside the club

When police Wednesday morning tried to take the trio into their custody, they were opposed by the villagers. Binika police then sought the help of Rampur police and deployed a platoon of force in front of the club house. While a discussion was going on between the police and the villagers, police tried to rescue the accused from the club

house which irked the villagers. The angry villagers attacked the accused along with the police team injuring Sub Inspector Sujata Budek, ASI Trinath Sahu and constable Gopinath Sahu of Binika PS. The villagers also ransacked the police van, broke its windshields and punctured

Later, more police personnel rushed to the spot and rescued



at the Binika PS after a medical examination. Following a complaint lodged by the villagers, police registered a case against the three accused and arrested them. Similarly, Binika police also registered a case (357/24) against the villagers for attacking police personnel as per a written complaint lodged by injured SI Sujata Budek. Police arrested 22 villagers and forwarded them to the court. The number of arrests may increase, informed the police.

On the other hand, hundreds of villagers from Singhijuba, Papi and Anandnagar area gathered in front of Binika police station. Meanwhile, Northern Range IG Himansu Kumar Lal reached the police station and took stock of the situation. Subarnapur SP Ram Prasad Sahu, Sonepur SDPO Pratap Tripathy and IIC Sarangadhar Panigrahi along with a police team rushed to the spot and launched an investigation.

Woman held for stepson's murder

Rourkela: A 20-year-old woman allegedly killed her five-year-old stepson by throwing him into a wel after blindfolding him and tying his hands in Sundargarh district, a police officer said Wednesday. The 20-year-old woman, who also tied a large stone to his body before throwing him into the well, was arrested. She was not happy as her husband loved that boy more than her own child, the officer said. The incident occurred October 11 in a village under Raghunathpali police station near Rourkela town. The police arrested the accused Nauri Gudia who was remanded to judicial custody by a local court Wednesday.

Elderly woman dies, youth critical in train accident

Balasore, Oct 16: In a tragic incident, a 78-year-old woman was killed after she was hit by a train at Angaragadia level crossing in Balasore district Wednesday. A youth who tried to save the elderly woman was critically injured in the mishap.

The deceased has been identified as Padmabati Das, 78, a resident of Sambalpur district, and the critically injured youth is a resident of Armala village in Balsore district.

The incident occurred when the Shatabdi Express was coming on the down line track and commuters had been stopped on both sides of the tracks at Angaragadia level crossing



However, Padmabati was trying to cross the railway tracks when the train hit her leading to her death on the spot. In the mean time, a youth from Armala area attempted to save the elderly woman and was hit by the train.

The injured youth was immediately rescued and rushed to the district headquarters hospital at Balasore for treatment. However as his condition deteriorated he was later shifted to SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack. After the accident, the train was halted for a while at the level crossing.

Informed, GRP personnel rushed to the spot, seized the body and sent it for post-mortem. Police, after registering a case (92/24) of unnatural death, initiated an investigation into the incident. The body was handed over to her family members after post-mortem. As per their statement, the deceased was mentally challenged.

Steel City girl's innovation set to revolutionise diabetes care

Rourkela, Oct 16: Komal Panda, 22. a resident of Rourkela and a fourthyear industrial and product design student at the National Institute of Design (NID), Haryana, has been named the national winner of the James Dyson Award-2024 for her innovative design project named 'Novocarry'.

Announced September 11, 2024, the award recognises her design of a portable cooling solution for medications like insulin, which require refrigeration during transport. The device addresses the need for discreet, convenient, and reliable storage for users. From a young age, Panda has pas-

sionately pursued drawing and attended art classes. While she initially had no exposure to industrial design, her journey of exploration ultimately led her to discover the field and the NID. Notably, product and industrial design applies creativity to solve real-world problems by creating practical, appealing, and efficient products for everyday use.

The young designer notes that her father, a diabetic patient, was the first user and test subject for the project. She actively sought his feedback to refine and enhance her product design.

"My father, a diabetic who works at Rourkela Steel Plant, faces a daily challenge during lunch breaks-he rushes home to take his insulin shot before eating because there's no refrigerator at his workplace to store insulin at the required temperature,'

Panda said that ice packs to store the insulin vial proved impractical, melting quickly and requiring con-

stant replacement. She also said that shared refrigerators often posed the risk of tampering or spoiling of vials due to improper storage.

She discovered that many people shared similar struggles, especially those managing conditions like arthritis, diabetes, and undergoing growth hormone therapy. Motivated by these insights, Panda designed 'Novocarry'.

"My goal is to empower users to carry their medications confidently, knowing those will stay effective regardless of their surroundings," she

The device uses bullet-shaped heatsinks to cool two vials of medicine, such as insulin, maintaining a consistent temperature of around 5 degrees Celsius. It's designed to be compact and portable, about the size of a power bank, with space for diabetic supplies. The dual-battery system ensures reliability, and the design eliminates the need for a fan to cool the vials, making it more efficient.

Panda recalls that she came to know about the James Dyson Award - one of the most prestigious awards in industrial design -- during her second year at NID. By the end of her third year, she decided to apply for the award and ultimately emerged

Reflecting on her achievement, Panda expressed her joy and said, "I was thrilled that my product caught the attention of my inspiration, James Dyson. This recognition has validated the viability and necessity of my design. Having struggled with self-confidence, this award has provided me with a significant boost."

While being open to whatever the future holds for her, Panda intends to continue improving Novocarry and explore other projects. When asked if she plans to focus on healthcare design, she shared, "I've had unpleasant experiences in healthcare in general and especially after recently losing my mother. Healthcare often focuses on the disease rather than the quality of life of the patient. Through design, I believe I can bring a new perspective and improve the patients' experience.'

Destructive Legacy

n the year since Hamas' 7 October, 2023, terrorist attack, Israeli forces have killed an estimated 41,200 Palestinians, including 16,700 lacksquare children, according to the Gaza Health Ministry. But a recent letter in The Lancet puts the true death toll in Gaza much higher, at more than 186,000, when counting those killed as an indirect result of the conflict.

Severe food shortages are certainly a contributing factor. Israel's blockade and devastating bombing campaign have prevented the entry and delivery of humanitarian aid. As a result, the United Nations World Food Program found that 96 per cent of Gaza's population is facing acute food insecurity, with more than two million people at crisis levels of hunger or worse. This is forced starvation, a well-known tactic of genocide - and one with which Americans are all too familiar.

Many Americans first learn about such cruelty in elementary school. Textbooks explain how, in the early nineteenth century, the US military began systematically displacing indigenous people to steal their land. That effort involved tactics intended to cause starvation – from slaughtering millions of buffalo to forcing these communities onto tiny plots of land - to weaken their resolve. Even so-called safe zones were attacked, such as when the US military massacred about 300 Lakota people at Wounded Knee in 1890.

Israeli forces are taking a similar ap proach in Gaza. They bombed - using USmade weapons – a humanitarian safe zone, killing at least 40 people living in tents. The military has also targeted health-care and aid workers, killing more than 1,000 of them, including seven World Central Kitchen team members who were attacked while delivering food.

To understand the consequences of these policies of expansion and domination, one need look no further than the United States Genocide is a historic trauma – perhaps best understood as a "soul wound" - among indigenous people that still reverberates. The establishment of the reservation system, the scant provision of food, and other acts of ethnic cleansing in the nineteenth century eroded indigenous sovereignty.

That legacy can be seen in today's subpar housing, inadequate health care, and underfunded education programmes for America's impoverished indigenous communities. Likewise, the Native American boarding school system, spurred by federal assimilation policies, harmed tens of thousands of children, leaving them more vulnerable to depression, suicide, and addic-

tion, which can be passed down from generation to generation.

Moreover, rates of food insecurity among indigenous communities in the US have hovered around 25 per cent for many years, but reached as high as 77 per cent for the Navajo (who call themselves the Diné), and more than 90 per cent for the nations of the Klamath River Basin in southern Oregon. By contrast, 13.5 per cent of US households were food insecure in 2023, according to a report by the US Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service, and that rate is even lower among white Americans, at 10 per cent.

While researching food insecurity among women and children in the US over the past quarter-century, I have interviewed many Black women and women of color about their struggles to feed their families. Time and again, they provided insight into not only the previous year, but also their childhood experiences of violence and deprivation. Often, their parents and their grandparents faced poverty; some even reported five generations' worth of hardship. These trajectories are shaped by America's history of slavery and genocide, which triggered cycles of racism and discrimination that continue today. The original harms are woven into American family life through lower wages for people of color and racially discriminatory health-care, welfare, and foster-care policies.

The US government can and should make some immediate fixes, such as reinstating the temporary expansion of the Child Tax Credit and offering universal school meals (both of which provided vital support for American families during the COVID-19 pandemic), as well as improving access to health care. But while these steps can lower overall levels of food insecurity, they cannot address the inequities that lead

women and children of color to experience higher rates of hunger. The mothers I interviewed want policymakers to address the root cause of hunger in the US: the exposure to racialized and gendered violence in the family and community, which can be traced back to America's legacy of slavery and genocide. The US government has not atoned for its past sins, and until it returns land and pays reparations, these original traumas will remain unhealed, and unequal food security will persist.

To witness the starvation and suffering in Gaza today is to be reminded of the enduring consequences of America's divisive history. The unbearable trauma should force US policymakers to ask how to end this cruelty and begin making amends. As in Gaza, an immediate "ceasefire" would be a good start. But then the more difficult and more urgent task is for the US government to divert the money being spent on bombs to social programs that will provide food, education, and health

SHOCKWAVES FROM MUMBAI

THE STORY HAS EMERGED WITH SUCH SPEED AFTER THE KILLING THAT MANY QUESTIONS REMAIN, NOT THE LEAST SIGNIFICANT OF WHICH IS THAT **BISHNOI IS IN CUSTODY IN GUJARAT**

here was a time when Mumbai saw shootings in broad daylight, when gangsters roamed free and took down opponents at will on the city's streets. Some of that atmosphere appears to have returned with the killing on Dussehra night (October 12) in the tony suburb of Bandra of the controversial former Maharashtra minister Baba Siddique, who was known for his close connections with Bollywood stars. Siddique, 66, was shot dead by people who came in a car, kept their faces covered with handkerchiefs, fired from close range at their target and escaped. Police have called it the handiwork of contract killers. The ganglandstyle killing signals the power, reach and contempt for law and order of a politician-builder-underworld nexus operating with impunity in Urbs Primus in

Indus, as Mumbai is known. Siddique was noted for his glamourous iftaar parties attended by Bollywood stars, and for his closeness particularly to film stars like Salman Khan and Sanjay Dutt, among others. He was more than just a former MLA, a former minister or a representative of the Bandra West suburb, the area that is home to some of the biggest of film stars. A picture dating back to 2013 shows Siddique, then of the Congress, standing in between Salman Khan and Shahrukh Khan, beaming with one arm

around each of the celebrities. A long-standing member of the Congress and a close associate of the former and respected star Sunil Dutt, Siddique left the party earlier this year in the wake of ED investigations against him and joined the Nationalist Congress Party of Aiit Pawar faction -- that is currently in power in Maharashtra along with BJP. The ED case never progressed after that. So, the man shot dead was a ruling party worker, with the killing coming in the midst of all the groundwork

that is now being done by political parties for the upcoming Maharashtra elections. What is worse, Siddique received a death threat a fortnight ago, and was provided state security described as 'Y' category. The hit men did their job despite all that.

The official story is that the killing is the handiwork of a gang led by Lawrence Bishnoi. The reason: Siddique's reported closeness to Salman Khan, who allegedly hunted a blackbuck way back in 1998, which the Bishnoi community regard as holy. Shots were fired at Salman Khan's home in April. One of the accused arrested in that shooting case, Anuj Thapan, later was said to have killed himself in police custody, adding a new twist to that case. Now, all of Salman Khan's friends and associates are supposedly the targets of the Bishnoi gang. But the story has emerged with such speed after the killing that many questions remain, not the least significant of which is that Bishnoi is in custody in Gujarat. Further, the police made two quick arrests in the Siddique case the same night and have by now arrested one more accused. The third person arrested is the brother of the person who claimed the killing as a part of the Bishnoi gang. Could the case be as simple as that?

Siddique was also known for land and real estate connections, highlighting the role of builders in an emerging side of Mumbai that has changed the landscape, and in many ways contributed to making the city an ugly concrete eyesore with high rises some in faux gleam, even faux gold and many left incomplete as prices fluctuate and the market for housing waxes and wanes. Most people who have invested in real estate have seen their investments not yield the eye-popping returns that housing proj ects were said to offer at one time. Yet, the attraction of land and its potential to yield returns is as alluring as ever in a city that remains the riches city of India. Besides, changing market conditions have also put pressure on builders and projects, many of which may have commitments to meet but could have turned less than viable in the evolving mar-

ket for housing in Mumbai. In some cases, politicians themselves are closely associated with land deals and builders, as Siddiquie allegedly was, or politicians are builders themselves, like the BJP's guardian minister for suburban Mumbai, Mangal Prabhat Lodha. Lodha and his real estate business group is probably single-handedly noted for its clout and for reshaping Mumbai, driving up

prices, making it fit for the rich, and distinctly against the average or poor resident.

Siddiqui was elected MLA from Bandra West, once known as the queen of suburbs, its charm is now dwindling with the onslaught of builders, given that this is seen as a prime area. Formerly simple people represented the constituency, an example of which is Sadanand Varde, a former education minister in the 1970s. Varde was a socialist and an economics lecturer in Bandra's National College. Another representative. Salim Zakaria, a school teacher in the suburb, also became the state education minister. Another man from a humble background from Bandra was Ramdas Nayak a leader of Mumbai BJP from the days before the Modi-Shah leadership. He was shot dead in August 1994 by members of the Dawood Ibrahim gang at the age of 52, with a volley of bullets from an AK 47 killing him and his bodyguard. Hill road in Bandra, the main artery in the suburb, is now named in his memory. Nayak was the president of the Mumbai unit of the BJP and was a campaigner against corruption, having played a major role in exposing the cement scandal allegations against the former (Congress) Chief Minister AR Antulay. Nayak also stood up to some builders.

The picture now is very different. Quick fix solutions are on offer. Cases are deemed solved with ease. This will never allow the people or indeed the authorities to bring out the full magnitude of what really is going wrong, or who is pulling the strings and what really is the motivation behind the Wild West gangland killing that has returned to Mumbai

127 countries in the 2024 Global Hunger Index (GHI) emphasises the severity of its the "serious" category, India joins nations like Pakistan and Afghanistan in confronting persistent food insecurity and malnutrition. The GHI, published annually by Concern Worldwide and Welthungerhilfe, tracks global hunger levels by analysing four critical indicators: undernourishment, child stunting, child wasting, and child mortality. With a GHI score of 27.3, India's performance signals deepseated nutritional issues that require urgent redress.

The GHI score for each country is calculated on a scale from 0 (no hunger) to 100 (severe hunger). India's score places it firmly in the "serious" category. reflecting substantial challenges across critical indicators. Notably, 13.7% of India's population is underweight, 35.5% of children under five are stunted, 18.7% suffer from wasting, and 2.9% die before their fifth birthday. These alarming figures are a grim reflection of widespread undernutrition, exacerbated by inadequate healthcare, poor sanitation, and regional dispar-

ities in economic development. India's hunger crisis is par-

ndia's 105th position out of ticularly concerning compared to its South Asian neighbours. Bangladesh, Nepal, and Sri Lanka, which fall under the "moderate" category, have significantly addressed food insecurity and child malnutrition. Nepal and Bangladesh have implemented targeted nutrition programmes and agricultural reforms, while Sri Lanka's robust public healthcare system has helped maintain better health outcomes despite its economic challenges. Despite being an economic powerhouse, India's lagging performance suggests that its policy interventions must be scaled up and fine-tuned.

Child malnutrition remains one of the most pressing issues in India's fight against hunger. The stunting rate, which affects over one-third of children under five, reveals chronic malnutrition and poor health conditions. Wasting, indicative of acute undernutrition, affects nearly 19% of children. The high child mortality rate, at 2.9%, signifies the deadly combination of undernutrition, infectious diseases, and poor access to healthcare. These statistics reflect the immediate health impacts and foreshadow long-term socio-economic consequences, including cognitive impairment, lower productivity, and perpetuation of poverty.

India has introduced various schemes to combat malnutrition, such as the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS), the Mid-Day Meal Scheme, and the National Food Security Act (NFSA). These programmes have provided crucial support, especially to low-income households. However, the persistence of high hunger levels reveals significant gaps in implementation and outreach, Corruption, inefficiency, and bureaucratic delays have undermined the effectiveness of these programmes, particularly in reaching rural, tribal, and marginalised populations.

Regional disparities also play a role, with states like UP, Bihar, and MP showing exceptionally high malnutrition rates. These areas, where hunger and poverty are intertwined, need more targeted interventions and better co-

ordination among local authorities. Resolving India's hunger crisis requires a multifaceted approach beyond short-term interventions. First, improving the efficiency and reach of existing food distribution programmes is critical. This involves strengthening monitoring mechanisms to ensure resources are delivered to the intended beneficiaries. Second, public health and nutrition services must be expanded, particularly in regions with high

rates of malnutrition.

Innovations in agriculture, including sustainable farming practices and improved access to maressential for enhancing food availability. Resolving the significant issue of food wastage can also help alleviate hunger in food-insecure households. A decentralised approach tailored to local conditions will more effectively address regional disparities.

The 2024 GHI report underscores that India will likely meet the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goal of Zero Hunger by 2030 with substantial changes. Economic instability, conflict, climate change, and population growth exacerbate global hunger. For India to make meaningful progress, it must prioritise poverty reduction, employment generation, and access to essential services like education and healthcare. At the global level, India must continue collaborating with international organisations like the World Food Programme and the Food and Agriculture Organisation to coordinate efforts and build capacity to combat hunger.

Institutional evolution

Sir, This year's Nobel Prize in Economics was awarded to three scholars who have dedicated their careers to answering a simple yet profound question: What makes countries rich? Interestingly, these laureates come from diverse academic backgrounds. Daron Acemoglu is a well-respected economist, while Simon Johnson is a professor of entrepreneurship with a history as chief economist at the International Monetary Fund. James A. Robinson is rooted in political science and public policy. The breadth of their expertise reflects the complexity of the question they tackled — the reasons behind the success and failure of nations. Professors Acemoglu, Johnson, and Robinson, often referred to as AJR, began their research by questioning why some countries that were wealthy during the medieval period are poor today, while others have reversed this trend and become prosperous. Their research aimed to uncover whether a particular mechanism could explain this "great reversal." The answer they arrived at was simple yet profound: institutions. While the term "institutions" is widely used today, often vaguely, AJR defined it more specifically as the enforceable constraints on the exercise of power. AJR's research highlighted the importance of institutional evolution to balance power between different groups, limit the overuse of authority, and ensure the protection of growth-enhancing mechanisms like property rights. They argued that institutions that allowed for the safeguarding of these rights created the environment necessary for investment, entrepreneurship, and long-term economic growth. Stubble burning: SC raps Punjab, Haryana govts

Stubble burning is a major contributor to the rising pollution levels in the national capital

New Delhi, Oct 16: The Supreme Court Wednesday pulled up the Punjab and Haryana governments over the non-prosecution of violators found guilty of stubble burning while summoning the state chief secretaries to appear before it on October 23 for

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka, Ahsanuddin Amanullah and Augustine George Maish pointed out "complete insensitivity" on the part of both states, directing the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) to take penal action against both the government of ficials for the failure to take action against the violators.

The top court was upset over Punjab and Haryana governments not taking taken any steps to implement the directions issued by the CAQM in the national capital region (NCR) in June 2021 to stop stubble burning.

"This is not a political matter. If the chief secretary is acting at somebody's behest, we will issue summons against them as well. Next Wednesday (October 23) we are going to physically call for the chief secretary and explain everything. Nothing has been done, same is with the Punjab government. The attitude is of complete defiance, the bench remarked.

Slamming the Punjab government, the top court said not even a single prosecution has been carried out in past three years and it was only tolerating

"Why are you shy of prosecuting people. This is not a political matter. This is a matter of implementation of statutory directions of the commission. No political considerations will apply. There is defiance on your part. You are encouraging people to commit breaches. You are only imposing nominal fines. ISRO (Indian Space Research Organisation) is telling you the location of the stubble burning and you say fire location is not found," the bench said.

Punjab Advocate General Gurminder Singh submitted it was difficult to implement the directions on the ground and the authorities made "red entries" in the revenue records of the farmers who caused fires at farms.

The apex court also took exception to a purported incorrect statement of the Punjab government of having submitted a proposal to the Central government for the grant of funds to provide a tractor along with driver and fuel to small

It said no endeavour has been made by the Punjab government to seek funds from the Centre for ensuring tractors to farmers.

On the CAQM, the Supreme Court called it a toothless tiger that only passed directions without any implementation. The

bench noted the Union government was at fault for not choosing renowned experts in the field of pollution as members of

"We have great respect for the members and their academic qualifications but they are not qualified or experts in the field of air pollution," the bench said.

The judges subsequently suggested that the CAQM should engage with some expert agency to address the issue of air pol-

Slamming the Commission for Air Quality Management for failing to control instances of stubble burning in NCR and adjoining areas, the SC had said it had taken no efforts to implement its direction to prevent such incidents.

The apex court had earlier rapped CAQM over its failure to curb air pollution in Delhi due to crop residue burning in the neighbouring states and said it needs to be proactive in its approach. The CAQM needs to exercise its power under the Commission for Air Quality Management in National Capital Region and Adjoining Areas Act, 2021. it added.

On August 27, it termed the pollution control boards of Delhi and NCR states "ineffective" due to staff shortage and asked the body responsible for air quality management in the national capital and adjoining areas to explain how it proposed to tackle pollution and stubble burning which spiked with the onset of winter.

The Supreme Court also sought a response from the Punjab government on a plea seeking directions for the mandatory attachment of a specialised machine to the harvester to curtail paddy straw burning.

The petitioner said that Punjab Agricultural University, Ludhiana, had recently invented the "surface seeding-cummulching" machine, which is attached with the combined harvester while harvesting paddy.

Kuki-Zo tribals firm on Pondicherry-type UT

Imphal, Oct 16: The Kuki-Zo tribal community in Manipur remained firm for a separate administration like the Union Territory with a Legislative Assembly exclusively for the tribals similar to the Union Territory of Pondicherry.

Tribal leaders said Wednesday that two Ministers and two MLAs belonging to the Kuki-Zo tribal community during a meeting with the officials of the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) told the Center that a separate administration like that of Union Territory with a legislative assembly for the Kuki-Zo community is a prerequisite for any peace dialogue.

"We want a Pondicherry model of Union Territory in Manipur for the Kuki-Zo tribal community We have been demanding for a separate administration for the tribals since the ethnic crisis began in May last year," a Kuki MLA, who attended Tuesday's Delhi meeting, told IANS.

A senior official of the Manipur government while talking on condition of anonymity told IANS that the MHA officials in the meeting were "aversed on the separate administration demand of the

Kuki-Zo Ministers and MLAs". Union and the state governments have on a number of occasions earlier also rejected the demand for separate administrations or a Union Territory.

The non-tribal Meiteis account for around 53 per cent of Manipur's around 3.2 million population and live mostly in the valley regions comprising 67 districts while the tribal Nagas and Kukis constitute another 40 per cent of the population and reside in the hill districts, which cover around 90 per cent of the geographical areas of Manipur.

The Valley region has a total of 40 non-tribal Meitei MLAs, while the hills have 19 MLAs divided between the Naga and the Kuki-Zo tribes and one seat reserved for the Scheduled

Jiribam district, a largely plain area adjoining southern Assam beyond the hills, is inhabited by both tribals and non-tribals. After the crucial Tuesday meeting, an official statement said that a group of elected members of the Manipur Assembly, representing Kuki-Zo-Hmar, Meitei and Naga communities, met in New Delhi Tuesday to discuss the current scenario in the state.

"The meeting unanimously resolved to appeal to the people of the state belonging to all communities to shun the path of violence so that no more precious lives of innocent citizens are lost," the statement said.

The ethnic violence between the non-tribals Meiteis and tribal Kuki-Zo broke out in the northeastern state May 3 last year after a 'Tribal Solidarity March' was organised in the hill districts to protest against the Meitei community's demand for Scheduled Tribe (ST) status.

So far, over 230 people have been killed in the strife. As many as 11,133 houses have been set on fire, out of which 4,569 homes have been completely destroyed. A total of 11,892 cases have been registered in different police stations in connection with the ethnic violence.

"Many clients have reached out, worried about how this might affect their plans to migrate to Canada," said an immigration lawyer, Karan S Thukral, who is based in the Indian capital, though adding he had seen no big drop yet in legal inquiries. Arunachal home to 36 snow leopards **'GHOST OF THE MOUNTAINS'**

Itanagar, Oct 16: Arunachal Pradesh is home to 36 snow leopards, according to a survey.

The survey by the Department of Environment, Forests and Climate Change (DoEFCC), in collaboration with the WWF-India was released by Arunachal Pradesh Forest minister Wangki Lowang Tuesday.

The report provides the firstever scientifically robust estimates of the snow leopard population and density in Arunachal Pradesh. The report provides a baseline of the state of snow leopards in Arunachal Pradesh to establish a long-term monitoring plan for the species.

The snow leopard (Panthera uncia) is the apex predator of the trans-Himalayas. It also has a high significance in the local folklore, culture and traditions of the Himalayan communities that share space with this species.

In 2008, the government of

India launched a flagship proj-

ect called the project snow leop-

ard to conserve and safeguard the

unique natural heritage of highaltitude wildlife populations and their habitats by promoting conservation through participatory policies and actions. This is a significant recognition that the unique cultures, traditions and livelihoods of the mountain communities are closely linked with these landscapes, and they have a stewardship role to play in conserving them.

Cat species hold a special significance across most tribes of Arunachal Pradesh as totemic symbols of spiritual significance, and often most of these tribes have the highest sanctions (in-kind) if they violate the taboo on hunting carnivores. The high-altitude areas of Arunachal Pradesh have largely remained unexplored from a wildlife research and conservation perspective.

Solitary, almost silent and majestically beautiful, the snow leopard is one of the most enigmatic big cats. It is also one of the most elusive and endangered. Highly adapted to life on the cold, rocky slopes of high Asia, the snow leopard is a master of stealth and camouflage.

Very rarely seen by humans, it has come to be known as the 'ghost of the mountains'. It has also become an icon for these breathtaking and critically important landscapes, which house a diverse array of unique highaltitude species and provide critical ecosystem services for hun-

dreds of millions of people. In India, the snow leopard is found in the Union territories of Ladakh and Jammu and Kashmir, the states of Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh in the Western Himalayas and Arunachal Pradesh and Sikkim in the

Eastern Himalayas. Even though Arunachal Pradesh has more than 15,000 square kilometre of potential snow leopard habitat, no rigorous assessment of the status of the snow leopards exists so far.

446 BUTTERFLY SPECIES IN KAZIRANGA

GUWAHATI: More than 446 butterfly species have been recorded in Assam's Kaziranga National Park (KNP), famed for the one-horned rhinoceros, making it a habitat with the second highest concentration in the country after the Namdapha National Park in Arunachal Pradesh, a park official said. The long-term observation and records are a culmination of years of work put in by a scientist from Kaziranga, Dr Monsoon Jyoti Gogoi. The survey was conducted in different parts of the Kaziranga-Karbi Anglong landscape, especially in the Panbari Reserve Forest, which is home to a diverse range of butterfly species. A new pictorial guidebook on butterflies, authored by Gogoi, documents 446 species of butterflies recorded in Kaziranga, 18 of which are new in the country.

Cabinet approves MSP hike for Rabi **crops in 2025-26**



New Delhi, Oct 16: The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA), chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Wednesday approved the increase in the minimum support prices (MSP) for all mandated Rabi crops for marketing season 2025-26.

The absolute highest increase in MSP has been announced for rapeseed and mustard at ₹300 per quintal, followed by lentil (masur) at ₹275 per quintal.

For gram, wheat, safflower, and barley, there is an increase of ₹210 per quintal, ₹150 per quintal, ₹140 per quintal and ₹130 per quintal, respectively, according to the CCEA

The increase in MSP is in line with the Union Budget 2018-19 announcement of fixing the MSP at a level of at least 1.5 times of the All-India weighted average Cost of Production.

According to the government, the expected margin over the All-India weighted average cost of production is 105 per cent for wheat, followed by 98 per cent for rapeseed and mustard; 89 per cent for lentil; 60 per cent for gram; 60 per cent for barley; and 50 per cent for safflower.

The increased MSP of Rabi crops will ensure remunerative prices to the farmers and incentivise crop diversification, said the government.



After a security breach that took place last year, the Parliament security was handed over to the CISF from the CRPF, a senior officer told PTI.

As part of the taking over the new task, a team of Andhra Pradesh Police was in Delhi recently for the change of its Chief Minister's security from the NSG to the CRPF, the sources said. Two among these nine VIPs will also have the advanced security liaison (ASL) protocol being undertaken by the CRPF--Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and UP Chief Minister Adityanath, as per the sources.

The Union government has decided to "restructure" the NSG and use its manpower to raise and station 'strike teams' of commandos in some high-risk areas like near the Ram temple in Ayodhya and around some critical assets located in the southern part of the country.

Withdrawal of the NSG from VIP security, once done by November, will happen after over two decades since the 'black cat' commandos were drafted in this duty, a task not originally charted for it when the force was conceptualised and raisedin 1984. Never called for closure of madrassas: NCPCR

In a recent report, the apex child rights body, the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) raised serious concerns about the state of functioning in madrassas and called for stopping the state funding unless they comply with the Right to **Education Act**

New Delhi, Oct 16: NCPCR chairperson Priyank Kanoongo said he never called for the closure of madrassas but recommended state funding to these institutions be stopped as they are depriving poor Muslim children of education.

He said that Muslim children from improverished backgrounds are often pressured into religious schooling over secular education. We advocate for equitable educational opportunities for all children.

In a recent report, the apex child rights body, the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) raised serious concerns about the state of functioning in madrassas and called for stopping the state funding unless they comply with the Right to Education Act.

The report received sharp reaction from political leaders, including SP chief Akhilesh Yadav who blamed the ruling BJP for selectively targeting minority institutions. Kerala's Indian Union Muslim League (IUML) said it was the latest display of the communal agenda by the Union government and its agencies

However, Kanoongo clarified that he never called for the closure of the madrassas. "We



never advocated for the closure of madrasas. Our stance is that while affluent families invest in religious and regular education. even children from impoverished backgrounds should be imparted that," he stated, emphasising the need for equitable educational opportunities for all children regardless of socioeconomic status. Responding to the functioning of the madrassas, Kanoongo criticised certain groups within the country for "fearing" the empowerment of the poor Muslim community.

"There exists a faction in our nation that dreads the empowerment of Muslims. Their fear stems from the anticipation that empowered communities will demand accountability and equal rights," he told PTI in an interview.

This, he suggested, is a primary reason behind the resistance to inclusive educational reforms.

Highlighting the government's responsibility, Kanoongo asserted. "It is the duty of the government to ensure that children receive normal education. The state cannot turn a blind eye to its obligations." He pointed out that impoverished Muslim children are often pressured into religious schooling over secular education. undermining their prospects.

"Why do we constrain our poorest Muslim children to attend madrassas instead of schools? This policy shifts the burden unfairly onto them,' Kanoongo remarked

Reflecting on the historical policies. Kanoongo recalled the post-1950 constitutional mandate for universal education. "After the Constitution was implemented in 1950, Maulana Azad (India's first Education minister) visited madrassas in Uttar Pradesh and declared that Muslim children did not need to pursue higher education in schools and colleges. This led to a significant underrepresentation of Muslim students in higher education, currently hovering around five per cent," he noted. In contrast, he high lighted the participation rates of other marginalised communities, suggesting that systemic biases have hindered Muslim students' academic achievements.

"Look at this situation: around 13 to 14 per cent of students in higher education are from Scheduled Castes (SC), and over 5 per cent are from Scheduled Tribes (ST). Combined, SC and ST students make up 20 per cent of the higher education population, while Other Backward Classes (OBC) account for 37 per cent while Muslims in higher education just remain 5 per cent,"

Kolkata, Oct 16: Alleging that the West Bengal government headed by Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has failed to carry out its basic duties to protect the lives and properties of citizens, Governor C V Ananda Bose Wednesday said that his office is already intervening in the RG Kar impasse under provisions in the Constitution.

Expressing disgust over the ongoing impasse following the rape-murder incident, Bose said that the arrest of a police officer and a senior doctor in the case again pointed to "institutional criminality", rampant in various sectors.

"It is the duty of the state government, particularly of Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, to protect the lives and properties of the citizens. "Here (in West Bengal), the government has failed to carry out its basic duties. Who should own up? If the Chief Minister is the chief (head of the administration), the answer lies in itself." Bose told PTI in an exclusive interview on the ongoing stalemate in the state.

On whether his office would intervene in the matter. Bose said, "Rai Bhavan is intervening and cannot be stopped from doing it because the Raj Bhavan



intervenes under the provisions mandated in the Constitution of India.

Incidentally, a group of agitating doctors had met Bose at Raj Bhavan earlier this week and submitted a deputation highlighting their demands for quick investigation into the rape and murder of an on-duty woman doctor at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital besides overhaul of the security infrastructure at the hospitals and removal of Health Secretary N S Nigam.

Bose, in an apparent reference to the Chief Minister's 'Dandiva dance' at Tuesday's Durga Puja Carnival on Red Road, drew parallels to Roman emperor Nero, who "played the fiddle while Rome burned".

"Festivities of Durga Puja should not be embellished with the dance of death. Nero, they say, played the fiddle while Rome was burning. Is history repeating itself in West Bengal? Who is trying to imitate? It is said. 'I am the Roman Emperor, therefore above grammar'. Is there anyone who says, 'I am the ruler, therefore above the law'?" Bose questioned.

On whether the state government was trying to hide something by not addressing the impasse and the demands of the doctors, Bose declined to comment anything citing the ongoing CBI probe into the rapemurder incident. He, however, criticised the role of the state government, stating it could have been more transparent in its approach while dealing with the situation. "I cannot pass judgments on the state government at this stage of investigation," he said.

SC reserves verdict on plea against NCLAT order on Jet Airways

New Delhi, Oct 16: The Supreme Court Wednesday reserved its judgement on a plea of State Bank of India (SBI) and other creditors challenging the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) de cision that upheld the resolution plan of grounded air carrier Jet Airways and approved the transfer of its ownership to Jalan Kalrock Consortium (JKC).

A bench comprising Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud and Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra heard submissions of Additional Solicitor General (ASG) N Venkatraman, appearing for the appellant banks and others, and senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, representing the consortium, before reserving the judgement.

The NCLAT had March 12 upheld the resolution plan of the grounded air carrier and approved the transfer of its ownership to the JKC. The appellate tribunal further directed the Jet Airways monitoring committee to complete the transfer of ownership within 90 days.



Besides, the NCLAT had also directed the lenders of Jet Airways to adjust the ₹150 crore paid by the consortium as performance bank guarantee (PBG). The top court was hearing an appeal of the SBI, Punjab National Bank (PNB) and JC Flowers Asset Reconstruction Private Limited challenging the March 12 verdict of the NCLAT.

Senior advocate Gopal Sankaranarayanan, also appearing for the consortium represented by law firm Karanjawala and Company, submitted that the creditors, including the SBI, were unjustifiably seeking to liquidate Jet Airways.

JMM accuses EC of favouring BJP

Ranchi, Oct 16: The Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) Wednesday accused the Election Commission of India of working in favour of the Bharatiya Janata Party and alleged that the two were like the protagonist couple in the 2005 Hindi film industry blockbuster 'Bunty Aur Babli'.

The ruling party of Jharkhand also charged the BJP and the ECI with trying to harm constitutional bodies and alleged that the central government is misusing central agencies like ED, CBI and the Income Tax Department. The party's accusations came a day after the ECI announced that elections to the 81-member Assembly in the state will be held in two phases - November 13 and 20.

Responding to the charges, the BJP claimed that the abusive words used against the ECI and central agencies clearly show the desperation and disappointment of the JMM. "Elections will be held in two phases but under a game plan. The election schedule proves this. Its script was written in Assam Bhavan and the seal was put in the Delhi BJP headquarters. The Election Commission only released it," JMM central spokesperson Supriyo Bhattacharya alleged in a press conference here.

By 'Assam Bhavan', he apparently hinted at Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma who is the BJP's election co-incharge for Jharkhand. Bhattacharya questioned how the Assam Chief Minister was aware of the election dates announcement. "In some constituencies in a single district. polling will be conducted on separate dates. The way the matter was decided, it appears the ECI is trying to favour the BJP. The BJP and the Election Commission are like Bunty and Babli of a-Bollywood movie, who sold Tai Mahal," the JMM leader alleged.

SC pulls up DAA over felling of trees in Delhi's Ridge area

New Delhi, Oct 16: The Supreme Court Wednesday directed the Lieutenant Governor (LG) V K Saxena, who also holds the office of the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) chairperson, to file his personal affidavit by October 22 on issues concerning alleged felling of trees in the Delhi Ridge area.

A bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra was hearing a contempt case against the DDA and others over the alleged felling of trees in the area. After going through the materials on record, the top court noted an ambiguity on certain aspects.

It wanted clarity on whether there was any discussion or intimation to the DDA chairperson on the top court's permission for felling trees during his site

visit February 3. "In the event of the answer to the one above being positive, what steps, if any, were taken to ensure that the permission of this court was taken," it said. The apex court further said if the answer was in the negative, when did DDA chairperson learn of the permission required.

It noted the actual felling of trees had allegedly commenced February 16 even before a plea was moved before the top court and eventually dismissed.

Bomb blast in Pak injures 5 policemen

Peshawar: At least five policemen were injured Wednesday when a remotecontrolled bomb targeting their vehicle went off in the restive Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, police said. Militants targeted the mobile police van in the Kankoi Mandnar area of the mountainous district of Buner. The attack injured five policemen, including a subinspector, who sustained serious injuries. A heavy police contingent arrived at the scene and cordoned off the area while a search operation was underway. The incident comes two days after terrorists belonging to the outlawed Tehreek-e-Taliban (TTP) attacked police lines in the Bannu district of the province, resulting in fierce clashes. Four policemen were killed in the clashes.

Italy delivers first migrants to Albania

Shengjin: A ship carrying the first group of migrants to be processed in Albania under a deal with Italy arrived in the port of Shengjin Wednesday morning, setting in motion Rome's controversial plan to process thousands of asylum seekers abroad. Italy has built two reception centres in Albania, in the first scheme by a European Union nation to divert migrants to a non-EU country. The plan aims to deter irregular arrivals to Italy, but has been criticised by rights groups who say it restricts migrants' right to asylum. The group of migrants taken to Albania comprised 10 Bangladeshis and six Egyptians who were picked up at sea Sunday aboard boats that had set sail from Libya.

Seoul, Oct 16: North Korean state media said Wednesday around 1.4 million young people had applied to join or return to the army this week, blaming Seoul for a provocative drone incursion that had brought the "tense situation to the brink of war".

The fiery rhetoric comes after North Korea last week accused Seoul of sending drones over Pyongyang that scattered a 'huge number" of anti-North leaflets. The North then blew up inter-Korean roads and rail lines on its side of the border Tuesday, and warned that the South would "pay a dear price"

The young people, including students and vouth league officials who had signed petitions to




join the army, were determined to fight in a "sacred war of destroying the enemy with the arms of the revolution," the official KCNA news agency said.

"If a war breaks out, the ROK will be wiped off the map. As it wants a war, we are willing to put an end to its existence," the KCNA report said, using the initials of the South's official name. the Republic of Korea.

North Korea has previously made similar claims about young people scrambling to enlist at a time of heightened tensions, though such statements from the isolated state are difficult to verify.

Last year, state media repo on 800,000 of its citizens volunteering to join the North's military to fight against the United States. It also said in 2017 that nearly 3.5 million workers, party members and soldiers volunteered to serve.

According to data from the International Institute for Strategic Studies (IISS), North Korea has 1.28 million active soldiers and about 600,000 reservists, with 5.7 million Worker/Peasant Red Guard reservists among many unarmed units.

First brown dwarf found 30 yrs ago is twins circling each other

New York, Oct 16: A celestial object discovered decades ago is actually twins orbiting each other, a new study confirms.


Scientists have puzzled over the object known as Gliese 229B, the first known brown dwarf discovered 30 years ago. Brown dwarfs are sometimes called failed stars because they're lighter than stars, but heavier than gas giant planets.

This object appeared too dim for its mass. Astronomers collected light and chemical clues using the Very Large Telescope in Chile and observed it's a duo circling close to each other.

"It resolves a glaring discrepancy," said Kevin Luhman, an astronomer at Pennsylvania State University who was not involved with the research.

The twins orbit a small star about 18 light-years away. A light-year is 5.8 trillion miles.

Astronomers have spotted brown dwarf pairs before, but these two whip around at much closer range. They orbit each other every 12 days, less than the time it takes for the moon to circle the Earth.



"It shows you how weird the universe is, and how different solar systems are from our own,' said study co-author Rebecca Oppenheimer with the American Museum of Natural History.

The research was published Wednesday in the journal

The twins' discovery means there could be other lurking brown dwarfs with a hidden partner, said co-author Jerry Xuan of the California Institute of Technology.

Zelenskyy sets out 'victory plan'

Kyiv, Oct 16: President Volodymyr Zelenskyy unveiled his much anticipated "victory plan" Wednesday, calling on his allies to take urgent steps to bolster Kyiv at a precarious moment in a bid to end the war

with Russia next year. As Moscow's forces advance in the east and a bleak winter of power cuts looms, he told Parliament his plan contained five main points that were in the hands of his allies, including an unconditional invite to join NATO now and weapons support.

In return, he offered a Western role in developing Ukraine's natural mineral resources and said Ukrainian troops could enhance the security of NATO and replace some of the US forces in Europe.

"Together with our partners, we must change the circumstances so that the war ends. Regardless of what Putin wants. We must all change the circumstances so that Russia is forced to peace," he told lawmakers and top officials.

NATO INVITE

Ukraine needs an unconditional invitation to join the NATO military alliance now, he said.



"We understand that NATO membership is a matter of the future, not the present. But (Russian President Vladimir) Putin can see that his geopolitical calculations are headed for defeat," Zelenskyy said.

BEEF UP UKRAINE'S DEFENCE **CAPABILITIES**

He said Ukraine's ability to defend itself had to be "irreversibly strengthened" and laid out a number of ways to do this.

They included further arming Ukraine and strengthening its defence industry, boosting air defence capabilities, removing restrictions on weapon use and

a continuation of Ukrainian military operations on Russian soil.

DETERRENCE

Zelenskyy said Ukraine's western allies should deter Russia from any further aggression by showing Moscow that this would have consequences.

"Ukraine proposes to place on its soil a comprehensive non-nuclear strategic deterrence package that will be sufficient to protect Ukraine from any military threat from Russia," he said.

He said there was also a secret addendum to this part of the plan, and did not go into further detail on what the proposed deterrence involved.

STRATEGIC ECONOMIC POTENTIAL

Zelenskyy proposed that Ukraine sign an agreement with the US, EU and other unnamed allies that would allow for joint investments and use of Ukraine's natural resources, which Zelenskyy said were worth trillions of dollars.

"These include, in particular, uranium, titanium, lithium, graphite and other strategically valuable resources that will strengthen either Russia and its allies or Ukraine and the democratic world in global compe-

Russia denounces plan

Russia Wednesday denounced a "victory plan" presented by Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, saying he was trying to push NATO into a direct conflict with Moscow. Russian Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova told reporters the plan Zelenskyy unveiled to his Parliament would lead to disaster for the Ukrainian people, "He is pushing NATO into direct conflict with our country," Zakharova said, adding that Zelenskyy could not rely on his Western partners. "I can simply tell Zelenskyy, if he is not aware, the partners of the Kyiv regime have already demonstrated how they see Ukraine in the security architecture: they see Ukraine in a coffin and Ukrainian citizens in the grave as well." Zakharova recalled a warning by President Vladimir Putin last month that the West would be fighting Russia directly if it allowed Ukraine to strike deep inside Russia with Western-supplied long-range missiles.

Trade deficit shrinks

New Delhi, Oct 16: Snapping the two-month slide, the country's merchandise exports rose marginally by 0.5 per cent to \$34.58 billion in September while the trade deficit narrowed to a five-month low at \$20.78 billion.

According to official data released Wednesday, imports increased by 1.6 per cent to \$55.36 billion in September compared to \$54.49 billion in the year-ago period.

The trade deficit, or the gap between imports and exports, was \$20.8 billion during the same month last year. It soared to a 10-month high of \$29.65 billion in 5-MONTH August.


China emerges as top import source in H1

During the period, the top 10 import sources of India were China, Russia, the UAE, the US, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Indonesia, Korea, Switzerland and Singapore, the data showed. Imports from Russia rose to \$32.18 billion during April-September this fiscal from USD 30.43 billion a year ago. Similarly, the inbound shipments from the UAE rose to USD 31.46 billion from USD 20.70 billion in the first half of the last fiscal. During the period, the top 10 export destinations of the country were the US, the UAE, the Netherlands, the UK, China, Singapore, Saudi Arabia, Bangladesh Germany and South Africa. Exports to the UAE rose from \$15.47 billion during April-September 2023 to \$17.24 billion during April-September this fiscal. Similarly, outbound shipments to China increased to \$6.91 billion from \$7.63 billion in the first half of the last fiscal. In 2023-24, the US was India's largest trading partner, followed by China. China was India's top trading partner from 2013-14 till 2017-18 and in 2020-21. Before China, the UAE was the country's largest trading partner. The US was also the largest partner in 2021-22 and 2022-23.

India to become 3rd largest economy by 2028, says IEA

New Delhi, Oct 16: India will over the next decade add more than 12,000 cars a day, expand built space equivalent to the built space in South Africa, and its air-conditioners will consume more electricity than entire power consumption in Mexico, the IEA said.

It is likely to see a rise in demand for all forms of energy -from oil and gas to coal, electricity and renewable energy through 2035, making it the growth engine for energy demand globally, the International Energy Agency (IEA) said in its World Energy Outlook 2024.

India, the world's third largest oil consuming and importing nation, will see its demand for oil rise by almost 2 million barrels per day by 2035 and become the main source of oil demand growth in the world.

According to IEA projections, the country is on track to become the third-largest economy in the world by 2028

It was the world's fifth largest economy and the fastest growing major economy in 2023, with



output increasing by 7.8 per cent. India overtook China in 2023 to become the most populous country in the world, even as its fertility rate dropped below replacement level.

The population size and the scale of rising demand from all sectors mean that India is poised to experience more energy demand growth than any other country over the next decade,' IEA said.

In stated policies scenario (STEPS), "India is on track to add over 12,000 cars every day to its roads over the period to 2035. Built space is set to increase by over 1 billion square metres annually, which is larger than the total built space in South Africa today," IEA said. "By 2035, iron and steel pro-

duction are on track to grow by 70 per cent: cement output is set to rise by nearly 55 per cent; and the stock of air-conditioners is projected to grow by over 4.5 times, resulting in electricity demand from air-conditioners in 2035 that is more than Mexico's total expected electricity consumption that year," it said. IEA projected energy supply in

India rising from 45.4 exajoule (EJ) in 2023 to 60.7 EJ in 2025 and 70.5 EJ in 2050 under stated policies (STEP). This gets tempered to 52 EJ in 2035 and 62 EJ by 2050 under announced pledges (APS). Oil demand is seen growing

from 5.2 million barrels per day to 7.1 million bpd by 2035. Capacity at refineries, to turn crude oil into fuels like petrol and diesel, will rise from 5.8 million bpd to 7.1 million bpd by 2035.

Total energy demand in India is seen increasing by nearly 35 per cent by 2035 in the STEPS, and its electricity generation capacity nearly triples to 1,400 GW by 2035.

Gen Z adds \$860bn to India's consumer expenditure

New Delhi, Oct 16: India's Gen Z population, now at 377 million, is not just the largest generation in the country's history but also a powerful economic force with a collective spending power of \$860 billion, a report has revealed.

Gen Z is the generation of people born between 1996 and

The "The USD 2 Trillion Opportunity: How Gen Z is Shaping the New India" report by technology firm Snap (parent company of Snapchat) and Boston Consulting Group (BCG) revealed that Gen Z currently holds a collective spending power of \$860 billion, accounting for 43 per cent of India's total consumer expenditure.

Collective spending consists of direct spending -- made by

working Gen Zs with their earnings, and influenced spending -- by dependent Gen Zs; these spends are mostly made by families where Gen Zs play an active influencing in product/brand choice.

Direct spending currently stands at \$200 billion, with 1 out of every 4 Gen Zs in the workforce. The figure is projected to reach \$250 billion by 2025 when every second Gen Z will be working, the report said.

"By 2035, these figures (direct spends) are expected to change dramatically, with direct spending projected to reach \$1.8 trillion, implying that every second rupee of consumer spend in 2035 will be driven by Gen Z," it said.

The report is based on the findings of a survey carried out among around 1,000 parents to evaluate their influence, along-

Further, Jain said it is important for marketers to take note that this generation is driven by unique values and beliefs, however, it was observed that only 15 per cent of brands surveyed are actively taking steps to tap into this opportunity.

'For businesses, understanding and authentically engaging with Gen Z isn't just good to have; it's necessary for winning today and will be imperative for survival tomorrow," she said.

The report said that while 45 per cent of businesses acknowledge Gen Z's potential, only 15 per cent have actively leveraged these insights -- a gap that presents brands with a prime opportunity to forge deeper connections with the generation shaping India's consumer future.

It recommended rapidly innovating in line with trends, integrating social interaction throughout the shopping journey, providing visually immersive experiences both online and offline, and engaging with the right influencers in the right way as initiatives brandsshould take to capitalise on the opportunity.

David inducted in ICC Hall of Fame

Dubai: Former India spinner Neetu David, who still holds the record for the best figures (8/53) by a woman in an individual Test innings, became Wednesday only the second female cricketer from the country to be inducted into the 'ICC Hall of Fame'. David, the current chairman of selectors, enters the ICC Hall of Fame a year after the induction of former captain Diana Edulji. David made more than 100 appearances (10 Tests and 97 ODIs) for India as a prolific left-arm spinner. She has taken 141 wickets in ODIs. "It is truly an honour to be inducted into the ICC Hall of Fame, something that I consider to be the highest recognition available to anyone who puts on their national team jersey," David said in an ICC release.

Tuchel appointed England manager

London: The Football Association (FA) hired Thomas Tuchel as England manager Wednesday. He will take on the challenge of ending the national team's decades-long wait for a trophy. The German, who previously managed PSG, Chelsea and Bayern Munich, will begin his tenure in January ahead of the 2026 World Cup in the United States. Tuchel replaces Gareth Southgate, who stepped down after the European Championship in July. Tuchel won major trophies in Germany, France and England and is England's third foreign coach, after the late Sven-Goran Eriksson and Fabio Capello.
